PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Friends,

Happy Feast Day! The Feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola, our patron saint, is this Wednesday, July 31st. However, as liturgical law allows, we transfer the celebration of the feast to this weekend and mark it as a solemnity – the highest rank of feasts. We should all be very proud to be disciples of Jesus the Lord and of St. Ignatius of Loyola. His greatest desire was “to be placed next to the Son” as should be the greatest desire of each and every one of us.

The founder of the Jesuits was on his way to military fame and fortune when a cannon ball shattered his leg. Because there were no books of romance on hand during his convalescence, Ignatius whiled away the time reading a life of Christ and lives of the saints. His conscience was deeply touched, and a long, painful turning to Christ began. Having seen the Mother of God in a vision, he made a pilgrimage to her shrine at Montserrat near Barcelona. He remained for almost a year at nearby Manresa, sometimes with the Dominicans, sometimes in a pauper's hospice, often in a cave in the hills praying. After a period of great peace of mind, he went through a harrowing trial of scruples. There was no comfort in anything—prayer, fasting, sacraments, penance. At length, his peace of mind returned. It was during this year of conversion that Ignatius began to write down material that later became his greatest work, the *Spiritual Exercises*. These *Spiritual Exercises* are depicted in the bas reliefs located in the Legacy Garden, in front of the church.

In 1534, at the age of 43, he and six others, two of whom were Saint Francis Xavier and St. Peter Faber, vowed to live in poverty and chastity and to go to the Holy Land. If this became impossible, they vowed to offer themselves to the apostolic service of the pope. The latter became the only choice. Four years later Ignatius made the association permanent. The new Society of Jesus was approved by Pope Paul III, and Ignatius was elected to serve as the first general. Ignatius was a true mystic. He centered his spiritual life on the essential foundations of Christianity—the Trinity, Christ, the Eucharist. His spirituality is expressed in the Jesuit motto, *Ad maiorem Dei gloriam* (AMDG): “for the greater glory of God.” In his concept, obedience was to be the prominent virtue, to assure the effectiveness and mobility of the Jesuits. All activity was to be guided by a true love of the Church and unconditional obedience to the Holy Father, for which reason all professed members took a fourth vow to go wherever the pope should send them for the salvation of souls.

In this time of highlighting differences between peoples, countries and religions, here is something to think about. Luther nailed his theses to the church door at Wittenberg in 1517. Seventeen years later, Ignatius of Loyola founded the Society of Jesus (The Jesuits) that was to play so prominent a part in the Catholic Reformation. He was an implacable foe of Protestantism. Yet the seeds of ecumenism may be found in his words: “Great care must be taken to show forth orthodox truth in such a way that if any heretics happen to be present, they may have an example of charity and Christian moderation. No hard words should be used nor any sort of contempt for their errors be shown.” God has given us the example of so worthy a Knight of God's Kingdom and his words and deeds are something we all can emulate. May St. Ignatius continue to intercede for us in our desire to live our lives as a community of faith being *a people for others*.

With our celebration of our patronal feast, we also say good-bye to one of our deacons and his wife.



Deacon Henry and Alicia Vinklerek are moving to another state and leave us this week. Both Deacon and Alicia have been very active members of our parish community. In fact, they even met through participation in the Ministry of Adult Singles! Since his ordination, Deacon Henry has been a tremendous help to the patients and staff at St. Luke Hospital in the Vintage. His pastoral care of the sick at St. Luke's has been appreciated by all of us. As the Vinklerek begin this new phase of their life, I hope that you will join me in wishing them much grace and happiness. May God, who began such good work through Deacon Henry and Alicia, continue the good works of ministry in their new home and parish.

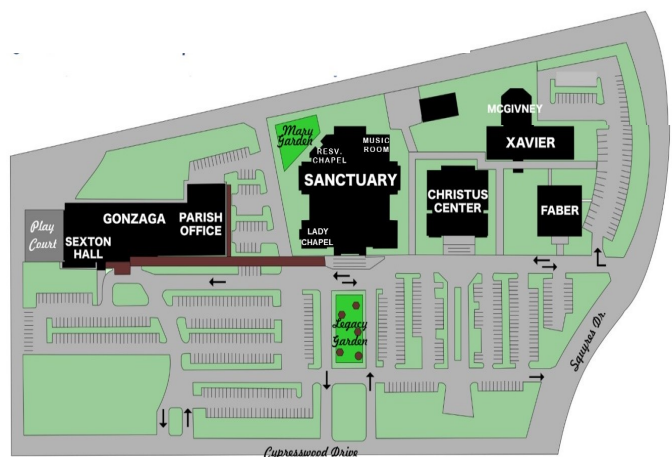

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Teach and learn as you go

Teaching is mostly conceived as an academic process relegated to schools or online programs. But the most meaningful lessons we learn happen far from classrooms. What did you learn simply from growing up in the environment that produced you? What did you imbibed from family members, storybooks, personal heroes, or actual experiences? When the disciples of Jesus ask for praying lessons, they've already observed how disciplined Jesus is in his own habits. Jesus teaches them the Lord's Prayer—but he'd already taught them, by his example, the importance of praying.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Genesis 18:20-32; Colossians 2:12-14; Luke 11:1-13 (111)*. "When he had finished [praying], one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray.' "

MEMORIAL OF MARTHA

Friends ask friends

Martha isn't one to beat about the bush. After her brother dies, she marches up to Jesus and tells it like it is: "Lord, if you had been here . . ." This is the same Martha who once asked Jesus to act on her behalf when she slaved away as her sister sat at his feet: "Tell her to help me." The Bible tells us that Jesus was a good friend of Martha. Thanks to Martha, it also shows how we can count on Jesus as a friend—trusting him enough to be candid about our needs. Just ask.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Exodus 32:15-24, 30-34 (401); John 11:19-27 or Luke 10:38-42 (401/607)*. "I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you."

