

IGNITE CAMPAIGN

IGNITE: "Our Faith, Our Mission," the capital campaign for the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston, was relaunched in Fall 2018 and includes two new case elements: An ongoing Disaster Recovery Fund in order to prepare for future disaster assistance (\$20 million) and a fund for Rebuilding our Parishes and Schools in Light of Harvey (\$20 million). The \$150 million goal of the campaign will remain unchanged. The three original case elements will remain as those needs are still present, but have been reduced in order to accommodate the new realities of the Archdiocese:

- St. Mary's Seminary (\$30 million)
- Catholic Education (\$20 million)
- Faith Formation (\$10 million)

The parish share of the campaign remains \$50 million. Our parish goal is \$1,880,235.36 of which \$620,477.67 will be returned to St. Ignatius of Loyola, which is 33% of the funds raise. If we surpass the goal then 67% of the funds will stay in the parish for our use. We are dedicating all returns to the debt reduction on the Gonzaga Center.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Monday, November 1st, is the Solemnity of All Saints. While it is usually considered a Holy Day of Obligation because it falls on a Monday, the obligation to attend Mass is normally abrogated. However, I would like to use this solemnity to reflect upon our common call to sainthood. We are all called to be saints! By virtue of our baptism into Christ, we began the journey on the road to holiness, also called sainthood. Perhaps if you were to see the Latin word for holy, you might see the similarity in the words. The word for *holy* in Latin is *sanctus*. When we sing the Latin version of the “Holy Holy” at Mass we would sing, *Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus*. In Latin we would refer to Saint Ignatius as *Sanctus Ignatius*. So, to be holy is to be a saint! The question then is how do we become holy, that is, a saint? The obvious answer is to live in accord with the teachings of Jesus Christ. That is a surefire way to achieve holiness – to love as Christ loved, sacrificially, not counting the cost or looking for the return. But, at the core of living as Christ, we must be people of Christ. We must of His mindset, we must be His very presence in the world. By virtue of Baptism and Confirmation, we are called and sent on mission to be His presence in the world. That is our task as those who bare the name “Christian”. The Eucharist, that is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus, is the food that strengthens us as live out this commitment. We need the Eucharist to be a holy person. We need the Eucharist to overcome the obstacles that prevent us from loving as Christ loves. We must eat and drink of the Body and Blood of Christ to become Christ. St. Augustine taught this in his words, “Behold who you are, become what you receive!” It was Augustine’s view that, if we really grasped the meaning of that very profound statement, the way we live our lives would be transformed immeasurably. “Become what you receive!” – “Become nourishment for everyone with whom you interact when you walk out of the church today! Be bread, broken and given to nourish the lives of those you will encounter today and into the future. Give selflessly of yourself and of your time and energy. Breathe life and hope into others, into your family members, your friends, your work colleagues and the strangers you meet.” That is what makes us into saints! That is the lives lived by those we now call *sanctus/holy/saint*.

But how can that happen if you do not come to the Eucharistic banquet and receive Holy Communion? How is it possible to become what we receive if we haven’t received? Too many of us look for the easy way out and find shortcuts in living out our Christianity. Too many of us ask, “What is the minimum I can do and still be the presence of the One who gave everything?” Can you imagine Jesus saying to the Father, “Do I really have to carry this cross? It’s so heavy!” Instead, we make comments such as “It’s really so difficult getting the kids ready for Mass. Why can’t livestream be good enough?” “Isn’t virtual communion the same as Holy Communion?” “I’m so tired, surely Jesus will understand if I sleep in even though he did fall three times carrying His cross.” All these excuses and more are not what leads us to holiness and sainthood. Imagine one of the great saints of the Church looking for the easy way out; we would not be calling them saints today. To become a saint, that is to be holy, is to take seriously the words of St. Ignatius: “*Take, Lord, receive, all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, my entire will, all I have and call my own. You have given all to me, to you, Lord, I return it. Everything is yours; do with it what you will. Give me only your love and your grace, that is enough for me.*” Nothing minimal there, for sure!

