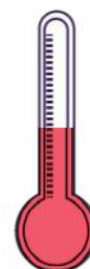

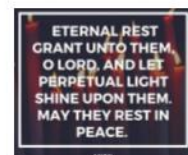

PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Fr. Justin and I have reached another milestone in our lives. This past Monday, June 1st, he celebrated his first anniversary as a priest. He truly has been a blessing as the parochial vicar as well as the latest housemate at the rectory. His sense of humor is a true asset – especially as we've had to make adjustments during this time of pandemic. He is a dedicated young priest willing to go the extra mile for the service of the people of God. The words spoken at his ordination, "may God bring to fulfillment the good work He has begun in you" are being seen in our midst. With yesterday's ordinations (06-06-20), Fr. Justin is no longer a baby priest! Happy 1st Anniversary, Fr. Justin!

For me, June 1st marked the 14th anniversary of my pastorate here at St. Ignatius of Loyola. In many ways it seemed like I arrived just yesterday, but there literally has been much water under the bridge since then. Through the years we have endured, conquered, and survived many natural disasters and a major capital campaign! Let's see, there was Hurricane Ike in September of 2008 and 15 days with no electricity on campus or at the rectory. We banded together and with the help of many parishioners assisted those who needed ice, water, food, and supplies. We also broke all previous records for the Fall Festival with only two weeks for final preparations. Again, everyone pulled together and for the first time in SILCC history, the Fall Festival netted over \$100,000! Then came the drought of 2010. Our water bill rose to \$1500 a month for a while. Cars in the parking lot were being covered in soot and ash flakes from the fires around Magnolia. We lost a few trees, but, again, we pulled through it. There were also heavy rains and floods that filled our parking lots full of water. A couple of times the "Lake Loyola" water line reached the top steps of the old office building (now Faber Spirituality Center). We kicked off a major capital campaign to build the long-awaited education center. Remember, the desire of the community was to build this but at the last minute the plans changed, and the church was built instead. As I said at the time, major capital campaigns cause division and unrest in the community and the Gonzaga Center project was no different. We had people leave the community because they didn't see the vision and wanted no part of it. We hosted receptions and "dog and pony shows" to explain the reasoning and need for the building and money started coming in. We broke ground on May 4, 2014 and about a year later Bishop Sheltz came for the blessing and dedication. The parish had accomplished the long await of a campus completion. Now all we had to do was conquer the debit. But it didn't take long, and another major event hit us. On August 25th, 2017 Hurricane Harvey paid a visit to the greater Houston area. Overnight of August 27th to the 28th, Harvey flooded our entire parish campus. We lost usage of all our buildings; some taking in as much as 5 feet of water – and more! All we had left was the second floor of the Gonzaga building to use for offices and storage. (I guess the need for the Gonzaga Center was greater than we imagined.) Parishioners banded together with the battle cry, "We are the Church" and helped one another muck out homes, provide food and shelter and joined us for Mass at Klein High School, Kleb Middle School, Sexton Hall and finally the big white tent. When we celebrated Advent in the tent we felt as if we had come home. The Archdiocesan insurance program assisted us in the \$4.75M rebuild of our campus. Strangers from all over the world sent donations to help us rebuild our campus. Then, on May 31, 2018, Cardinal DiNardo dedicated the church once more to the honor and glory of God. The rest of the campus was opened by the first of August. We had come home in one year's time. God walked us through the flooded waters to the other side and a newness of life. Again, I thought we could now breath and enjoy and rebuild our community after having rebuilt the campus. But, COVID-19/the Coronavirus, changed our course once more. We shut down everything in mid-March of 2020 and began the new ministry of livestreaming our Masses and prayer times through Facebook. We walked the journey of Lent, the Triduum and Easter together in remote locations brought together via the internet, laptops, computers, and smart phones. Our community has stayed strong throughout the pandemic and we continue to open in phases outlined by the State Government and the Archdiocese. We are still on this part of the journey together and I know we will make it through because God is with us. To be a pilgrim people has become part of our identity in these 14 years. Through all of these events, God has shown us how to live as a people for others. I am grateful for these experiences and memories for you have shown me the face of God in the midst of natural disasters and major projects. If our lives are dedicated to Him, we will make it through to the other side safely, without harm.

