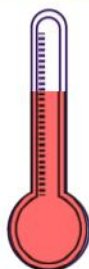

IGNITE CAMPAIGN

IGNITE: "Our Faith, Our Mission," the capital campaign for the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston, was relaunched in Fall 2018 and includes two new case elements: An ongoing Disaster Recovery Fund in order to prepare for future disaster assistance (\$20 million) and a fund for Rebuilding our Parishes and Schools in Light of Harvey (\$20 million). The \$150 million goal of the campaign will remain unchanged. The three original case elements will remain as those needs are still present, but have been reduced in order to accommodate the new realities of the Archdiocese:

- St. Mary's Seminary (\$30 million)
- Catholic Education (\$20 million)
- Faith Formation (\$10 million)

The parish share of the campaign remains \$50 million. Our parish goal is \$1,880,235.36 of which \$620,477.67 will be returned to St. Ignatius of Loyola, which is 33% of the funds raise. If we surpass the goal then 67% of the funds will stay in the parish for our use. We are dedicating all returns to the debt reduction on the Gonzaga Center.

PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last fiscal year (July 1, 2020 – June 31, 2021) we celebrated 120 funerals here in the parish and already have celebrated 14 since July 1. We have one scheduled (as I write this) for this coming week. A lot has changed over the years regarding funerals. There was a time-honored tradition that when someone died, they were buried within three days. A large part of this was a way for the family and friends to begin the grieving process in a structured way. Depending on when the body would be ready at the funeral home, the first night was usually reserved to immediate and some extended family members. The family would gather and pray the rosary and reminisce. The second night was a vigil night when people gathered for prayer and “to pay their respects”. Sometimes this was the rosary, but later came the Vigil for the Deceased based on scripture readings and storytelling. It is a way to deal with death in a human way. The Order of Christian Funerals (OCF) states: *The vigil is the principal celebration of the Christian community during the time before the funeral liturgy. It may take the form of a Liturgy of the Word or of some part of the Office for the Dead.* Because the Church gathers, the Rites celebrated are of the Church and not a devotional (such as praying the Rosary). As the family receives friends on this night before the funeral liturgy, they receive solace and care from others. I often say that since we baptized are the Body of Christ, the hugs and sympathy received are signs to us that Christ accompanies the family during this time. The OCF states it this way: *the time immediately following death is often one of bewilderment and may involve shock or heartrending grief for the family and close friends and as such, the ministry of the Church is one of gently accompanying the mourners in their initial adjustment to the fact of death and to the sorrow this entails.* The funeral liturgy then takes place the third day. It centers on the fulfillment of the hope established with the promises of Baptism, that is eternal life. The official rites of the Church do not give a specific timeline, except, that upon hearing of the death, the Church begins to accompany the family. Much of this has changed with the introduction of cremation. By a special indult granted by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments in 1996, the funeral liturgy may be celebrated in the presence of the cremated remains of the body of a deceased person. The OCF states: ***Although cremation is now permitted by the Church, it does not enjoy the same value as burial of the body. The Church clearly prefers and urges that the body of the deceased be present for the funeral rites, since the presence of the human body better expresses the values which the Church affirms in those rites.*** However, it seems that with the arrival of cremation, death no longer inconveniences us or interrupts our lives. The decision to cremate the body rather than bury the body is often a financial decision, setting aside the theological implication of burying the dead as they await the resurrection of the body. Funerals are often scheduled weeks or months in advance rather than soon after death. In the meantime, the cremated remains of the loved one sit in the house – on a table, on the mantle, etc. Why would one do that when it is the remains of a person? The Church is emphatic that the cremains should be interred as soon as possible follow the cremation. Remember that because of the dignity of the human body, the Church’s strong recommendation is that the body be present for the funeral liturgy and then, following the liturgy, the body goes to the crematory. Once the family has received the cremated remains, the cremains should be either buried in a sacred/blessed place or entombed in a mausoleum. The cremains should never be left in someone’s home. The cremated remains are the ashes of a human body – baptized, confirmed, consecrated to the Lord and which was the temple, the dwelling place of the Holy Spirit – and, as such, should be treated with the most profound respect. They are never to be divided up among people, never to be scattered or sprinkled in a favorite place, etc. They are to be buried or entombed in a mausoleum. There are always extraordinary circumstances and so we, as Church, are here to accompany, guide, and even lead the family during this difficult time. For the clergy, it is always a great honor to preside over the rituals for the dead. We assist their transition into eternal life as we lead the prayers of the community and offer Holy Mass for them comforting one another that *one day we shall see them again and enjoy their friendship.*

Next week is our annual Fall Festival. Let’s make it a great success and a real sign of “being back”! If you haven’t yet offered some of your time to work at the Festival, I know that there will always be a place for you to share your time and talent. Don’t forget to turn in those raffle tickets! See you at the festival next week.

