From the Pastor's Desk

Safe Haven Sunday

Next weekend, October 7-8, 2023 is Safe Haven Sunday throughout the Diocese of Lansing. However, I am writing about it this week because next week's bulletin will include our annual report. Safe Haven Sunday is inspired by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops's statement Create in Me a Clean Heart: A Pastoral Response to Pornography. The weekend is set aside within the liturgical calendar by dioceses and parishes to directly address the societal harms of pornography.

Anecdotally, having been a high school chaplain, I can promise you that the scourge of pornography affects our youth. Even if we think it does not, it does! In speaking with a friend of mine who is also a psychologist that works with many families and children, the most important thing she tells me is that our kids have secrets that we have no clue about. Most of these secrets are found on their cell phones. Why are they secrets? Because our kids are ashamed to talk about them, and we, as trusted adults or parents, are uncomfortable having these difficult conversations with them or with others. You will see in the statistics below that 71% of teens hide their online behavior from their parents.

Here are just some of the most up-to-date statistics regarding pornography taken from Covenant Eyes:

- 90% of teens and 96% of young adults are either encouraging, accepting, or neutral when they talk about porn with their friends.
- Just 55% of adults 25 years and up believe porn is wrong.
- Only 43% of teens believe pornography is bad for society, compared to 31% of young adults 18-24, 51% of Millennials, 44% of Gen-Xers, and 59% of Baby Boomers.
- Nearly 27% of teens receive "sext" messages from others.
 (A "sext" message is a sexually explicit text message, oftentimes including photos.)
- Around 15% of teens are sending "sext" messages.
- 57% of teens are searching for pornography at least monthly.
- 51% of male students and 32% of female students first viewed pornography before their teenage years.
- On average, the first exposure to pornography is 12 years old.
- 71% of teens hide their online behavior from their parents.
- 68% of divorce cases involved one party meeting a new partner on the internet.
- 56% of divorce cases involved one party having an "obsessive interest in pornographic websites."
- Prolonged exposure to pornography leads to:
 - Diminished trust between intimate couples
 - Belief that promiscuity is the natural state
 - Lack of attraction to family and natural child raising



All of these statistics seem daunting! How can we overcome the scourge of pornography? Well, let me offer just a few practical tips:

- Let's not bury our heads in the sand. Pornography is everywhere! I promise you, even if you may not see it, it is there. It's not just websites. It is in social media including Tik Tok, Snapchat, and Instagram. There are websites providing widespread distribution of free pornographic material that is easily accessible by everyone including our youth. Our teens are now also using "hookup" apps to meet strangers.
- Let's face the fact that, as a society, we have a problem, and that, as the statistics show, perhaps the problem has infiltrated our homes, our families, or even ourselves. We aren't immune to this.
- Ask the questions, what am I looking for? Why do I do what I do? Be honest in answering those questions. More often than not our behavior manifests because we are seeking some desire that has not been met in our lives.
- Pray! I know it sounds cliche coming from a priest, but it is true. Lean into prayer all the more to give ourselves a chance to hear what God actually says about us. Pray into the answer to the questions above.
- Talk about it! One of the best pieces of advice given to me from a priest is that there is nothing in my life that at least one other person doesn't know about. Talk about these struggles with your confessor, with your pastor, with a spiritual director, with a trusted friend who wants what is best for you, etc.