God called you to be His own in baptism and God will provide everything you and I need to become a saint. Don’t shortchange yourself. Take His yoke upon your shoulders and learn from Him. He is the way, the truth, and the life. To be numbered among the saints begins by living out your baptismal call as a disciple. Each of us can do this as we support one another in our Eucharistic Community. Do what you do with full mind and heart set on serving and pleasing the Lord.

Tuesday, November 2nd, is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, also known as All Souls Day. It is a day we set aside to pray for the dead. Take some time and remember those you loved who have passed to the other side of life. We pray that their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed may rest in the peace of Christ. Remember, our faith teaches us that one day we will see them again and enjoy their friendship when we all meet in Christ and with them forever. The greatest prayer you can offer is the Holy Mass.

Now and at the hour of our death

All Hallows' Evening (contracted to Hallowe'en) begins the liturgical period of All Hallowtide, when saints, martyrs, and the departed in general are kept in special memory. Hallowed means consecrated, as the souls of the dead are in God's hands. All of the holy and troubled souls who have gone before us—represented by trick-or-treaters dressed as superheroes or vampires among others—are worthy of our mindful recollection and prayers.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Deuteronomy 6:2-6; Hebrews 7:23-28; Mark 12:28b-34 (152). "Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone!"*

SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS

Keep on marching

There are more than 10,000 saints venerated by the Catholic Church. (The exact number is a little unclear since some early saints may be more legendary than historical.) A lot of them are fairly new—Pope John Paul II (himself a saint) canonized more saints than all the popes in the previous 500 years combined. What does it mean to be a saint? A saint is anyone in heaven, whether canonized or not, and could include your own late family and friends. It doesn't mean they were perfect in life, but that they kept trying to live a holy life. Saints form the "great cloud of witnesses" and they're all cheering for you as you strive to be a saint, too.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14; 1 John 3:1-3; Matthew 5:1-12a (667). "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."*

COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED (ALL SOULS' DAY)

Knock, knock, knockin' on heaven's door

From the earliest days of Christianity—as believers shared Eucharist in the catacombs, alongside the dead—we Catholics have woven prayers for our dearly departed into many observances: every celebration of the Mass, praying the Rosary, annual parish-wide remembrances of the dead throughout November—even incorporating elements of Día de los Muertos from Latino tradition. We pray so that all souls who've been detoured through purgatory might, with our prayerful help, enjoy triumphant entry into heaven. As you remember your own dearly departed today, celebrate in Día de los Muertos style: Pray with their photos, visit their graves, enjoy their favorite foods.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Wisdom 3:1-9; Romans 5:5-11 or Romans 6:3-9; John 6:37-40 (668). "Everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life."*

Wednesday, Nov 03, 2021

MEMORIAL OF MARTIN DE PORRES, RELIGIOUS **United in our diversity**

Born in colonial Peru in 1579 to a mix of Spanish, African, and indigenous ancestors, Martin de Porres was barred from full membership in a religious order in his racially stratified society. Martin was not deterred, however, and his gifts as a healer and spiritual leader elevated him to a position of great renown and respect within the Dominican order and Peruvian society.

Today, there is a 61 percent chance that two people selected at random in the United States will be of different racial or ethnic backgrounds, according to the 2020 Census. As patron saint of race relations and those of diverse racial and ethnic backgrounds, Martin offers inspiration to all of us to work for social justice in our increasingly diverse nation.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Romans 13:8-10; Luke 14:25-33 (487). "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple."*

MEMORIAL OF CHARLES BORROMEO, BISHOP

Times that try our souls

It's a tricky business to take stock of the "signs of the times," as Vatican II urged us to do. One person who was good at assessing the strengths and flaws of his culture was Saint Charles Borromeo (1538-84), a reformer who used his education and power as bishop to heal and repair the church. Pray that the Holy Spirit give us wisdom to perceive how God is present today, and to help bring about that presence where it seems to be lacking.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Romans 14:7-12; Luke 15:1-10 (488). "There will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people."*

What would Jesus not do?

