## PASTORAL COLUMN



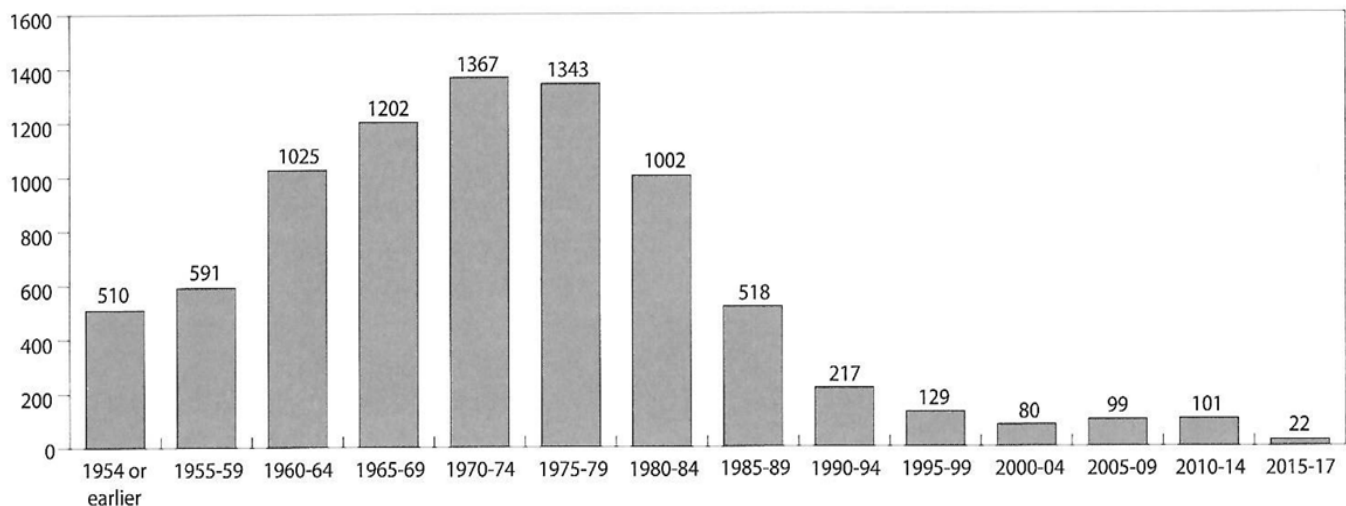
Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In last week's column, I wrote about the sex abuse scandal and the release of names of those "credibly accused" priests, deacons and bishops that will happen at the end of the month. I also wrote about the work that has been undertaken to battle this crisis in the Church that has happened since the Bishops' Meeting in Dallas in 2002 which produced the Document called the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. This Charter initiated a zero-tolerance policy against any form of sexual abuse with a minor since. In this column, I want to present a visual to help better understand what good the Charter has done for the Church. This information comes from CARA (The Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate) which is a national, non-profit, applied social science research center that studies the Catholic Church having 50 years of experience. Here is what is shared in their report:

*New abuse allegations have not disappeared. In the last three years, 22 allegations of abuse occurring during 2015-2017 have been reported, an average of about seven per year nationwide in the Church. That is far too many. Nothing is acceptable other than zero. At the same time, to put those reports in some context, 42 teachers in the state of Pennsylvania, where the grand jury reported from, lost their licenses to educate for sexual misconduct in 2017 alone. "It is happening in other institutions" is by no means any sort of excuse and that is not what is intended by referring to these realities. As the grand jury report authors note, the Church has changed in the last 15 years. But you cannot "fix" the past nor can it be erased. This won't all fade away. You have to deal with it. The Church did not sufficiently do so in 2002 and the years that followed. Creating new policies to prevent future abuse are a necessary but not a sufficient response to the legacy of what happened.*

## THIS WEEK'S READING

**Sunday, Jan 13, 2019**

### FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

#### Stories that could be true

Our place in the cosmic scheme of things is always a large question mark at the back of our minds. As poet William Stafford suggests in "A Story That Could Be True," we journey through the world like homeless souls, wondering if maybe there's a greater home where we might truly belong and be at peace. "Who are you really, wanderer?" Stafford asks. This question has many answers. John the Baptist accepts that he's not the Christ; he's just the messenger. Jesus embraces his identity as the beloved Son. Consider what could be true—of you.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11; Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7; Luke 3:15-16, 21-22 (21).* "All were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ."

**Monday, Jan 14, 2019**

#### An unsigned letter from an inspired author

This month the liturgy uses extensively the Letter to the Hebrews, which has been called the "most elegant and sophisticated, and perhaps the most enigmatic, text of first-century Christianity." In early centuries it was usually attributed to Saint Paul, but the language and theology are very unlike Paul's letters. The truth is, no one knows for certain who authored it. After discussing the possibilities, Origen (185-254), the first great biblical scholar, remarked: "But who wrote the epistle, in truth, God knows." Regardless of authorship, Hebrews is famous for its image of the "high priesthood" of Christ. That "priesthood of all believers" belongs to all of us as followers of Christ—are you in for the journey?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Hebrews 1:1-6; Mark 1:14-20 (305).* "Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fish for people.'"

**Tuesday, Jan 15, 2019**

#### Ask an authority on the subject

Jesus astounded the people who met him along the way not only by the great deeds and signs that he performed and by what he taught—to love one's enemies or forgive countless times. The amazement of the crowds was also due to the authority with which he spoke, not citing other rabbis or scholars but teaching from his own soul. In the church we often identify "authority" only with the teaching office, the Catechism, the decrees of popes, or the sense of the faithful. But the authority with which each baptized person testifies to Christ is also the authority, the authenticity, of his or her own life of faith, justice, and mercy.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Hebrews 2:5-12; Mark 1:21-28 (306).* "The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes."

**Wednesday, Jan 16, 2019**

#### Just showing up is not enough

Woody Allen is quoted as saying, "90 percent of life is showing up." What, though, do we do with the other 10 percent? The story of God calling the prophet Samuel attests that just showing up won't take you the whole way. The first two times Samuel heard a voice calling him in the night, he responded only, "Here

I am!" The priest Eli, knowing something of God's ways, informs the young man that merely presenting himself in the holy place is insufficient. Samuel must also declare himself the servant of the Lord. Likewise, we should not rely on just showing up for the Lord. The final 10 percent is the part that makes the difference.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Hebrews 2:14-18; Mark 1:29-39 (307).* "As Samuel grew up, the Lord was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground."

**Thursday, Jan 17, 2019**

### MEMORIAL OF ANTHONY, ABBOT

#### The hermit next door

When people think of a hermit, someone like Saint Anthony the Great usually comes to mind. He was one of the first in the Christian tradition to give away his worldly wealth and go off to live alone in the desert. But consider this: There might be Catholic hermits in your very neighborhood! It's not common, but this vocation involves living a life of prayer and contemplation in solitude—in any diocese where a person might be, with the acceptance and under the direction of their bishop. Pray for those holy hermits who could be in your midst.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Hebrews 3:7-14; Mark 1:40-45 (308).* "He remained outside in deserted places."

**Friday, Jan 18, 2019**

#### One in Jesus

Today begins the Octave ("eight days") of Prayer for Christian Unity, a week of special prayer for the unity of all Christians with Jesus the Lord—who prayed at the Last Supper for his followers "that they all may be one." Many things keep Christians in their separate churches and communities. But in the end they share a common faith in Jesus who shows us who God is and calls us to love one another as God loves us. Pray today—and this week, and beyond this week—that Christians will find more to unite them than divide them.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Hebrews 4:1-5, 11; Mark 2:1-12 (309).* "So many gathered around that there was no longer room for them . . . and Jesus was speaking the word to them."

**Saturday, Jan 19, 2019**

#### Get into the ecumenical spirit

Not sure what you can do to promote Christian unity besides avoiding calling other Christians non-Catholics? Here is some simple advice found in Vatican II's *on Ecumenism*: "All the faithful should remember that the more effort they make to live holier lives according to the gospel, the better will they further Christian unity and put it into practice. For the closer their union with the Father, the Word, and the Spirit, the more deeply and easily will they be able to grow in mutual brotherly love. This change of heart and holiness of life, along with public and private prayer for the unity of Christians, should be regarded as the soul of the whole ecumenical movement, and merits the name 'spiritual ecumenism.'"

TODAY'S READINGS: *Hebrews 4:12-16; Mark 2:13-17 (310).* "Many tax collectors and sinners were also sitting with Jesus—for there were many who followed him."

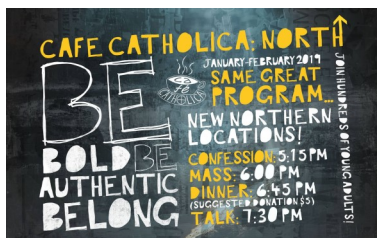

## ***Safe Environment Training & Background Check***

The CMG Safe Haven online training is replacing the VIRTUS training. The training consists of 3 vignette style training videos that is approximately 60 minutes and will include a criminal background check that must be completed.

These trainings are available in English and Spanish. We will no longer offer live trainings, all Safe Environment trainings will only be available online.