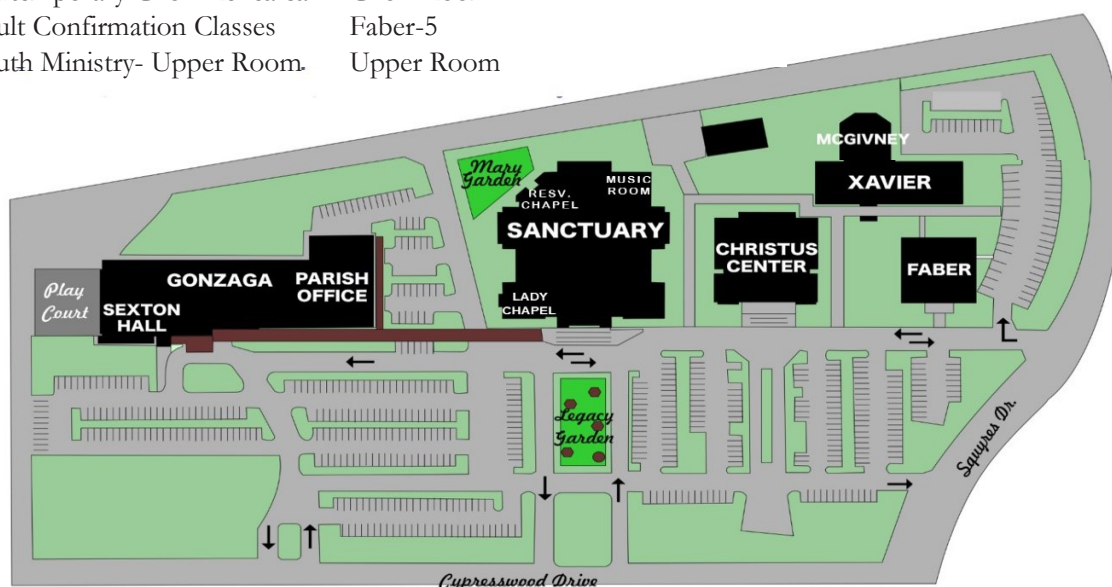

in the Book of Tobit accompanying the story's hero, Tobias, on his journey to a foreign land to find a wife. The church recognized World Day of Migrants and Refugees last Sunday. Pray that the archangels guide and protect migrants and refugees making perilous journeys everywhere.

MEMORIAL OF THE HOLY GUARDIAN ANGELS

All night and all day

Years back, in perhaps what were more innocent times (or at least appear so to us now), Catholic schoolchildren were encouraged to leave a little space on their chairs for their guardian angels. This charming bit of nostalgia reveals a deeper article of faith. From biblical times to the present, the testimony on angels guiding us has been consistent. Saint Augustine said, "Go where we will, our angels are always with us," while Saint Bernard encouraged Christians to "Make the holy angels your friends . . . we have nothing to fear under the protection of these guardians." Perhaps the larger truth is that although suffering and even tragedy may come our way, if we leave our hearts open, we will not be left alone. God will be at our side. Scoot over a bit!

Queridos hermanos,

Durante el año fiscal pasado, del 1 de julio del 2020 al 31 de junio del 2021 celebramos 120 funerales aquí en la parroquia y ya hemos celebrado 14 desde el 1 de julio. Tenemos uno programado (mientras escribo esto) para la semana que viene. Mucho ha cambiado a lo largo de los años con respecto a los funerales. Había una tradición, de tiempo sagrado, de que cuando alguien moría, era enterrado en tres días. Gran parte de esto era una forma para que la familia y los amigos comenzaran el proceso de duelo de una manera estructurada. Dependiendo de cuándo estaría listo el cuerpo en la funeraria, la primera noche generalmente estaba reservada para familiares inmediatos y algunos miembros del resto de la familia. La familia se reunía y rezaba el rosario y compartir recuerdos del difunto. La segunda noche era una noche de vigilia en la que la gente se reunía para orar y “presentar sus respetos”. A veces se rezaba el rosario, pero luego vino la Vigilia por los Difuntos basada en lecturas de las escrituras y narraciones. Es una forma de afrontar la muerte de forma humana. La Orden de Funerales Cristianos (OCF) establece: *La vigilia es la principal celebración de la comunidad cristiana durante el tiempo previo a la liturgia fúnebre. Puede tomar la forma de una Liturgia de la Palabra o de alguna parte de la Oficina de los Muertos.* Debido a que la Iglesia se reúne, los Ritos que se celebran son de la Iglesia y no un devocional (como rezar el Rosario). Cuando la familia recibe a los amigos esta noche antes de la liturgia del funeral, reciben consuelo y cariño de los demás. Suelo decir que, dado que los bautizados somos el Cuerpo de Cristo, los abrazos y la simpatía recibidos son señales para nosotros de que Cristo acompaña a la familia durante este tiempo. La OCF lo dice de esta manera: *el tiempo inmediatamente posterior a la muerte es a menudo de desconcierto y puede implicar conmoción o dolor desgarrador para la familia y amigos cercanos y, como tal, el ministerio de la Iglesia es el de acompañar gentilmente a los dolientes en su admisión o aceptación inicial. al hecho de la muerte y al dolor que esto conlleva.* Al tercer día la liturgia fúnebre tiene lugar. Se centra en el cumplimiento de la esperanza establecida con las promesas del Bautismo, que es la vida eterna. Los ritos oficiales de la Iglesia no dan una línea de tiempo específica, excepto que, al enterarse de la muerte, la Iglesia comienza a acompañar a la familia. Mucho de esto ha cambiado con la introducción de la cremación. Mediante un indulto especial otorgado por la Congregación para el Culto Divino y la Disciplina de los Sacramentos en 1996, la liturgia fúnebre puede celebrarse en presencia de los restos incinerados del cuerpo de una persona fallecida. La OCF declara: *Aunque la Iglesia ahora permite la cremación, no tiene el mismo valor que el entierro del cuerpo. La Iglesia claramente prefiere e insta a que el cuerpo del difunto esté presente para los ritos funerarios, ya que la presencia del cuerpo humano expresa mejor los valores que la Iglesia afirma en esos ritos.* Sin embargo, parece que, con la llegada de la cremación, la muerte ya no nos incomoda ni interrumpe nuestra vida. La decisión de incinerar el cuerpo en lugar de enterrarlo es a menudo una decisión financiera, dejando de lado la implicación teológica de enterrar a los muertos mientras esperan la resurrección del cuerpo. Los funerales a menudo se programan con semanas o meses de anticipación en lugar de poco después de la muerte. Mientras tanto, los restos incinerados del ser querido se sientan en la casa: en una mesa, en la reprimera, etc. ¿Por qué haría uno eso cuando se trata de los restos de una persona? La Iglesia es enfática en que las cenizas deben ser enterradas tan pronto como sea posible después de la cremación. Recuerden que, debido a la dignidad del cuerpo humano, la fuerte recomendación de la Iglesia es que el cuerpo esté presente durante la liturgia del funeral y luego, después de la liturgia, el cuerpo vaya al crematorio. Una vez que la familia ha recibido los restos cremados, las cenizas deben enterrarse en un lugar sagrado / bendecido o en un mausoleo. Las cenizas nunca deben dejarse en la casa de alguien. Los restos incinerados son las cenizas de un cuerpo humano - bautizado, confirmado, consagrado al Señor y que fue el templo, la morada del Espíritu Santo - y, como tal, debe ser tratado con el más profundo respeto. Nunca debe dividirse entre la gente, nunca debe ser esparcidos en un lugar favorito, etc. Debe ser enterrado o sepultado en un mausoleo. Siempre hay circunstancias extraordinarias y por eso nosotros, como Iglesia, estamos aquí para acompañar, guiar e incluso dirigir a la familia durante este momento difícil. Para el clero, siempre es un gran honor presidir los rituales de los difuntos. Ayudamos a su transición a la vida eterna mientras dirigimos las oraciones de la comunidad y ofrecemos la Santa Misa por ellos, dando consuelo los unos a los otros y recordándoles que *un día los volveremos a ver y disfrutaremos de su amistad.*

La próxima semana es nuestro Festival de Otoño anual. ¡Hagamos que sea un gran éxito y una verdadera señal de "estar de regreso"! Si todavía no has ofrecido parte de tu tiempo para trabajar en el Festival, sé que siempre habrá un lugar para que compartas tu tiempo y talento. ¡No olvides entregar esos boletos de la rifa! Nos vemos en el festival la semana que viene.

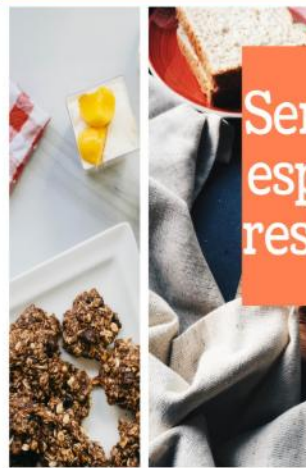

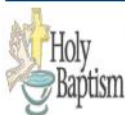

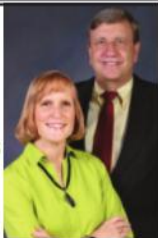
