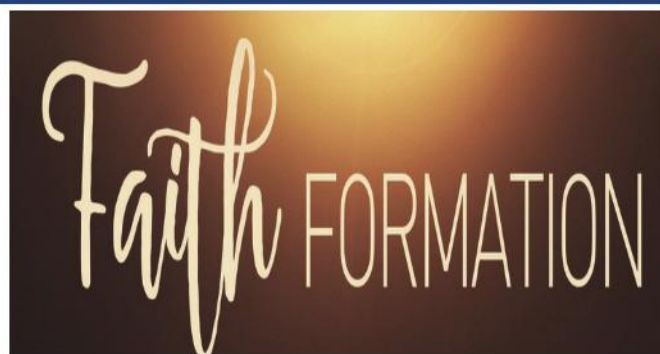

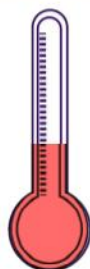

IGNITE CAMPAIGN

IGNITE: "Our Faith, Our Mission," the capital campaign for the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston, was relaunched in Fall 2018 and includes two new case elements: An ongoing Disaster Recovery Fund in order to prepare for future disaster assistance (\$20 million) and a fund for Rebuilding our Parishes and Schools in Light of Harvey (\$20 million). The \$150 million goal of the campaign will remain unchanged. The three original case elements will remain as those needs are still present, but have been reduced in order to accommodate the new realities of the Archdiocese:

- St. Mary's Seminary (\$30 million)
- Catholic Education (\$20 million)
- Faith Formation (\$10 million)

The parish share of the campaign remains \$50 million. Our parish goal is \$1,880,235.36 of which \$620,477.67 will be returned to St. Ignatius of Loyola, which is 33% of the funds raise. If we surpass the goal then 67% of the funds will stay in the parish for our use. We are dedicating all returns to the debt reduction on the Gonzaga Center.

PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Feast Day! We set aside time this weekend to celebrate our Patron Saint, St. Ignatius



Loyola. As a parish community that bears his name, it is important for us to pause and remember that St. Ignatius of Loyola is an actual person who struggled with aspects of life like us. While he didn't have the Internet to worry about or traffic jams that caused frustration, Ignatius faced his own demons as he grew into adulthood through war and sickness. We here at St. Ignatius Loyola Parish know that as Ignatius was convalescing from a wound inflicted on him in war, he ran out of reading materials (he enjoyed romance novels). During this time, he read The Life of Christ (*De Vita Christi*), by Ludolph of Saxony. This work influenced his whole life. It is a commentary on the life of Jesus Christ, a commentary on the Gospels borrowing extracts from the works of over sixty of the Fathers of the Church. Ludolph proposes to the reader that he place himself at the scene of the Gospel story; that he visualizes the crib at the Nativity, etc. This is known as a method of prayer called Simple Contemplation and is the basis of the method that St. Ignatius sets out in his *Spiritual Exercises*. The exercises of the book were designed to be carried out over a period of 28–30 days. The pedestals in our Legacy Garden are depictions of the *Spiritual Exercises*.

By 1534 he had gathered six key companions, all of whom he met as fellow students at the University of Paris—among them were Francis Xavier and Peter Faber, a Frenchman (you may recognize those two names from buildings on our campus). On the morning of the 15th of August, 1534, in the crypt of the Church of Our Lady of the Martyrs, at Montmartre, Loyola and his six companions took upon themselves the solemn vows of their lifelong work. Ignatius of Loyola was the main creator and initial Superior General of the Society of Jesus, also known as the Jesuits. They served the Pope as missionaries. Ignatius is remembered as a talented spiritual director. He was very vigorous in opposing the Protestant Reformation and promoting the following Counter-Reformation. Ignatius wrote the Jesuit Constitutions, adopted in 1540, which stressed absolute self-abnegation and obedience to Pope and superiors (*perinde ac cadaver*, “well-disciplined like a corpse” as Ignatius put it). His main principle became the Jesuit motto: *Ad maiorem Dei gloriam* (“for the greater glory of God”). He died in Rome on July 31, 1556.

Soon after his call to conversion, upon his arrival in Montserrat, St. Ignatius gave his nice clothes to a poor man, opting to wear very basic clothes instead. Much later, on the directive to “help souls,” Ignatius consistently emphasized the ministry to a world in need. Ignatius’ personal acts of social justice would continue throughout his life: when he was given unnecessary sums of money, he would distribute that money amongst the poor, and he had no qualms confronting societal social inequalities. Ignatius and his companions offered themselves as spiritual directors. Ignatius dedicated the rest of his life to following God’s will, often in the form of being a “person for others,” as a necessary aspect of living fully with God.

On July 31, 1973, the feast day of St. Ignatius, Jesuit Superior General Fr. Pedro Arrupe, S.J. coined the term **“Men and Women for Others”** in an address to the Tenth International Congress of Jesuit Alumni of Europe. This has become the foundational element of Jesuit education worldwide. The idea of “Men and Women for Others” is lived out in the life of St. Ignatius, as well as other Jesuits throughout history, and has many practical implications in contemporary life. Becoming a Person for Others requires a certain degree of humility. In one of Fr. Arrupe’s famous quotes, he says that we must “Fall in love, stay in love, and it will decide everything.” Applying this to being a Person for Others is relatively straightforward: we must fall in love with God, and as a result fall in love with helping others; and once we do, continuing to help others will come more easily. However, to truly fall in love with a person on the other side of the world whom you do not know, requires a special humility or selflessness. As a parish founded on Ignatius Spirituality by the Jesuit Fathers of the Province of New Orleans, our challenge is to be a community of such people.

Let us pray together this weekend that through the intercession of St. Ignatius we may continue the work of our patron by being *a people for others* in name and in fact. May we truly live out our mission *welcoming* all to prayerfully *celebrate* the mysteries of the liturgy, build *family* through fellowship, and *serve* Christ as a people for others.

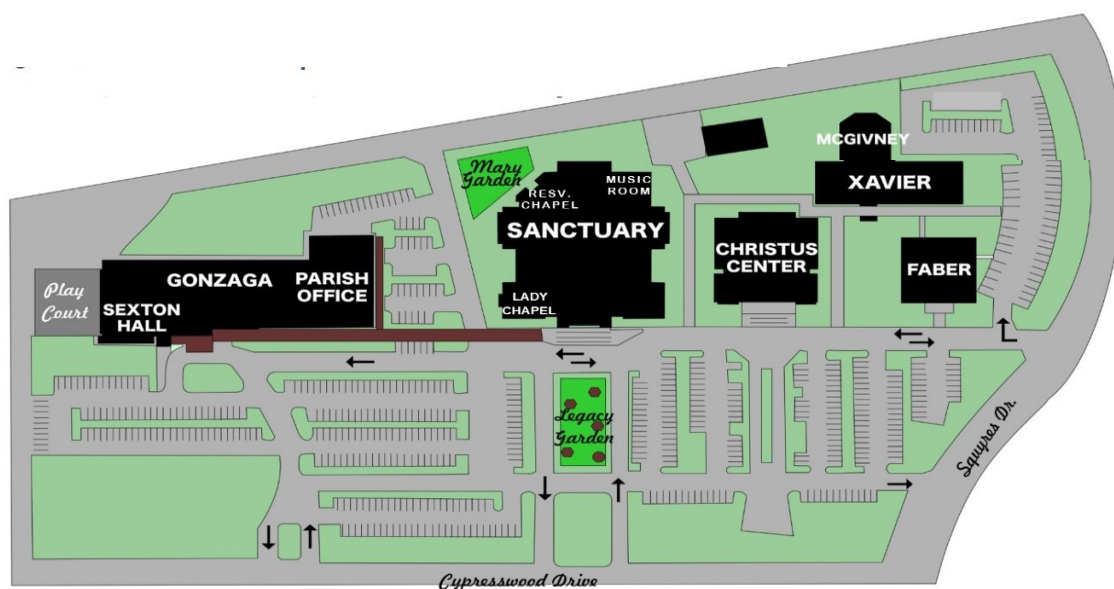

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In it to win it?

Quid pro quo sounds like a pretty good deal. "This for that": the time-honored barter in which we swap resources or labor for room and board, if not a bit more. Consumer culture initiates all of us into the pursuit of the best trade. No surprise that early followers of Jesus imagined they were swapping their attention to his teaching for free food and even better opportunities down the road. Jesus seeks friends who share his vision, not churchgoers hoping for a celestial deal. When it comes to the religion quest, what's in it for you?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15; Ephesians 4:17, 20-24; John 6:24-35 (113).* "You are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled."

MEMORIAL OF PETER JULIAN EYMARD, PRIEST

The communion of saints awaits you

Saint Peter Julian Eymard was a 19th-century French priest with a devotion to the Eucharist. He founded two religious institutes with a focus on Eucharistic Adoration: the Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament for men and the Servants of the Blessed Sacrament for women. The former prepared children for their First Communion and reached out to lapsed Catholics to bring them back to receiving Communion. He famously said, "You take Communion to become holy, not because you already are." Perhaps you spent some time away from the Eucharist because of the pandemic. No matter how long you are apart, Christ eagerly awaits your return.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Numbers 11:4b-15; Matthew 14:13-21 (407).* "He said the blessing, broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples."

We're in the same boat

The "Barque (boat) of Saint Peter" is one of the oldest symbols of the Catholic Church. Early church fathers, like Tertullian and Clement of Alexandria, compared the church to a sailing vessel. Saint Boniface wrote: "The church is like a great ship being pounded by the waves of life's different stresses. Our duty is not to abandon ship, but to keep her on her course." As Peter learned, the trick is to place our trust in Jesus. Pray for Pope Francis—successor to Peter—that he can guide the church through today's troubled waters.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Numbers 12:1-13; Matthew 14:22-36 or Matthew 15:1-2, 10-14 (408).* "Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus."

MEMORIAL OF JOHN VIANNEY, PRIEST

Ministry for the ministers

The unique lives of Catholic priests and religious sometimes give rise to stressful times and difficult transitions that need the help of a healing hand. MEMORIAL OF THE DEDICATION OF THE BASILICA OF MARY MAJOR

Legend-worthy Madonna

Legend has it that a freak snowstorm in August was a sign that urged a Christian couple to build an enormous Roman church dedicated to the Virgin: the Basilica of Mary Major, founded in the 400s. Yet this story is like many others that church historians call "legends." Our legends are not to be disdained; they usually uphold truths as interesting as the facts. In this case, the larger truth is that Mary is a key member of the communion of saints who helps us on our path to God. During this month when Mary is particularly venerated, ask for her intercession.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Numbers 20:1-13; Matthew 16:13-23 (410).* "Then, raising his hand, Moses struck the rock twice with his staff, and water gushed out in abundance for the people and their livestock to drink."

Friday, Aug 06, 2021

FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD **Shhh . . .**

"Most people do not listen with the intent to understand; they listen with the intent to reply," says leadership guru Stephen Covey. When we fail to listen, we miss the messages necessary for growth in ourselves and others. Listening builds a well of wisdom that helps the listener and the speaker get to know themselves better. "Listening is a form of spiritual hospitality," says Henri Nouwen, and Pope Francis calls listening a form of "self-sacrifice" as we put another person above ourselves and "share questions and doubts." God commanded Jesus' disciples to listen to him. We are called to do the same.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14; 2 Peter 1:16-19; Mark 9:2-10 (614).* "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him."

MEMORIAL OF SIXTUS II, POPE, AND COMPANIONS, MARTYRS

The courage to teach

Today's teachers have a tough job (which the pandemic only made more difficult). But imagine risking your life to teach about your faith. That's how it was "back in the day." In the year 258, Roman soldiers burst into the room where Sixtus was teaching, dragged him from the chair, and beheaded him in the street. Six deacons joined him in martyrdom that day. Many bishops, priests, and deacons were murdered during that persecution by the Roman Emperor Valerian. Next time you're in the pew, find Sixtus in Eucharistic Prayer I, the first one printed in your missalette. He's in the list that includes "Linus, Cletus, Clement," and other notables of the early church. When you get to the name Sixtus II, pause and remember his courageous sacrifice to pass on the faith.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Deuteronomy 6:4-13; Matthew 17:14-20 (412).* "[I]f you have faith the size of a mustard seed . . . Nothing will be impossible for you."

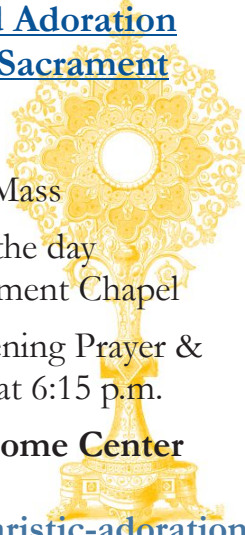

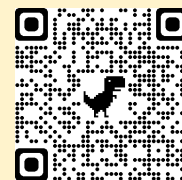

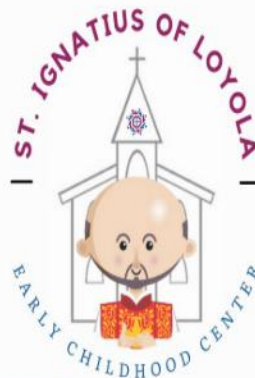

COLUMNA DEL PÁRROCO



Queridos hermanos:

Feliz Día de Fiesta! Hemos reservado un tiempo este fin de semana para celebrar a San Ignacio de Loyola, patrono de nuestra parroquia. Como comunidad parroquial que lleva su nombre, es importante para



nosotros hacer una pausa y recordar que San Ignacio de Loyola es una persona real que luchó con aspectos de la vida como nosotros. Si bien no tenía internet del que preocuparse ni los atolladeros de tráfico que le causaran frustración, Ignacio se enfrentó a sus propios demonios mientras se convertía en adulto a través de la guerra y la enfermedad. Aquí en la parroquia de San Ignacio de Loyola sabemos que cuando Ignacio estaba convaleciente de una herida que le infligieron en la guerra, se quedó sin materiales de lectura (disfrutaba con las novelas románticas). Durante este tiempo, leyó La vida de Cristo (De Vita Christi), de Ludolph de Sajonia. Esta obra influyó en toda su vida. Es un comentario sobre la vida de Jesucristo, una composición sobre los Evangelios que toma prestados extractos de las obras de más de sesenta Padres de la Iglesia. Ludolph propone al lector que se sitúe en el escenario de la historia del Evangelio; que visualiza el pesebre en la Natividad, etc. Se conoce como método de oración llamado Contemplación simple y es la base del método que San Ignacio establece en sus *Ejercicios Espirituales*. Los ejercicios del libro se diseñaron para llevarlos a cabo durante un período de 28 a 30 días. Las estructuras redondas de nuestro Legacy Garden son representaciones de los *Ejercicios Espirituales*.

Para 1534 había reunido a seis compañeros clave, a todos los cuales conoció como compañeros de estudios en la Universidad de París, entre ellos se encontraban Francis Xavier y Peter Faber, un francés (es posible que reconozca esos dos nombres en los edificios de nuestro campus). En la mañana del 15 de agosto de 1534, en la cripta de la Iglesia de Nuestra Señora de los Mártires, en Montmartre, Loyola y sus seis compañeros asumieron los votos solemnes de su obra para toda la vida. Ignacio de Loyola fue el principal creador y superior general inicial de la Compañía de Jesús, también conocidos como los Jesuitas. Sirvieron al Papa como misioneros. Ignacio es recordado como un talentoso director espiritual. Fue muy enérgico al oponerse a la Reforma Protestante y promover la siguiente Contrarreforma. Ignacio escribió las Constituciones de los jesuitas, aprobadas en 1540, que destacaban la abnegación absoluta y la obediencia al Papa y los superiores (*perinde ac cadáver*, "disciplinado como un cadáver", como decía Ignacio). Su principio fundamental se convirtió en el lema jesuita: *Ad maiorem Dei gloriam* ("para la mayor gloria de Dios"). Murió en Roma el 31 de julio de 1556.

Poco después de su llamado a la conversión, a su llegada a Montserrat, San Ignacio le dio su linda ropa a un hombre pobre, optando por usar ropa muy básica en su lugar. Mucho más tarde, sobre la directiva de "ayudar a las almas", Ignacio enfatizó constantemente el ministerio a un mundo necesitado. Los actos personales de justicia social de Ignacio continuarían durante toda su vida: cuando le daban sumas de dinero innecesarias, lo distribuía entre los pobres y no tenía reparos en afrontar las desigualdades sociales de la sociedad. Ignacio y sus compañeros se ofrecieron como directores espirituales. Ignacio dedicó el resto de su vida a seguir la voluntad de Dios, a menudo en la forma de ser una "persona para los demás", como un aspecto necesario para vivir plenamente con Dios.

El 31 de julio de 1973, fiesta de San Ignacio, el General Superior de la Compañía de Jesús, el Padre Pedro Arrupe recalcó el término **"Hombres y Mujeres Para los Demás"** en un discurso ante el Décimo Congreso Internacional de Antiguos Alumnos Jesuitas de Europa. Este se ha convertido en el elemento fundamental de la educación jesuita en todo el mundo. La idea de "Hombres y mujeres para los demás" se vive en la vida de San Ignacio, así como en otros jesuitas a lo largo de la historia, y tiene muchas implicaciones prácticas en la vida contemporánea. Convertirse en una persona para los demás requiere un cierto grado de humildad. En uno de los discursos más famosos de Arrupe, dice que debemos "enamorarnos, seguir enamorados y eso decidirá todo". Aplicar esto a ser una persona para los demás es relativamente sencillo: debemos enamorarnos de Dios y, como resultado, enamorarnos de ayudar a los demás; y una vez que lo hagamos, será más fácil continuar ayudando a los demás. Sin embargo, para enamorarse de verdad de una persona al otro lado del mundo a quien no conoces, se requiere una especial humildad o desinterés. Como parroquia fundada en la espiritualidad de Ignacio por los padres jesuitas de la provincia de Nueva Orleans, nuestro desafío es ser una comunidad de esas personas. Oremos juntos este fin de semana para que, por intercesión de San Ignacio, podamos continuar el trabajo de nuestro patrón siendo *personas para los demás* de nombre y de hecho. Que realmente podamos vivir nuestra misión dando la *bienvenida* a todos a *celebrar* con oración los misterios de la liturgia, construir una *familia* a través del compañerismo y *servir* a Cristo como un pueblo para los demás.

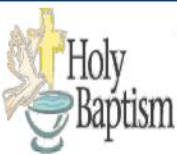