- **All new employees and volunteers** will complete the Safe Haven online training program instead of VIRTUS PGC training. The turnaround time for approval may be approximately two weeks or less.
- All individuals must complete the training and complete a background check prior to the start of employment and/or volunteer service.
- The 5-year anniversary date is still in place, individuals who recently attended VIRTUS will not be due to complete refresher trainings until they have met their 5-year anniversary date. As the 5-year anniversary date is met, individuals will need to log into CMGConnect with their previous personal VIRTUS user id and 1234 as the password. **Once the individual logs into their CMGConnect account, they will be able to change their password.** If they do not remember the user id, they may contact the following:

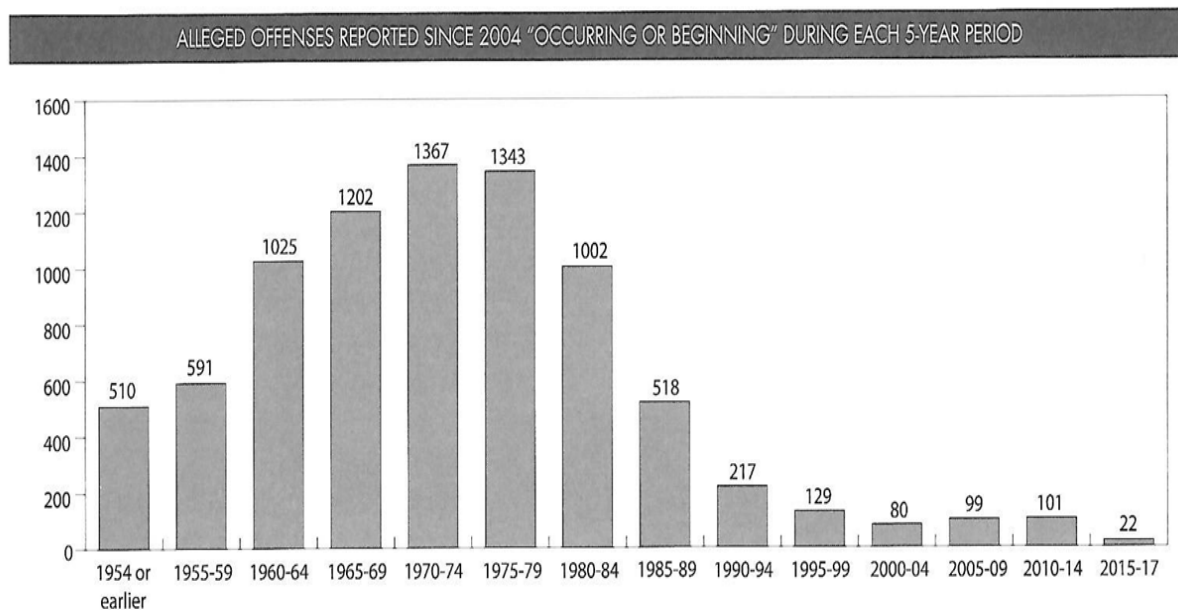
## COLUMNA PASTORAL

Queridos hermanos:

En la columna de la semana pasada, escribí sobre el escándalo de abuso sexual y la publicación de los nombres de los sacerdotes, diáconos y obispos "acusados de forma creíble" que sucederá a fines de mes. También escribí sobre el trabajo que se ha emprendido desde la Reunión de Obispos en Dallas en 2002, para combatir esta crisis en la Iglesia la cual produjo el Documento denominado Estatuto para la Protección de Niños y Jóvenes. Con este documento se inició desde entonces una política de cero tolerancias contra cualquier forma de abuso sexual con un menor. En esta columna, quiero exhibir una presentación visual, para ayudar a comprender mejor lo bueno que ha hecho el Documento por la Iglesia. Esta información proviene de CARA (Centro de Investigación Aplicada en el Apostolado), que es un centro nacional de investigación en ciencias sociales aplicadas, sin fines de lucro, que estudia a la Iglesia Católica y tiene 50 años de experiencia. Esto es lo que se comparte en su informe:

*Las nuevas denuncias de abusos no han desaparecido. En los últimos tres años, se han reportado en la iglesia 22 denuncias de abuso durante 2015-2017, un promedio de alrededor de siete por año en todo el país. Eso es demasiado, Nada es aceptable, excepto cero. Al mismo tiempo, para poner estos reportes en algún contexto, 42 maestros en el estado de Pensilvania, de donde informó el gran jurado, perdieron sus licencias para educar por conducta sexual inapropiada, esto en año 2017. "Está sucediendo en otras instituciones" no es de ninguna manera una excusa y no es lo que se pretende al referirse a estas realidades. Como señalan los autores del informe del gran jurado, la Iglesia ha cambiado en los últimos 15 años. Pero no se puede "arreglar" el pasado ni se puede borrar. Todo esto no se desvanecerá. Tenemos que lidiar con ello. La Iglesia no lo hizo suficientemente en el 2002 y en los años siguientes. Crear nuevas políticas para prevenir futuros abusos es una respuesta necesaria pero no suficiente para el legado de lo que sucedió.*
