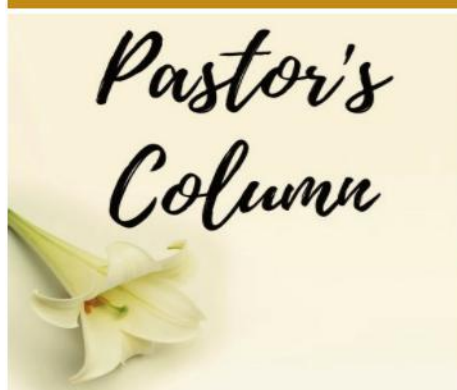

IGNITE CAMPAIGN

IGNITE: "Our Faith, Our Mission," the capital campaign for the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston, was relaunched in Fall 2018 and includes two new case elements: An ongoing Disaster Recovery Fund in order to prepare for future disaster assistance (\$20 million) and a fund for Rebuilding our Parishes and Schools in Light of Harvey (\$20 million). The \$150 million goal of the campaign will remain unchanged. The three original case elements will remain as those needs are still present, but have been reduced in order to accommodate the new

realities of the Archdiocese:

- St. Mary's Seminary (\$30 million)
- Catholic Education (\$20 million)
- Faith Formation (\$10 million)

The parish share of the campaign remains \$50 million. Our parish goal is \$1,880,235.36 of which \$620,477.67 will be returned to St. Ignatius of Loyola, which is 33% of the funds raise. If we surpass the goal then 67% of the funds will stay in the parish for our use. We are dedicating all returns to the debt reduction on the Gonzaga Center.

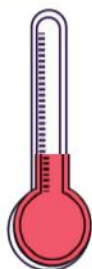

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On Friday, April 16th, I celebrated my 39th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood of Jesus Christ. The first Mass I ever celebrated as a priest was the Vigil Mass for the celebration of Divine Mercy. I want to thank our ACTS community for working with the Worship Department to bring about such a great celebration to honor Divine Mercy. Throughout these 39 years as a priest, I have witnessed over and over again the Divine Mercy that God offers to us, sinners. Just the fact that God does not count our deeds against us, but offers mercy in place of retribution or judgment, is simply amazing. God uses a variety of ways to show us His mercy and God uses numerous ways (including people) to offer us His mercy. Primarily through the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist, God takes who we are as broken vessels and renews us, makes us whole and then offers us as instruments of His mercy to others. We hear in the Scriptures that unless you become like a little child you shall not enter the Kingdom of God. This past week I reflected on this statement in context of Divine Mercy. Imagine, if you will, how many times a parent forgives a child. A parent's love overwhelms the wrong and the discipline or correction made is to help the child grow in maturity. When a child ventures out to the use of illegal drugs, drinking, and/or sexual promiscuity, the parent does everything possible to bring the child back around. Sometimes, for the good of the child, this may include severe tactics that even cause more heartache for the parent. But the parent acts out of a tremendous love for the child. Similarly, our God shows such love for us...and even more. When we, His children, venture out away from the realm of His loving gaze, God searches us out to set us back on the right course. His overwhelming love causes us to turn back, look into the depth of our soul and find Him waiting on us. He may correct us in some way, but the discipline or correction is never a punishment, but a course of action to assist us in our spiritual maturation.

Today is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, which traditionally coincides with "Good Shepherd Sunday," the Fourth Sunday of Easter. The purpose of World Day of Prayer for Vocations is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, it affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries (priesthood and diaconate), consecrated life in all its forms (male and female religious life, societies of apostolic life, consecrated virginity), secular institutes in their diversity of services and membership, and to the missionary life.

In his 2019 annual address on the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, Pope Francis said: *The Lord's call is not an intrusion of God in our freedom; it is not a "cage" or a burden to be borne. On the contrary, it is the loving initiative whereby God encounters us and invites us to be part of a great undertaking. He opens before our eyes the horizon of a greater sea and an abundant catch. God in fact desires that our lives not become banal and predictable, imprisoned by daily routine, or unresponsive before decisions that could give it meaning. The Lord does not want us to live from day to day, thinking that nothing is worth fighting for, slowly losing our desire to set out on new and exciting paths. If at times he makes us experience a "miraculous catch", it is because he wants us to discover that each of us is called – in a variety of ways – to something grand, and that our lives should not grow entangled in the nets of an ennui that dulls the heart. Every vocation is a summons not to stand on the shore, nets in hand, but to follow Jesus on the path he has marked out for us, for our own happiness and for the good of those around us.... In encountering the Lord, some may feel the attraction of a call to the consecrated life or to the ordained priesthood. It is a discovery that can excite and at the same time frighten us, since we feel called to become "fishers of men" in the barque of the Church by giving totally of ourselves in commitment to faithful service of the Gospel and our brothers and sisters. Such a decision carries the risk of leaving everything behind to follow the Lord, to devote ourselves completely to him, and to share in his work. Many kinds of interior resistance can stand in the way of making this decision, especially in highly secularized contexts where there no longer seems to be a place for God and for the Gospel. Places where it is easy to grow discouraged and fall into the "weariness of hope." And yet, there can be no greater joy than to risk one's life for the Lord! I would like to say this especially to you, the young. Do not be deaf to the Lord's call. If he calls you to follow this path, do not pull your oars into the boat, but trust him. Do not yield to fear, which paralyzes us before the great heights to which the Lord points us. Always remember that to those who leave their nets and boat behind, and follow him, the Lord promises the joy of a new life that can fill our hearts and enliven our journey.*

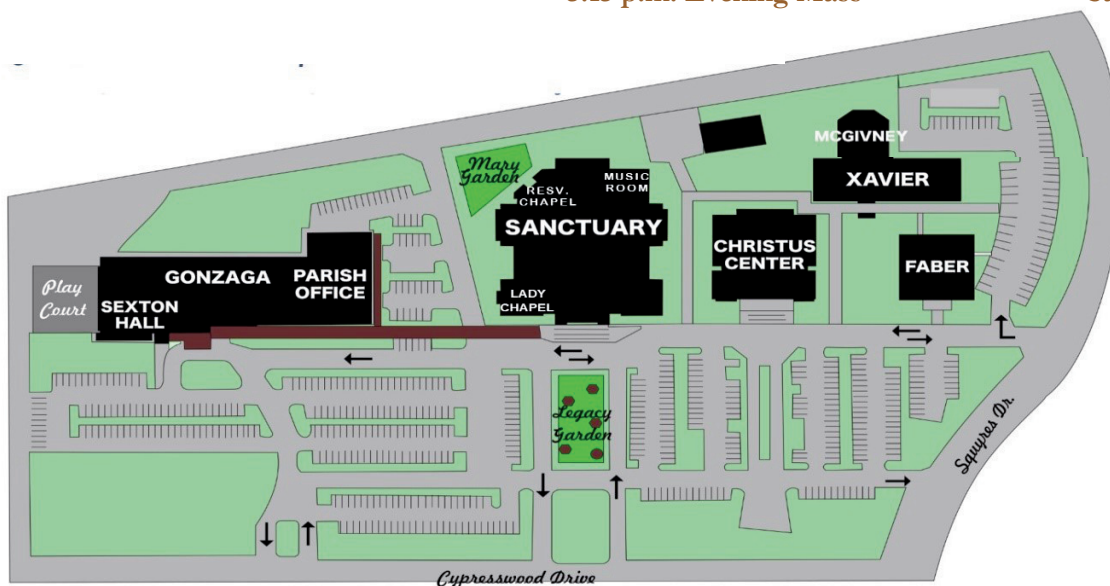

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER; GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY

Live with purpose

Collecting a paycheck may be important to make a living, but will it alone make a life? Some Catholics hear the invitation to choose a different path. They're nudged by family members, religion teachers, and homilists. They have opportunities to learn about priesthood and apostolic life, about missions and monasteries and cloisters. They'll encounter members of Third Orders and engage in service projects that put them in touch with those consecrated to spreading the Good News. On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations, let's be sure to issue the invitation—and to receive it.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 4:8-12; 1 John 3:1-2; John 10:11-18 (50). "No one takes [my life] from me, but I lay it down on my own."*

Nothing need limit your devotion

The life of Saint Rafael Arnáiz Barón was interrupted by illness. Having endured a pandemic, we know what that's like—we've seen lives cut short by disease and we ourselves have had to put some of our own living on hold. Rafael was born in Spain in 1911 and died at 27. He was a talented artist and studied architecture, then decided to become a Trappist. Severe complications from diabetes prevented him from taking vows as a monk. He accepted God's will, joined as an oblate instead, and died young of his illness. In him you can find an example of surrender, trust, and devotion in the face of loss and disappointment that makes him a model for our times a century later.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 11:1-18; John 10:1-10 (279). "Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture."*

Plant the seeds of belief

The Syrian city of Antioch played a pivotal role in the growth of the early church. A cross-cultural safe haven, it was here that many of Jesus' first followers—all of them Jewish—took refuge after Stephen was martyred, fleeing Jerusalem as they too became targets. Antioch was a cosmopolitan hothouse, its Jews enjoying friendly interactions with the city's many Gentiles. Once new Jews arrived, bearing witness to Jesus, local Gentiles couldn't help but be intrigued. Soon, the fledgling church of Antioch began evangelizing Gentiles intentionally, planting the seed of belief in unexpected places. Where might you plant such seeds?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 11:19-26; John 10:22-30 (280). "It was in Antioch that the disciples were first called Christians."*

MEMORIAL OF PETER CHANEL, PRIEST, RELIGIOUS, MISSIONARY, MARTYR

Let your life bring light to others

There is good reason that Peter Chanel (1803-41) is the patron saint of Oceania. A parish priest from France who later joined the Marist missionaries, Peter was missioned to Western

Oceania to convert people who worshipped other gods. Peter's missionary method was low key: He learned the language of the people and cared for their sick. For a few years, all was fine until small groups of native people began to be baptized, in particular, the son and daughter of the island king. Peter was then considered a threat to the island's power elite. On this day in 1841 he was murdered. That is not the end of Peter's story, however. Within two years of his death, the entire island had become Catholic. How do you bring the light of faith to people around you?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 12:24—13:5a; John 12:44-50 (281). "I came into the world as light, so that everyone who believes in me might not remain in darkness."*

MEMORIAL OF CATHERINE OF SIENA, VIRGIN, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Not how long a life is, but how good

Saint Catherine of Siena led a remarkable life for a person of any era but particularly for a woman of the 14th century who only lived 33 years. Mystic, nurse, Dominican, counselor, arbitrator, writer, ambassador—she was all these things. Ordinary people came to her for spiritual council and advice in conflicts, leading her to eventually settle fierce church disputes, becoming a confidante of popes. Central to her strength was her union with Christ, which she wrote about in the classic, *The Dialogue*. Find a quiet moment today to—like Catherine—commune with Jesus, who offers wisdom and strength to all.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 13:13-25; John 13:16-20 (282). "Whoever receives the one I send receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me."*

Try a little tenderness

When God became flesh and dwelt among us, a revolution was started. Not a military coup that some people expected, but a revolution that would strike deep at the heart. This "revolution of tenderness," as Pope Francis called it in *Evangelii Gaudium*, urges each and every one of us to give of ourselves, to be part of community, to serve, and to be reconciled in our relationships with others. In what ways can you respond to Jesus' call to a revolution of tenderness?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Acts 13:26-33; John 14:1-6 (283).*

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me."

MEMORIAL OF JOSEPH THE WORKER

Wanting for a job

Today's memorial honors Saint Joseph the carpenter, standing in solidarity with all working people on the traditional "May Day" dedicated to laborers around the world. At this time last year, more than 30 million Americans had lost their jobs due to the pandemic, the largest unemployment crisis in the country's history. Many of those jobs have not returned and likely are gone forever. What can you and your faith community do to support those whose livelihoods were lost to the virus?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Genesis 1:26—2:3 or Colossians 3:14-15, 17, 23-24; Matthew 13:54-58 (559); Acts 13:44-52; John 14:7-14 (284). "If you ask anything of me in my name, I will do it."*

EASTER TIME

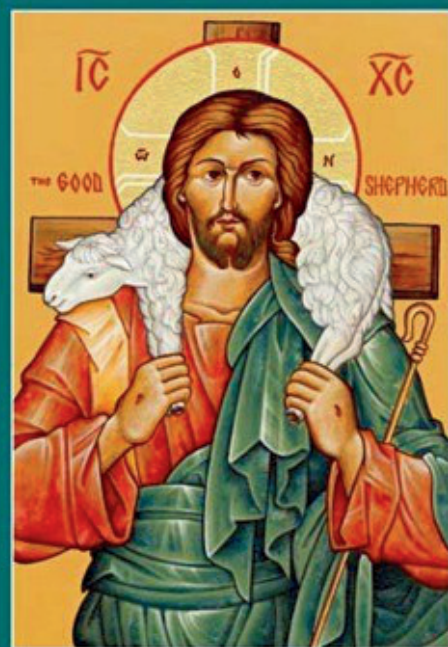
The joy of the Easter season is still with us on this Third Sunday of Easter as we rejoice in the risen Christ. He is the promise fulfilled, truly present to us in this time of trial as we continue to look for an end to the COVID 19 pandemic. We open our hearts to Him as we pray trusting in his saving mercy. This sacred season of 50 days concludes with Pentecost Sunday, when we commemorate the gift of the Holy Spirit to the apostles, the beginning of the Church, and the start of its mission to all tongues, peoples and nations.

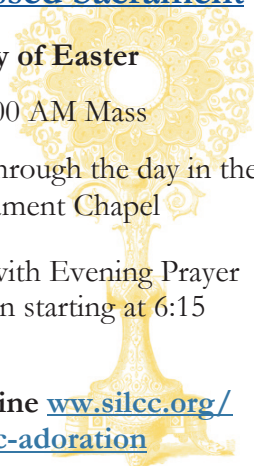



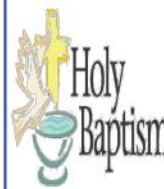

"I CAN'T SERVE GOD AND MONEY"

SILICON VALLEY BUSINESSWOMAN ENTERS CONVENT

As a Deloitte executive and founder of a successful internet startup called Jetlore, 36-year-old businesswoman Montse Medina didn't seem like an obvious candidate for the convent. Earlier this year, though, she dropped a bomb via Twitter and LinkedIn: she was giving up everything to become a contemplative Catholic nun.

As she wrote in her epic "break up letter" with the business world, the pursuit of money and prestige had left her empty. She was finally going to pursue a call to religious life that she had felt since she was young. After carefully studying various orders online, and visiting a specific community many times, Montse finally chose the Monastery of Santa Ana in Spain.

Interestingly, her genius for online marketing may not be lost in her new vocation. The nuns support themselves by making homemade pasta, pies, and pastries—then selling them via an online store.

Montse Medina is an online entrepreneur who recently became a nun.

GROW A GARDEN AT HOME

Happiness is doing the will of God! And because you desire your children's happiness, it's vital to help them discover and accept their vocations. Here's a simple "growing guide" to help your family bear fruit:

Prepare the soil: Call a special family meeting about your priorities. Pray, "Lord Jesus, we consecrate our family and our futures to you."

Plant the seed: Say, "I would be proud of you if God called you to be a priest/sister/brother and you said yes."

Water the garden: Infuse faith into your environment. Pray as a family; get involved in youth group; invite priests and sisters to dinner.

Campus Conversion

Brother Ray Morris grew up on the Jersey Shore as a "cultural Catholic" whose family rarely went to Mass. By the time he entered Rutgers University, the Catholic faith was the furthest thing from his mind. To make some extra money, he took an office job answering phones, which just happened to be at the university's Catholic Center. "It was there I met the Brothers and everything changed," he said.

His job opened the door for Ray to give going to Mass another try. "Ten years later, I'm still here!" he jokes, then adds with sincerity, "After I encountered Jesus, the fruits of the Spirit—love, joy, and peace—quickly began to appear in my life."

Brother Ray entered the novitiate for the Brotherhood of Hope in 2014 and made his final vows in January 2021. Now it's official: his life's work is reaching out to students not unlike himself.

"I believe that colleges are the key battleground for the hearts and minds of the young in our Church," Brother Ray said. "Our method is to start by fostering real relationships with students. So basically, I walk around campus playing sports and sharing meals with students, building relationships and (hopefully) leading them closer to God. It's a mission that is fun at times and disheartening at others, but always worthwhile. It's a genuine gift to serve God and His Church in this way!"



Brother Ray belongs to the Brotherhood of Hope, a relatively new religious community whose main focus is evangelization on college campuses. They "go deep" with students, working one-on-one and in groups to help young people encounter Jesus, leave sin behind, and develop habits of virtue and daily prayer.

Queridos hermanos:

El viernes 16 de abril celebré el 39 aniversario de mi ordenación al sacerdocio de Jesucristo. La primera Misa que celebré como sacerdote fue la Misa de vigilia para la celebración de la Divina Misericordia. Quiero agradecer a nuestra comunidad ACTS por trabajar con el Departamento de Liturgia para lograr una gran celebración en honor a la Divina Misericordia. A lo largo de estos 39 años como sacerdote, he sido testigo una y otra vez de la Divina Misericordia que Dios nos ofrece a los pecadores. El solo hecho de que Dios no considere nuestras obras en nuestra contra, sino que ofrezca misericordia en lugar de retribución o juicio, es simplemente asombroso. Dios usa una variedad de formas para mostrarnos Su misericordia y Dios usa numerosas formas (incluidas las personas) para ofrecernos Su misericordia. Principalmente a través de los sacramentos de la Reconciliación y la Eucaristía. Dios toma quienes somos como vasos rotos y nos renueva, nos hace completos y luego nos ofrece como instrumentos de su misericordia a los demás. Escuchamos en las Escrituras que a menos que te conviertas en un niño pequeño, no entrarás en el Reino de Dios. La semana pasada reflexioné sobre esta declaración en el contexto de la Divina Misericordia. Imagínese, por así decirlo, cuántas veces un padre perdona a un hijo. El amor de un padre abruma el mal y la disciplina o corrección que se hace es para ayudar al niño a crecer en la madurez. Cuando un niño se aventura al uso de drogas ilegales, alcoholismo y / o promiscuidad sexual, los padres hacen todo lo posible para que el niño regrese. A veces, por el bien del niño, esto puede incluir tácticas severas que incluso causan más dolor a los padres. Pero el padre actúa con un tremendo amor por el niño. De manera similar, nuestro Dios muestra tanto amor por nosotros ... y aún más. Cuando nosotros, Sus hijos, nos aventuramos fuera del ámbito de Su mirada amorosa, Dios nos busca para ponernos de nuevo en el camino correcto. Su amor abrumador hace que nos volvamos, miremos en lo profundo de nuestra alma y lo encontremos esperándonos. Él puede corregirnos de alguna manera, pero la disciplina o corrección nunca es un castigo, sino un curso de acción para ayudarnos en nuestra maduración espiritual.

Hoy es la Jornada Mundial de Oración por las Vocaciones, que tradicionalmente coincide con el “Domingo del Buen Pastor”, el cuarto domingo de Pascua. El propósito de la Jornada Mundial de Oración por las Vocaciones es cumplir públicamente la instrucción del Señor de: “Ore al Señor de la mies, que envíe obreros a su mies” (Mt 9,38; Lc 10,2). Como colofón de una oración que se ofrece continuamente en toda la Iglesia, afirma la primacía de la fe y la gracia en todo lo que concierne a las vocaciones al sacerdocio y a la vida consagrada. Si bien aprecia todas las vocaciones, la Iglesia concentra su atención este día en las vocaciones a los ministerios ordenados (sacerdocio y diaconado), la vida consagrada en todas sus formas (vida religiosa masculina y femenina, sociedades de vida apostólica, virginidad consagrada), institutos seculares en su diversidad de servicios y membresía, y a la vida misionera.

En el mensaje del Santo Padre Francisco para la 56 Jornada Mundial de Oración por las Vocaciones de 2019, el dijo: *La llamada del Señor, por lo tanto, no es una intromisión de Dios en nuestra libertad; no es una “jaula” o un peso que se nos carga encima. Por el contrario, es la iniciativa amorosa con la que Dios viene a nuestro encuentro y nos invita a entrar en un gran proyecto, del que quiere que participemos, mostrándonos en el horizonte un mar más amplio y una pesca sobreabundante. El deseo de Dios es que nuestra vida no acabe siendo prisionera de lo obvio, que no se vea arrastrada por la inercia de los hábitos diarios y no quede inerte frente a esas elecciones que podrían darle sentido. El Señor no quiere que nos resignemos a vivir la jornada, pensando que, a fin de cuentas, no hay nada por lo que valga la pena comprometerse con pasión y extinguiendo la inquietud interna de buscar nuevas rutas para nuestra navegación. Si alguna vez nos hace experimentar una “pesca milagrosa”, es porque quiere que descubramos que cada uno de nosotros está llamado -de diferentes maneras- a algo grande, y que la vida no debe quedar atrapada en las redes de lo absurdo y de lo que anestesia el corazón. En definitiva, la vocación es una invitación a no quedarnos en la orilla con las redes en la mano, sino a seguir a Jesús por el camino que ha pensado para nosotros, para nuestra felicidad y para el bien de los que nos rodean. En el encuentro con el Señor, alguno puede sentir la fascinación de la llamada a la vida consagrada o al sacerdocio ordenado. Es un descubrimiento que entusiasma y al mismo tiempo asusta, cuando uno se siente llamado a convertirse en “pescadores de hombres” en la barca de la Iglesia a través de la donación total de sí mismo y empeñándose en un servicio fiel al Evangelio y a los hermanos. Esta elección implica el riesgo de dejar todo para seguir al Señor y consagrarse completamente a él, para convertirse en colaboración de su obra. Muchas resistencias interiores pueden obstaculizar una decisión semejante, así como en ciertos ambientes muy secularizados, en los que parece que ya no hay espacio para Dios y para el Evangelio, se puede caer en el desaliento y en el “cansancio de la esperanza”. Y, sin embargo, no hay mayor gozo que arriesgar la vida por el Señor. En particular a vosotros, jóvenes, me gustaría decir: No sedáis sordos a la llamada del Señor. Si el os llama por este camino no recojáis los remos en la barca y confiad en él. No os dejéis contagiar por el miedo, que nos paraliza ante las altas cumbres que el Señor nos propone. Recordad siempre que, a los que dejan las redes y la barca para seguir al Señor, él les promete la alegría de una vida nueva, que llena el corazón y anima el camino.*
