PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This coming Wednesday, May 22nd, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation with approximately 100 of our youth. This will be their final phase of full initiation in the Church. Confirmation is considered a sacrament of initiation. That tells us that Confirmation has something to do with our being introduced into the life of God and of the Church. The first initiation was Baptism, when we were adopted by God and welcomed into the family of the Church. Baptism set us on the path to eternal life, and got things started. Confirmation intensifies that beginning and blesses us with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. I want to share with you a posting from Fr. Don Miller, OFM, who has summed up nicely the teachings and practices of the Sacrament of Confirmation. He states:

*Just as Baptism **gives** new life, Eucharist **nourishes** life, and Reconciliation **restores** life when it is broken, Confirmation **strengthens** that life by the gifts of the Holy Spirit. It is about strengthening what God has given, and continues to give, to his sons and daughters. The Sacrament of Confirmation is not the Catholic equivalent to the Jewish bar mitzvah. Confirmation is not a “coming of age” celebration. True, most young people are just beginning to pass into early adulthood when they receive the sacrament. But Confirmation is not about coming of age. And, reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation does not mark the end of formal religious education. We never outgrow a need for a deeper knowledge and appreciation of our faith. Therefore, we can clearly say that the Sacrament of Confirmation is not a rite of passage, nor a graduation from religion formation classes, nor a ratification of a personal faith choice. Rather, it’s all about what God is doing for his beloved daughters and sons. And what is God doing? Strengthening the divine life which he gave at Baptism, nourishing us in the Eucharist, and reconciling with us in Penance. Why? So that the individual can better defend and witness to the faith through the gifts and workings of the Holy Spirit. And there are—and will be—many situations where we are called upon to defend and witness to our faith. And we need all the help we can get!*

In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Holy Spirit completes the grace of baptism and offers the newly confirmed strength as a true witness of Christ. Thus, the newly confirmed is “more strictly obliged to spread and defend the faith by word and deed” (cf. CCC, 1285). Thus, the Holy Spirit completes what was begun at Baptism. Canon law states that, except when there is a danger of death, anyone who is baptized and has the use of reason, is properly instructed and disposed, and is able to renew their baptismal commitment, is able to be confirmed. Perhaps the requirement that one be “properly disposed” is the key to when the sacrament is received. Proper disposition refers to the recipient’s willingness to cooperate with the gifts of the sacrament, which can happen at almost any age. But nowhere is the sacrament described as a ratification of the recipient’s choice or decision about the faith. Rather, it is the gifts of the Spirit offered to give the recipient the courage and strength to witness and serve—two responsibilities implied in baptism—which are the grace and focus of the sacrament. Thus, it is to be viewed, as are all of the sacraments, as a distinctive working of God in a person’s life.

The Sacrament of Confirmation helps a person remain faithful to his or her baptismal commitment to witness to Christ and to serve others. The gifts of the Holy Spirit associated with Confirmation are strengths (or virtues) that Christian living requires if it is to be fruitful and complete. Perhaps we don’t recognize these qualities as gifts of strength because they have become a part of our Christian living and appear quite natural—a fact that affirms how closely the Holy Spirit works with us.

Giving the Holy Spirit includes filling the individual with the seven gifts of the Spirit. These are:

Wisdom is the ability to properly value our faith. To put life in proper perspective.

Understanding helps us realize the meaning of what we believe—at least to some significant degree.

Counsel helps us act in the best way possible.

Fortitude gives us the strength to do what we know we ought to do.

Knowledge helps us see life as God sees it.

Piety helps us desire to worship and serve God.

Fear of the Lord helps us want to serve God well out of a sense of respect.

Join us this Wednesday, May 22nd, for the celebration of Confirmation at 7:00 pm. The regularly scheduled Confessions and 6:45 pm Mass are cancelled for the celebration.

MEMORIAL OF BERNARDINE OF SIENA, PRIEST

It's good to evolve

Bernardine of Siena (1380-1444) was known as a gifted preacher. But many of his sermons were polemics against Jews and homosexual peoples. The cultural, political, and religious context of his time gave tacit approval to such invective. But Catholic thinking today has evolved. The catechism now teaches that people with same-sex attraction "must be accepted with respect, compassion and sensitivity" (#2358). And, according to the catechism, the church "enjoys a link" with the Jewish people, the "first to hear the word of God" (#839). Do you hold assumptions about others that need to be reexamined?

MEMORIAL OF CHRISTOPHER MAGALLANES, PRIEST, AND COMPANIONS, MARTYRS

Dying to find a better way

Christopher Magallanes was a priest in Mexico during a difficult time in Mexican history. On the heels of the Mexican Revolution of 1910-17, the Catholic Church and the Mexican state were at loggerheads. Magallanes wrote and preached against armed rebellion but was falsely accused of promoting armed uprising during what came to be called the Cristero Rebellion. Arrested in 1927 on his way to celebrate Mass, he gave his few possessions—as well as absolution—to his executioners. His last words were, "I die innocent and ask God that my blood may serve to unite my Mexican brethren." Since 1929 church and state in Mexico have by and large avoided further violent conflict and are on much better terms than in the past. Pray for peaceful resolutions to conflicts in the world today.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 14:19-28; John 14:27-31a* (286). "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you."