The power in three

Faith, hope, love; body, mind, spirit; life, liberty, the pursuit of happiness; executive, judicial, legislative: There's something satisfying and complete about a list of three. Good things come in threes, too: from "bacon, lettuce, and tomato" to "Peter, Paul, and Mary." Alert to the power of three, scripture uses it as the sum of completion. The prophet Jonah spends three days inside the fish to fully absorb a lesson in obedience. Jesus exits the tomb on the third day. We encounter God three ways: as Creator, Restorer, Sanctifier. O God of many faces—recreate, restore, bless our community!

TODAY'S READINGS: *Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9; 2 Corinthians 13:11-13; John 3:16-18 (164).* "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you."

Monday, Jun 08, 2020

The cure for what ails us

Pope Francis said that living the Beatitudes means "going against the flow" of the world. What the world tells us—that wealth brings security, that power gives us strength, that pleasure makes us satisfied—is the opposite of what Jesus says. Francis asks us to let the Beatitudes "unsettle us . . . challenge us, and . . . demand a real change in the way we live." We've clearly been upended in this sense by the current pandemic, and we have learned first-hand that nothing exempts us from vulnerability. Jesus was, is, and always will be our only hope. Live accordingly.

TODAY'S READINGS: *1 Kings 17:1-6; Matthew 5:1-12 (359).* "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

MEMORIAL OF EPHREM OF SYRIA, DEACON, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Rise and shine!

Leave it to Saint Ephrem to derive beauty from pain. As we feel the ripple effects of coronavirus, let's learn from a man who died in 373 during a plague—from contracting the disease of the people he was ministering to. Ephrem, named a doctor of the church for the poetic nature of his theology, wrote: "We give glory to you, Lord, who raised up your cross to span the jaws of death like a bridge by which souls might pass from the region of the dead to the land of the living." Seek and share beauty today.

TODAY'S READINGS: *1 Kings 17:7-16; Matthew 5:13-16 (360).* "Just so, your light must shine before others."

Wednesday, Jun 10, 2020

Most fulfilling of all

As children, many of us were required to memorize the Ten Commandments. It's likely we can still recite them and have a sense of their importance. However, the catechism teaches that it is the *Beatitudes* that "fulfill, refine, and surpass the old law to its perfection." And how many of us can recite *them* from memory or even know where to find them in the Bible? (Hint: For all eight, try 5:3-12.) In these difficult and, for some,

tragic days, as we seek God's presence in our midst, we ask for the grace to comfort those who mourn.

TODAY'S READINGS: *1 Kings 18:20-39; Matthew 5:17-19 (361).* "Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets. I have come not to abolish but to fulfill."

Thursday, Jun 11, 2020

MEMORIAL OF BARNABAS, APOSTLE

Make history

What was it like during the times of the apostle Barnabas, whose memorial is today? Thousands of people at a time were becoming Christians with no real formality or infrastructure yet in the church. There was the "grace of God" and "firmness of heart" at work, today's first reading tells us, but persecution and internal conflict too. Every era has its challenges and opportunities. How are you building the Body of Christ during your moment in history?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 11:21b-26; 13:1-3 (580); Matthew 5:20-26 (362).* "They sent Barnabas to go to Antioch. When he arrived and saw the grace of God, he rejoiced and encouraged them all."

Friday, Jun 12, 2020

This most amazing day

Tucked within Muir Woods, a national memorial park in California, is a beautiful space called Cathedral Grove. Hikers are asked to maintain quiet as they behold the old-growth coastal redwood trees. Though not a "cathedral" in the ecclesial sense, the grove reminds us that nature is one of the surest places to experience the power and tenderness of God. Pope Francis writes in *Laudato Si'*: "The entire material universe speaks of God's love, his boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God." How do you experience this "caress of God," even in the potted plant in your own home?

TODAY'S READINGS: *1 Kings 19:9a, 11-16; Matthew 5:27-32 (363).* "Go out and stand on the mountain before the LORD; the LORD will pass by."

