HEALTHY PLANET, HEALTHY PEOPLE PETITION

SEASON OF CREATION *Restoring Our Common Home* 01 September – 04 October 2021

Last week we shared some ideas on how we can care for creation and we continue this week with some more suggestions.

- Rent a boat without a motor: a kayak, row boat or canoe and get some exercise and enjoy the beautiful nature that is near us.
- Reduce junk mail by opting out. Go paperless and subscribe online.
- Pick up litter when you see it.
- Donate unwanted blankets, towels, pillows or stuffed toys to an animal shelter.
- Minimize water use when brushing your teeth, cleaning and washing dishes.
- Be mindful of animals and their habitats when exploring the outdoors.
- Ban Styrofoam – it contains a known carcinogen. Use plant-based products.
- Buy wood products, cards and paper FSC certified or responsibly sourced.
- Buy fresh local unpackaged food with real ingredients and no chemicals.
- Take unwanted clothing and other items to a donation center.
- Recycle used electronics and video games.
- If you can't recycle it – don't buy it.
- Dispose of hazardous cleaning agents, oils and paint correctly. Check out if you can donate unused paint to local schools or charity projects.
- Avoid Gas spills, yard chemicals and other street run off that goes into storm drains and ultimately into lakes and rivers.
- Buy from companies with eco-friendly sustainable and ethical practices.
- Buy free-range eggs or local farm eggs, meat and even milk.
- Try a mixture of vinegar and water with lemon for a fresh biodegradable cleaning agent.
- Recycle or dispose of batteries properly – they may have toxic contents.
- Take baths less frequently and shorten your shower time.

The Season of creation continues to October 4th Feast Day of St Francis. It’s Time for us to make a special effort to take better care of our Natural World. Shops and garden centers have large a stocks of Spring flower bulbs. Our pollinating insects are in decline, one third of our 99 bee species are at risk of extinction. By choosing pollen rich flowers you will provide much needed food for our bees and other pollinating insects as well as creating a beautiful garden. The following fall into this category: Snowdrops, Crocus, Grape Hyacinth, Hellebore (single flower), Winter flowering heather (don’t need to be planted in peat) - all rich in pollen and nectar. Winter flowering heathers flower from Winter until May, produced and available locally. If you wish to learn more about our natural world, Zero Waste Community Garden in Rathcoffey is hosting a garden talk on managing your garden for nature on Tuesday 14th September at 7pm (Free - All Welcome). Two further talks, September 21st - Herbs and their Part in our Health), September 28th - Sourcing your Plants for Pollinators).
