




- •Storge familial love

- Eros erotic or sexual love
- Agape the fulfillment of love being self sacrifice

St. Thomas Aquinas defines the theological virtue of love as "willing the good of the other". Our culture has reduced love to sentiment, emotion, or whatever or whoever makes us feel good about ourselves. That is our tendency because of the human condition - to turn love into something about us which makes it more selfish than self giving.

As we pray into the Mass this weekend, let us pray for the grace to really understand what love is and what love of God and neighbor look like. You may even want to pick up a copy of C.S. Lewis' *The Four Loves*.