Saturday, Jun 13, 2020

MEMORIAL OF ANTHONY OF PADUA, PRIEST, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Treasure the baby and the Bible

The traditional depiction of Saint Anthony (1195-1231) holding the infant Jesus began with a 1580 painting by El Greco showing the Franciscan priest with a large open Bible in which one can see the very tiny baby emerging from the text. Over time in Christian art the image of the baby grew to become a life-size child in the arms of the saint, sometimes standing on a much smaller book and sometimes with the Bible missing all together. In times of quarantine and isolation, when we may not be able to enjoy the consolation of Jesus in Holy Communion, we can experience the Lord's presence in the Bible, which may have gone missing in our lives. If that is the case, you can invoke Saint Anthony for a return of your lost Bible!

TODAY'S READINGS: *1 Kings 19:19-21; Matthew 5:33-37 (364).* "Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.'"

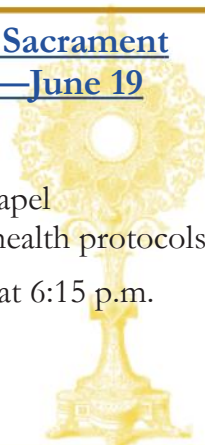

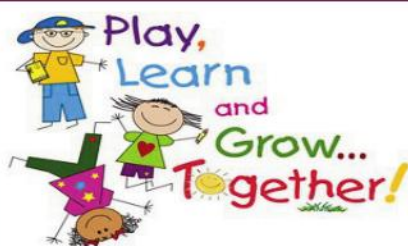

SAINT OF THE MONTH

St. Ulma Family



Wiktor and Jozef Ulma and their six children lived in Markowa, a village in southeastern Poland. The village was occupied by about 4500 Poles and 120 Jews. However, the outbreak of World War II disrupted their lives. In September of 1939, Nazi Germany and the Soviet Union invaded Poland. The Jews were separated from the Polish population and isolated in ghettos. The German authorities warned the Jews of execution to those who fled and to those who assisted them. Among the Poles who heroically acted and risked their lives in hiding the Jews, were the Ulma Family. They willingly acted like the Good Samaritan from Jesus' parable. And to this day their inspiring story is bringing Christians and Jews closer together.

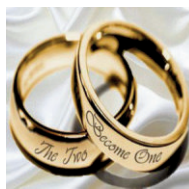

COLUMNA DEL PÁRROCO



Queridos hermanos:

El Padre Justin y yo hemos alcanzado otro hito/marca en nuestras vidas. El pasado lunes 1 de junio celebró su primer aniversario como sacerdote. Realmente ha sido una bendición como vicario parroquial y como el último compañero de casa en la rectoría. Su sentido del humor es un verdadero regalo, especialmente porque hemos tenido que hacer ajustes durante este tiempo de pandemia. Es un sacerdote joven dedicado y dispuesto a hacer un esfuerzo adicional al servicio del pueblo de Dios. Las palabras pronunciadas en su ordenación, "que Dios cumpla la buena obra que ha comenzado en ti" se ven en nuestro alrededor. ¡Con las ordenaciones de ayer (06-06-20), el Padre Justin ya no es un bebé sacerdote! ¡Feliz 1er Aniversario, Padre Justin!

Para mí, el 1 de junio marcó el 14º aniversario de mi vida sacerdotal aquí en San Ignacio de Loyola. En muchos sentidos, parece como que llegué ayer, pero literalmente ha corrido mucha agua bajo el puente desde entonces. ¡A través de los años hemos soportado, conquistado y sobrevivido muchos desastres naturales y una gran campaña capital! Veamos, hubo el huracán Ike en septiembre del 2008 y 15 días sin electricidad en el campus o en la rectoría. Nos unimos y con la ayuda de muchos feligreses asistimos a aquellos que necesitaban hielo, agua, alimentos y suministros. También batimos todos los récords anteriores para el Festival de Otoño con solo dos semanas para hacer los preparativos finales. Una vez más, todos se unieron y, por primera vez en la historia de SILCC, ¡el Festival de Otoño alcanzo más de \$100,000! Luego vino la sequía del 2010. Nuestra factura de agua aumentó a \$1500 por mes por un tiempo. Los automóviles en el estacionamiento estaban cubiertos de hollín y copos de cenizas por los incendios alrededor de Magnolia. Perdimos algunos árboles, pero, nuevamente, lo sobrepasamos. También hubo fuertes lluvias e inundaciones que llenaron nuestros estacionamientos de agua. Un par de veces la línea de agua del "Lago Loyola" alcanzó los escalones superiores del antiguo edificio de oficinas (ahora Centro de Espiritualidad Faber). Iniciamos una importante campaña de recaudación de fondos para construir el tan esperado centro educativo. Recuerden, el deseo de la comunidad era construir esto, pero en el último minuto los planes cambiaron y la iglesia fue construida en su lugar. Como dije en ese momento, las principales campañas de recaudación de fondos causan división y disturbios en la comunidad y el proyecto del Centro Gonzaga no fue diferente. Tuvimos personas que abandonaron la comunidad porque no vieron la visión y no querían formar parte de ella. Organizamos recepciones y "espectáculos especiales" para explicar el razonamiento y la necesidad del edificio y para que el dinero comenzase a recaudarse. Comenzamos el 4 de mayo de 2014 y aproximadamente un año después el Obispo Sheltz vino para ofrecer la bendición y la dedicación. La parroquia había logrado la larga espera de la construcción del campus. Ahora todo lo que teníamos que hacer era conquistar el débito. Pero no tardó mucho, y otro gran evento nos golpeó. El 25 de agosto de 2017, el huracán Harvey visitó el área metropolitana de Houston. Durante la noche del 27 al 28 de agosto, Harvey inundó todo el campus de nuestra parroquia. Perdimos el uso de todos nuestros edificios; algunos tomaron hasta 5 pies de agua, ¡y más! Todo lo que nos quedaba era el segundo piso del edificio Gonzaga para usar como oficinas y almacenamiento. (Supongo que la necesidad del Centro Gonzaga era mayor de lo que imaginamos.) Los feligreses se unieron al grito de batalla, "Somos la Iglesia" y se ayudaron mutuamente a secar casas, proporcionar comida y refugio y se unieron a nosotros para las Misa en Klein High, Kleb Middle School, Sexton Hall y finalmente la gran carpa blanca. Cuando celebramos el Adviento en esa carpa/toldo nos sentimos como si hubiéramos vuelto a casa. El seguro de la Arquidiócesis nos ayudó en la reconstrucción de \$4.75M de nuestro campus. Extraños de todo el mundo enviaron donaciones para ayudarnos a reconstruir nuestro campus. Luego, el 31 de mayo de 2018, el cardenal DiNardo dedicó la iglesia una vez más al honor y la gloria de Dios. El resto del campus fue inaugurado el primero de agosto. Habíamos llegado a casa en un año. Dios nos acompañó a través de las aguas hacia el otro lado y a una nueva vida. Una vez más, pensé que ahora podíamos respirar, disfrutar y reconstruir nuestra comunidad después de haber reconstruido el campus. Pero, COVID-19 / el Coronavirus, cambió nuestro curso una vez más. Cerramos todo a mediados de marzo del 2020 y comenzamos el nuevo ministerio de transmisión en vivo de nuestras Misas y tiempos de oración a través de Facebook. Recorrimos juntos el viaje de la Cuaresma, el Triduo Pascual y la Pascua en lugares remotos reunidos a través del Internet, computadoras portátiles, computadoras y teléfonos inteligentes. Nuestra comunidad se ha mantenido fuerte durante toda la pandemia y seguimos abriendo en fases descritas por el Gobierno del Estado y la Arquidiócesis. Todavía estamos en esta parte del viaje juntos y sé que lo lograremos porque Dios está con nosotros. Ser un peregrino se ha convertido en parte de nuestra identidad en estos 14 años. A través de todos estos eventos, Dios nos ha mostrado cómo vivir como Personas Para los Demás. Estoy agradecido por estas experiencias y recuerdos porque me han mostrado el rostro de Dios en medio de desastres naturales y grandes proyectos. Si nuestras vidas están dedicadas a Él, llegaremos al otro lado de manera segura, sin daño.