MEMORIAL OF BLESSED SOLANUS CASEY, O.F.M., CAP.

God opens a door

Blessed Father Solanus Casey (1870-1957) is on his way to sainthood. That might have surprised those who knew him in seminary where he was considered so academically slow that, once ordained, he was not allowed to preach or hear Confessions! What he could do was greet people as the porter (doorkeeper) at the Capuchin monastery in Detroit where he lived. More than 20,000 people attended Solanus' funeral services, for he turned the front door job into a holy and humble ministry that welcomed the stranger and consoled the many who visited daily. If today you fear you are not worthy, remember that all things are possible with God.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Exodus 33:7-11; 34:5b-9, 28; Matthew 13:36-43 (402)*. "Then the righteous will shine like the sun."

MEMORIAL OF IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA, PRIEST

Surrender yourself

Saint Ignatius, that wounded Spanish soldier of the 1500s—whose conversion grew a group of "soldiers for Christ"—liked bold sayings. Such as: "Go forth and set the world on fire." Not to mention his Jesuit order's motto: "All for the greater glory of God." Once Ignatius saw the Kingdom as Jesus did, there was no turning back—no price too high. The key? Be a soldier who

surrenders. His Suscipe ("surrender") Prayer says it all: "Receive, Lord, all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and my whole will . . . Give me only your love and your grace. With this I am rich enough."

TODAY'S READINGS: *Exodus 34:29-35; Matthew 13:44-46 (403)*. "When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all that he has."

MEMORIAL OF ALPHONSUS LIGUORI, BISHOP, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Reconcile yourself

A shrinking number of Catholics—even those who attend Mass regularly—go to Confession. Don't be tempted to skip this sacrament; pray for help from Saint Alphonsus Liguori, the patron of confessors, who preached in the 18th-century slums of Italy. He never refused anyone absolution and even fought against a heresy that treated penitents like criminals. Part of the mission of the order he founded, the Redemptorists, is to bring people back into a life of grace through Confession. With the help of his intercession, embrace the healing of forgiveness and be reconciled with your loving God.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Exodus 40:16-21, 34-38; Matthew 13:47-53 (404)*. "The angels will go out and separate the wicked from the righteous."

MEMORIAL OF PETER JULIAN EYMARD, PRIEST

Receive and be transformed

Saint Peter Julian Eymard (1811-68) founded the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament dedicated to setting the "four corners of the world on fire with eucharistic love." His vision of priests, sisters, deacons, and laypeople all actively participating in the Eucharist anticipated and helped shape the liturgical renewals of the 20th century. Peter Julian saw the Eucharist as our hidden treasure that needed to be brought into the light so that Jesus could "once again take his place at the head of Christian society." "Receive Communion often," he wrote, "and Jesus will change you into himself." What can you do to help the "reign of the Eucharist" increase?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Leviticus 23:1, 4-11, 15-16, 27, 34b-37; Matthew 13:54-58 (405)*. "Where did this man get such wisdom and mighty deeds?"

Saturday, Aug 03, 2019

Be guided by good conscience

Conscience is that still small voice deep within that guides us in making moral judgements. It is a lifetime's work to form conscience using God's law of love as the measure of what is upright. How do we do that work of formation? We pray for the guidance of God's Spirit, seek the wisdom of faithful friends, read scripture, and consider teachings of the church. So formed, we "must always obey the certain judgment of conscience" as the Catechism says. Conscience has been well attended when a decision, no matter how tough or even unpopular, brings a sense of freedom and peace of heart.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Leviticus 25:1, 8-17; Matthew 14:1-12 (406)*. "For John (the Baptist) had said to (Herod), 'It is not lawful for you to have her.' "

Solemnity of St. Ignatius of Loyola



July 31st is the Solemnity of St. Ignatius of Loyola, our patron saint. St. Ignatius spent his early years at court and as a soldier. Later he was converted to God and undertook theological studies at Paris where he attracted his first followers, and afterward at Rome he joined them together as the first members of the Society of Jesus. He exercised a most fruitful apostolate both by his written works and in the training of his disciples who won great praise for their renewal of the Church. May we continue to follow his example as we strive to be *A PEOPLE FOR OTHERS!*

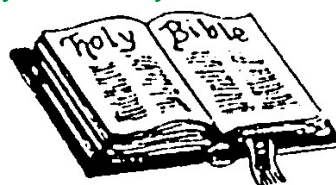

COLUMNA DEL PÁRROCO

Queridos amigos,

¡Estamos de Fiesta! La fiesta de San Ignacio de Loyola, nuestro santo patrón, es este miércoles 31 de julio. Sin embargo, como lo permite la ley litúrgica, transferimos la celebración de la fiesta a este fin de semana y la marcamos como una solemnidad, el rango más alto de fiestas. Todos debemos estar muy orgullosos de ser discípulos de Jesús el Señor y de San Ignacio de Loyola. Su mayor deseo era "ser puesto al lado del Hijo", como debería ser el mayor deseo de todos y cada uno de nosotros.

El fundador de los jesuitas se dirigía a la fama y la fortuna militar cuando una bola de cañón le destrozó su pierna. Debido a que no había libros de romance a mano durante su convalecencia, Ignacio pasó el tiempo leyendo sobre la vida de Cristo y las vidas de los santos. Su conciencia estaba profundamente conmovida, y así comenzó un largo y doloroso camino hacia Cristo. Habiendo visto a la Madre de Dios en una visión, hizo una peregrinación a su santuario en Montserrat, cerca de Barcelona. Permaneció casi un año en la cercana Manresa, a veces con los dominicanos, a veces en un hospicio para los pobres, a menudo en una cueva en las colinas rezando. Después de un período de mucha paz, atravesó una lastimosa prueba de escrúpulos. No hubo consuelo en nada: oración, ayuno, sacramentos, penitencia. Por fin, le regreso su tranquilidad. Fue durante este año de conversión que Ignacio comenzó a escribir material que más tarde se convirtió en su obra más importante, los Ejercicios Espirituales. Estos ejercicios espirituales están representados en los bajorrelieves (esculpidos) ubicados en el Legacy Garden, frente a la iglesia.

En 1534, a la edad de 43 años, él y otros seis, dos de los cuales eran San Francisco Javier y San Pedro Fabro, prometieron vivir en la pobreza y la castidad e ir a Tierra Santa. Si esto se volviera imposible, se comprometieron a ofrecerse al servicio apostólico del papa. Esta última se convirtió en la única opción. Cuatro años después, Ignacio hizo la asociación permanente. La nueva Compañía de Jesús fue aprobada por el papa Pablo III, e Ignacio fue elegido para servir como el primer general. Ignacio fue un verdadero místico. Centraba su vida espiritual en los fundamentos esenciales del cristianismo: la Trinidad, Cristo, la Eucaristía. Su espiritualidad se expresa en el lema Jesuita, *Ad maiorem Dei gloriam* (AMDG): "para la mayor gloria de Dios". En su concepto, la obediencia debía ser la virtud prominente, asegurar la efectividad y la movilidad de los jesuitas. Todas las actividades debían ser guiadas por un verdadero amor a la Iglesia y la obediencia incondicional al Santo Padre, por lo que todos los miembros profesos o iniciados hicieron un cuarto voto, de ir a donde el Papa les enviara para la salvación de las almas.

En este momento de resaltar las diferencias entre pueblos, países y religiones, aquí hay algo en que pensar. Lutero clavó sus tesis en la puerta de la iglesia en Wittenberg en 1517. Diecisiete años más tarde, Ignacio de Loyola fundó la Compañía de Jesús (Los Jesuitas) que iba a desempeñar un papel tan importante en la Reforma Católica. Era un enemigo implacable del protestantismo. Sin embargo, las semillas del ecumenismo se pueden encontrar en sus palabras: "Se debe tener mucho cuidado de mostrar la verdad ortodoxa de tal manera que, si algún hereje está presente, tenga un ejemplo de caridad y moderación cristiana. No se deben usar palabras pesadas ni se debe mostrar ningún tipo de desprecio por sus errores". Dios nos ha dado el ejemplo de un Reino del Caballero de Dios tan digno y sus palabras y acciones son algo que todos podemos emular. Que San Ignacio siga intercediendo por nosotros en nuestro deseo de vivir nuestras vidas como una comunidad de fe siendo *un pueblo para los demás*.

Con nuestra celebración de nuestra fiesta patronal, también nos despedimos de uno de nuestros diáconos y de su esposa. El diácono Henry y Alicia Vinklarek se mudan a otro estado y nos dejan esta semana. Tanto el Diácono como Alicia han sido miembros muy activos de nuestra comunidad parroquial. De hecho, ¡incluso se conocieron a través de la participación en el Ministerio de Adultos Solteros! Desde su ordenación, el Diácono Henry ha sido de gran ayuda para los pacientes y el personal del Hospital San Lucas en Vintage. Todos nosotros hemos apreciado su cuidado pastoral de los enfermos en San Lucas. DÉCIMO SÉPTIMO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Enseña y aprende sobre la marcha

La enseñanza se concibe principalmente como un proceso académico relegado a las escuelas o los programas en línea. Pero las lecciones más importantes que aprendemos suceden lejos de los salones de clase. ¿Qué aprendiste simplemente al crecer en el ambiente que te produjo? ¿Qué absorbiste de los miembros de tu familia, libros de cuentos, héroes personales, o de experiencias reales?