MEMORIAL OF RITA OF CASCIA, RELIGIOUS

Persist in your faith

Margarita was the only child of a late 14th-century Italian couple. Rita, as she was known, was a 12-year-old bride to a difficult husband, the mother of two sons, and an early widow whose husband was killed in a violent vendetta. Upon the later deaths of her sons, Rita entered the Augustinian monastery in

her hometown of Cascia. Biographers write of her having been a persistent woman of faith who refused to give up a dream of monastic life as well as a peacemaker who reconciled the warring factions that contributed to her husband's death. All agree that she became known as a mystic whose devotion to Christ's suffering produced a wound on her forehead as she ministered to the sick and counseled the steady stream of visitors to the convent. In her memory, let's ask today for grace that empowers us to persistence in faith and peacemaking in relationships.

The tie that binds

What comes to mind when you think of *love*? Maybe it's the deep connection you have with a loved one. Jesus talked about love in this way: The close relationship he had to the Father was the one he had with his disciples. He also gave us an example of a love that respects others, is patient, and is willing to make sacrifices for the good of others. Love, then, is about both contemplation and action: entering the bond you have with Jesus and the Father and also responding to it. Christ said another thing about love: It makes you happy. There's a unique joy in loving others. Find it today.

In 2007, Pope Benedict XVI released a letter to the 9 million Catholics in China, in which he dedicated May 24 each year as a World Day of Prayer for the Church in China. The Holy Father wrote, "the Catholics of the whole world . . . will demonstrate their fraternal solidarity and solicitude for you, asking the Lord of history for the gift of perseverance in witness, in the certainty that your sufferings past and present for the Holy Name of Jesus and your intrepid loyalty to his Vicar on earth will be rewarded." Pray today that the contentious relations between China and the Catholic Church continue to improve.

While we know him as the source of much of early English history, he was also a great student of scripture and a teacher. Church history, scripture—these are two important areas to know something about to have a better grasp of your faith. Find some books on the subject, like *A Concise History of the Catholic Church* by Thomas Bokenkotter and *Invitation to the Old Testament and Invitation to the New Testament*, both by Alice L. Camille.

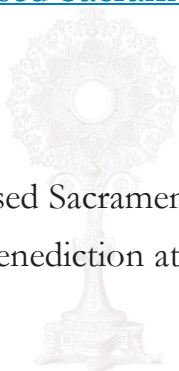

SCAMMERS IMPERSONATING PASTORS TO SOLICIT GIFT CARDS

Consumer Alert: Scammers Impersonating Pastors to Solicit Gift Cards

Attorney General Ken Paxton today issued a consumer alert regarding persons alleging to be priests or pastors texting members of the church and asking them to buy gift cards for a false charitable cause.

Texans have received deceptive texts from people pretending to be pastors, then requesting that they purchase a gift card and send them the information to access that card. The scammers claim these gift cards are needed for some charitable reason, but insist they cannot pick up a gift card themselves and the purchaser will be reimbursed.

"All Texans should be aware of unsolicited calls and texts from scammers impersonating leaders in their Church. This is a dirty trick criminals are using to make a quick buck at the expense of people of faith," Attorney General Paxton said. "My office stands ready to assist all hard-working Texans who are harmed by these schemes. The consumer protection section of our website contains several resources on how to recognize, prevent and report scams like this. Being informed and remaining vigilant is the best way to prevent fraud and loss."

We believe that the scammers are using information found on churches' website or in churches' online bulletins to trick members of the church into sending them gift cards. Churches throughout Texas have seen reports of this scam.

Depression by the numbers:

- Depression ranks among the top 3 workplace issues in the U.S.
- Depression is the leading cause of disability in the U.S. among people ages 15-44
- It is estimated that 7% of the general population suffers from depression
- Nearly 15% of women suffer from postpartum depression within 4-6 weeks of giving birth
- 30% of college students report feeling depressed, which disrupts their studies

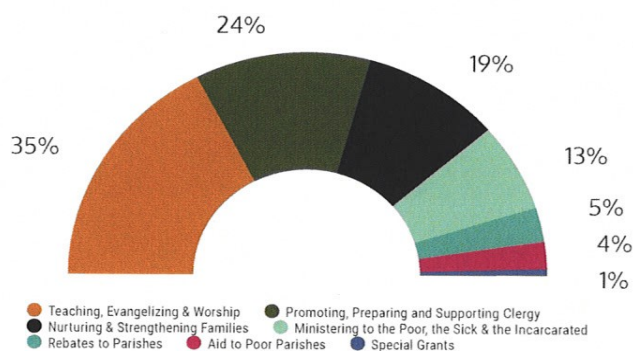

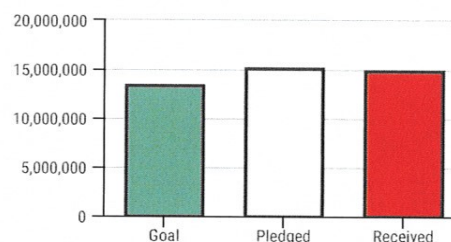

COLUMNA DEL PÁRROCO

Queridos hermanos:

El próximo miércoles, 22 de mayo, celebraremos el Sacramento de la Confirmación con aproximadamente 100 de nuestros jóvenes. Esta será su fase final de plena iniciación a la Iglesia. La confirmación se considera un sacramento de iniciación. Eso nos dice que la Confirmación tiene algo que ver con nuestra introducción a la vida de Dios y de la Iglesia. La primera iniciación fue el bautismo, cuando fuimos adoptados por Dios y acogidos en la familia de la Iglesia. El bautismo nos puso en el camino de la vida eterna y comenzó nuestra jornada. La confirmación intensifica ese comienzo y nos bendice con los dones del Espíritu Santo. Quiero compartir con ustedes una publicación del Padre Don Miller, OFM, quien ha resumido muy bien las enseñanzas y prácticas del Sacramento de la Confirmación y dice:

*Así como el Bautismo da nueva vida, la Eucaristía **sustenta** la vida, y la Reconciliación **restaura** la vida cuando se rompe, la Confirmación **fortalece** esa vida por medio de los dones del Espíritu Santo. Se trata de fortalecer lo que Dios ha dado y sigue dando a sus hijos.*

El Sacramento de la Confirmación no es el equivalente católico a la bar mitzva judía. La confirmación no es una celebración de "mayoría de edad". Es cierto que la mayoría de los jóvenes apenas comienzan a pasar a la adultez temprana cuando reciben este sacramento. Pero la confirmación no se trata de llegar a la mayoría de edad. Y, la recepción del Sacramento de la Confirmación no marca el final de la educación religiosa formal. Nunca superamos la necesidad de un conocimiento y aprendizaje más profundos de nuestra fe. Por lo tanto, podemos decir claramente que el Sacramento de la Confirmación no es un rito de paso, ni una graduación de las clases de formación de religión, ni una validación de una elección de fe personal. Más bien, se trata de lo que Dios está haciendo por sus amados hijos. ¿Y qué está haciendo Dios? Fortaleciendo la vida divina que dio en el Bautismo, alimentándonos en la Eucaristía y reconciliándose con nosotros en Penitencia. ¿Por qué? Para que el individuo pueda defender mejor y dar testimonio de la fe a través de los dones y obras del Espíritu Santo. Y hay, y habrán, muchas situaciones en las que estamos llamados a defender y dar testimonio de nuestra fe. ¡Y necesitamos toda la ayuda para que podamos conseguirlo!

En el Sacramento de la Confirmación, el Espíritu Santo completa la gracia del bautismo y ofrece la fortaleza al recién confirmado como un verdadero testigo de Cristo. Por lo tanto, el recién confirmado está "más estrictamente obligado a difundir y defender la fe con palabras y hechos" (cf. CCC, 1285). Así, el Espíritu Santo completa lo que se comenzó en el bautismo. La ley canónica establece que, excepto cuando existe peligro de muerte, cualquier persona que ha sido bautizada y tiene uso de razón, está debidamente instruido y dispuesto, y pueda renovar su compromiso bautismal, pueda confirmarse. Quizás el requisito de que uno esté "correctamente dispuesto" es la clave para recibir el sacramento. La disposición adecuada se refiere a la disposición del receptor a cooperar con los dones del sacramento, que puede suceder a cualquier edad. Pero en ninguna parte se describe este sacramento como una ratificación de la elección o decisión del receptor sobre la fe. Más bien, son los dones del Espíritu ofrecidos para dar al receptor el valor y la fuerza para dar testimonio y servir, dos responsabilidades implícitas en el bautismo, que son la gracia y el enfoque de los sacramentos. Por lo tanto, debe considerarse, así como todos los sacramentos, como una obra distintiva de Dios en la vida de una persona.

El Sacramento de la Confirmación ayuda a una persona a permanecer fiel a su compromiso bautismal de dar testimonio de Cristo y de servir a los demás. Los dones del Espíritu Santo asociados con la Confirmación son fortalezas (o virtudes) que la vida cristiana requiere para que sea fructífera y completa. Quizás no reconozcamos estas cualidades como dones de fortaleza porque se han convertido en parte de nuestra vida cristiana y parecen bastante naturales, un hecho que afirma cuán cerca el Espíritu Santo trabaja con nosotros.

El Espíritu Santo llena al individuo con los siete dones del Espíritu. Estos son:
