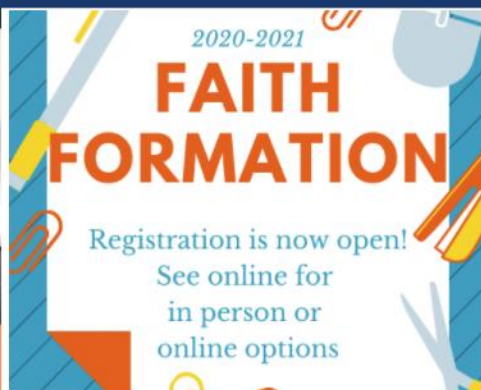

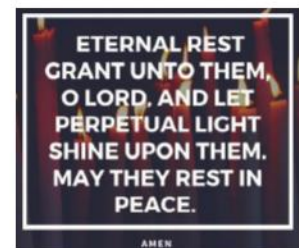

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As things around us continue to progress with the Coronavirus, we see the numbers of those testing positive rise along with the number of deaths. Here, in Harris County, it seems that while numbers are stabilizing, they are not “flat lining”. We are now celebrating funerals for parishioners who have died of COVID-19. It’s devastating to their families and to our parish community. It breaks my heart to receive a message from a parishioner begging for prayer for a loved one who is suffering the effects of the virus. Most of our parishioners that have been diagnosed with COVID-19 have gone through all of the symptoms and eventually test negative. But medical researchers tell us they do not know the long-term effects of the virus since it is still relatively new. We are continually being told to be cautious, to wash/sanitize our hands, to wear masks, and to physically distance ourselves from those who do not live in our household. But we also see and hear the opposite: masks aren’t necessary, the virus is a hoax and will simply vanish, etc. We live in a state of confusion. We have seen the plans and hopes of many crushed over these months: jobs lost, graduations and proms canceled, vacation plans canceled, racial unrest, protests, etc. Here in the parish we have postponed two major pilgrimages. The choir pilgrimage has moved to June of 2021; the pilgrimage to the Holy Land has moved to February of 2021; and the pilgrimage to Oberammergau and the Passion Play has been moved to September of 2022. We seem to live our lives in stages of planning and options: option A, B or cancel. Our lives are being lived like flotsam on the sea of life, riding out the ebb and flow of the day, week, and month.

So, where can we take harbor? Where can we place our lives in what is solid ground? I’m told by some parishioners that they long for getting back to “normal”. Their search takes them to many places to simulate the “normal” of their lives. People are telling me they are venturing out now, coming to accept the virus as a part of their life. People are traveling again (often in their vehicles rather than public transportation). They are going to the beach, to the mall, shopping, to the grocery store, big box stores, etc. But many are also choosing not to come back to Church. The livestream has become, for many, an easy way to touch base with God and have come to believe that “Livestream Jesus is good enough” and the “Prayer for Spiritual Communion” equates with the reception of Holy Communion. While the obligation to attend Mass has been suspended, our need to be fed with the Bread of Life is still there. I’m not obligated to eat every day, but if I don’t, my body will become weakened and anemic. If that happens physically, what do you think is happening spiritually?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: ¶1324 *The Eucharist is “the source and summit of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch.”* ¶1325 *“The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination both of God’s action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship men offer to Christ and through him to the Father in the Holy Spirit.”* ¶1326 *Finally, by the Eucharistic celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all.* ¶1327 *In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith: “Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking.”*

When I was a teenager (back in the post-covered wagon days), my dad used to say to me that if I can go out and spend time with my friends late into Saturday night, then I can spend time with God on Sundays. So, in the spirit of my father: if one can go to the beach, the grocery store, the big box store, or drive to another state, then that one can physically come to church on Sunday and participate in the Holy Eucharist. It’s time to be honest with ourselves and to examine one’s conscious. Have I allowed the pandemic to physically distance myself from God while I rub elbows with others in the marketplace? Am I complaining and campaigning for my children to go back to on campus schooling but haven’t attended Mass in person since March? Friends, it’s time for us to be honest with ourselves. We cannot grow as the Body of Christ without physically receiving this Bread come down from heaven. *We become what we receive.* We are transformed into Jesus Christ – one with Him and with all who are one in his body, which is the Church. Come home and be who you are called to be.

**Sunday, Aug 09, 2020**

### **NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

#### **Ghosts of the past, spirit of the present**

Nagasaki was the second and last city to date to endure attack by atomic weapon. In the instant after the bomb's release, 35,000 people were killed, mostly factory workers. Those factories, which supported the Japanese war effort, were the targets of the attack. It all made sense in a war room at the time. After the mushroom cloud clears, however, we have to reckon with the ghosts of our choices. The animated drama, *In This Corner of the World*, offers a moving reflection on the personal cost of these attacks on ordinary Japanese citizens. Pray for all victims of war, and for lasting world peace.

TODAY'S READINGS: *1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a; Romans 9:1-5; Matthew 14:22-33 (115). "The disciples saw him walking on the sea. . . . 'It is a ghost,' they said, and they cried out in fear."*

**Monday, Aug 10, 2020**

### **FEAST OF LAWRENCE, DEACON, MARTYR**

#### **Be inspired by the martyrs among us**

Lawrence, a Roman deacon who was martyred in 258, is one of the most venerated of saints, and there are many legends about his gruesome death, which prompted widespread conversions to Christianity in his city. Most Christians aren't called to such spectacular sacrifice, but there are other types of martyrs—ordinary folks in every generation who face adversity with total commitment to God and sow the seeds of faith all around them. They are martyrs at the hands of disease, hatred, bigotry, selfishness, and cruelty. They fight the good fight and leave us all the better for it. Pray for that level of faith and perseverance.

TODAY'S READINGS: *2 Corinthians 9:6-10; John 12:24-26 (618). "Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life."*

**Tuesday, Aug 11, 2020**

### **MEMORIAL OF CLARE, VIRGIN**

#### **We are what we love**

Those who enter consecrated life in the Catholic Church make at least three vows—of poverty, chastity, and obedience. Known as the Evangelical Counsels, the vows are meant to shield disciples from greed, lust, and pride. For most religious orders, poverty is simply a commitment to shared (rather than individual) ownership. But Clare of Assisi, among the first followers of Saint Francis and the first woman known to write a set of monastic guidelines, made sure her order of Poor Clares owned nothing at all. "We become what we love," she wrote. "If we love things, we become a thing." In honor of Clare, take some time to examine what you love and what you own to see whether anything is hampering your spiritual life.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Ezekiel 2:8-3:4; Matthew 18:1-5, 10, 12-14 (414). "Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest."*

**Wednesday, Aug 12, 2020**

#### **Get engaged**

One of the seven themes of Catholic social teaching—Call to Family, Community, and Participation—asserts that we have a right and a responsibility to participate in society and to seek the common good, taking special care of the poor and vulnerable. Since 1999, the United Nations has set aside August 12 as International Youth Day to celebrate and enhance the global efforts of youth to build a better world. This year's theme is "Youth Engagement for Global Action," and we've certainly seen

evidence of that in recent street protests. What are you doing to engage youth? Offer young people you know a call to action—or better yet—respond to the call they offer you.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Ezekiel 9:1-7; 10:18-22; Matthew 18:15-20 (415). "Where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in their midst."*

**Thursday, Aug 13, 2020**

### **MEMORIAL OF PONTIAN, POPE, AND HIPPOLYTUS, PRIEST, MARTYRS**

#### **Bring them out of exile**

Today's saints—Pontian and Hippolytus—endured exile together. They were forced by third-century Roman emperor Maximinus to work in the mines of the island of Sardinia and eventually perished there. Formerly, they had been a pope (Pontian) and theologian (Hippolytus). The church advocates at many levels for migrants who have been exiled from their homeland by war, poverty, or persecution. In homage to exiles across the centuries, consider taking a step today to aid migrants in your region of the world.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Ezekiel 12:1-12; Matthew 18:21—19:1 (416). "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, 'I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times.'"*

**Friday, Aug 14, 2020**

### **MEMORIAL OF MAXIMILIAN KOLBE, PRIEST, MARTYR**

#### **Witness to the world**

Many young Catholics may have had the opportunity to read the comic book "Soldier of God," about the life of Saint Maximilian Kolbe, who was killed in the Auschwitz concentration camp. It begins: "This is a true story of a real flesh-and-blood hero of God." Young readers were captivated, and most could not forget the images of Maximilian volunteering to take the place of a man who was selected to be killed. "Would I do that?" is an instinctive question when faced with such powerful witness. Not all are called to martyrdom, but each Christian commits to being an example of God's deep love and care for people, especially the most vulnerable. "How can I be God's witness?" is a good question to ask yourself each day.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Ezekiel 16:1-15, 60, 63 or 16:59-63; Matthew 19:3-12 (417). "Live in your blood and grow like a plant in the field."*

**Saturday, Aug 15, 2020**

### **SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY**

#### **Hidden glory revealed**

Mary, now united totally with her son, with whom she suffered excruciating ordeals, shows us how suffering transforms to glory. She gathers all her human children close in this season of harvest, her bounteous fruits and flowers. Today's gospel shows Elizabeth affirming in Mary a vigor and holiness, mirroring God's, that she herself might not have recognized. This feast points to the same glory in each of us, perhaps hard to believe, but still hidden, vital, intact.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Day: Revelation 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab; 1 Corinthians 15:20-27; Luke 1:39-56 (622). "My spirit rejoices in God my Savior."*

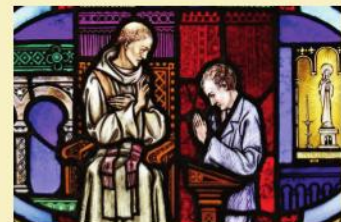

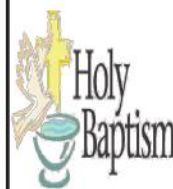

Queridos hermanos:

A medida que las cosas a nuestro alrededor continúan progresando con el Coronavirus, vemos que aumenta el número de aquellos que salen positivos, así como también con el número de muertes. Aquí, en el condado de Harris, parece que, si bien los números se están estabilizando, no son "planos". Ahora estamos celebrando funerales para feligreses que han muerto de COVID-19. Es devastador para sus familias y para nuestra comunidad parroquial. Me rompe el corazón recibir un mensaje de un feligrés pidiendo oración por un ser querido que sufre los efectos del virus. La mayoría de nuestros feligreses que han sido diagnosticados con COVID-19 han pasado por todos los síntomas y finalmente han resultado negativos. Pero los investigadores médicos nos dicen que no conocen los efectos a largo plazo del virus, ya que todavía es relativamente nuevo. Continuamente se nos dice que seamos cautelosos, que nos lavemos / desinfectemos las manos, que usemos mascarillas y que nos alejemos físicamente de aquellos que no viven en nuestro hogar. Pero también vemos y escuchamos lo contrario: las mascarillas no son necesarias, el virus es un engaño y simplemente desaparecerá, etc. Vivimos en un estado de confusión. Hemos visto como los planes y las esperanzas de muchos han sido destruidos durante estos meses: trabajos perdidos, cancelaciones de graduaciones, planes de vacaciones canceladas, disturbios raciales, protestas, etc. Aquí en la parroquia hemos pospuesto dos peregrinaciones importantes. La peregrinación del coro se trasladó a junio del 2021; la peregrinación a Tierra Santa se trasladó a febrero del 2021; y la peregrinación a Oberammergau y la "Passion Play" se trasladaron a septiembre del 2022. Parece que vivimos nuestras vidas en etapas de planificaciones y opciones: opción A, B o cancelar, así como las olas del mar que van y vienen y cambian de día a día, semana a semana, mes a mes.

Entonces, ¿dónde podemos tomar refugio? ¿Dónde podemos colocar nuestras vidas en lo que es tierra firme? Algunos feligreses me han dicho que anhelan volver a la "normalidad". Su búsqueda los lleva a muchos lugares para aparentar lo "normal" de sus vidas. La gente me dice que ahora se están aventurando, llegando a aceptar el virus como parte de su vida. Las personas viajan nuevamente (a menudo en sus vehículos en lugar de en transporte público). Van a la playa, al centro comercial, a ir de compras, a los supermercados, a las tiendas, etc. Pero muchos también eligen no volver a la Iglesia. La transmisión en vivo se ha convertido, para muchos, en una forma fácil de establecer contacto con Dios y han llegado a creer que "La transmisión en vivo de Jesús es lo suficientemente buena" y la "Oración por la comunión espiritual" equivale a la recepción de la Sagrada Comunión. Si bien la obligación de asistir a misa ha sido suspendida, nuestra necesidad de alimentarnos con el Pan de Vida todavía está allí. No estoy obligado a comer todos los días, pero si no lo hago, mi cuerpo se debilitará y se volverá anémico. Si eso sucede físicamente, ¿qué creen que está sucediendo espiritualmente?

El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica afirma que: ¶1324 *La Eucaristía es "fuente y culmen de toda la vida cristiana" (LG 11). "Los demás sacramentos, como también todos los ministerios eclesiales y las obras de apostolado, están unidos a la Eucaristía y a ella se ordenan. La sagrada Eucaristía, en efecto, contiene todo el bien espiritual de la Iglesia, es decir, Cristo mismo, nuestra Pascua". ¶1325 "La comunión de vida divina y la unidad del Pueblo de Dios, sobre los que la propia Iglesia subsiste, se significan adecuadamente y se realizan de manera admirable en la Eucaristía. En ella se encuentra a la vez la cumbre de la acción por la que, en Cristo, Dios santifica al mundo, y del culto que en el Espíritu Santo los hombres dan a Cristo y por él al Padre". ¶1326 Finalmente, por la celebración eucarística nos unimos ya a la liturgia del cielo y anticipamos la vida eterna cuando Dios será todo en todos. ¶1327 En resumen, la Eucaristía es el compendio y la suma de nuestra fe: "Nuestra manera de pensar armoniza con la Eucaristía, y a su vez la Eucaristía confirma nuestra manera de pensar"*

Cuando era un adolescente (en los días de vagones cubierto), mi papá solía decirme que, si podía salir y pasar tiempo con mis amigos hasta el sábado por la noche, yo podía pasar tiempo con Dios los domingos. Entonces, en el espíritu de mi padre: si uno puede ir a la playa, al supermercado, a las tiendas, o conducir a otro estado, entonces uno puede ir físicamente a la iglesia el domingo y participar en la Sagrada Eucaristía. Es hora de ser honestos con nosotros mismos y examinar nuestra conciencia. ¿He permitido que la pandemia me distancie físicamente de Dios mientras me encuentro con otros en el mercado? ¿Me estoy quejando y haciendo campaña para que mis hijos vuelvan a la escuela en el campus, pero no he asistido a Misa en persona desde marzo? Amigos, es hora de que seamos honestos con nosotros mismos. No podemos crecer como el Cuerpo de Cristo sin recibir físicamente este Pan que desciende del cielo. Nos convertimos en lo que recibimos. Somos transformados en Jesucristo, uno con Él y con todos los que somos uno en su cuerpo, que es la Iglesia. Ven a casa y sé quién eres llamado a ser.