It's easy to understand why evangelism is so compelling. We can't wait to share the awesome news of finding our heart's treasure in Jesus the Christ and the Catholic faith. But we must also take great care in evangelism so that we do not end up "colonizing" others, that is, assuming there is nothing good or godly in another person or group and imposing our own "enlightened" ways upon them. Jesus certainly does not do this. Instead, he shows by his own life the love of God and he looks where God already is in the world and in people's lives. In what ways can we safeguard respect for others and God in our own call to be evangelists?

TODAY'S READINGS: *Romans 15:14-21; Luke 16:1-8 (489). "I will not dare to speak of anything except what Christ has accomplished through me."*

Saturday, Nov 06, 2021

Inspiration knows no bounds

Jesus' life and ministry broke open the "old wineskins" of religious and social customs. Inspired by his example, the early church was remarkably diverse and creative, and women played key roles every step of the way. Priscilla (or Prisca, her formal name), along with her husband, Aquila, were companions of Saint Paul and prominent leaders in the early church—and Priscilla's name usually appears first when they are mentioned in the New Testament, a hint of her esteemed position. She instructed the learned Apollos, and some commentators think she may have had a hand in authoring the epistle to the Hebrews. Raise a glass to new wineskins—may they continue to pour out the Spirit!

TODAY'S READINGS: *Romans 16:3-9, 16, 22-27; Luke 16:9-15 (490). "Greet Prisca and Aquila, my co-workers in Christ Jesus, who risked their necks for my life."*



Guatemala School Mission Continue Keeping the Dream Alive No Pandemic Stands in the Way



The Guatemala School Mission Committee will again hold our annual fundraiser in support of Our Lady of Guadalupe School in Chiché, Guatemala best known as "The Little Parochial School" the weekend of November 13-14. We have prepared a short video of the teachers, children, and parents as they, like us, are coping with this pandemic.

Thanks to the support of the parishioners of St. Ignatius, we were able to meet the salary needs of the teachers this last fiscal year that ended in June 2021. From 2002 until 2021, 4,334 boys and girls ages 4-13 have attended the school, with 484 having graduated sixth grade as a direct result of the continued support of St. Ignatius and its parishioners. Two former students were teachers, and four former students are currently teaching at the school.

It is worth mentioning that we have teachers teaching classes at the parish school for at least four years, and the longest being eleven years.

In spite of the pandemic the teachers have not stopped working. On the days when distance and face-to-face classes are taught, they are teaching virtual classes, giving homework papers to the parents of the students, grading assignments, and assisting parents and supporting students.

The second collection on the weekend of November 13-14 will be in support of the teachers' salaries, and the education they provide the children Pre-K through 6th grades, with a goal of \$75,000 to cover these education needs. Donations can also be made through Faith Direct. We parishioners at St. Ignatius should be proud in fulfilling our outreach calling with the "little school." May you find it in your heart to continue your prayers for the coming school year, and may God Bless you for your continued financial support.





Hermanos,

El lunes 1 de noviembre es La Solemnidad de Todos los Santos. Si bien generalmente se considera un día de precepto (obligación) pero porque cae en lunes, la obligación de asistir a misa normalmente se abroga. Sin embargo, me gustaría utilizar esta solemnidad para reflexionar sobre nuestro llamado común a la santidad. ¡Todos estamos llamados a ser santos! En virtud de nuestro bautismo en Cristo, iniciamos el camino hacia lo sagrado, también llamado santidad. Quizás si vieras la palabra latina para santo, podrías ver la similitud en las palabras. La palabra santa en latín es *sanctus*. Cuando cantamos la versión latina del “Santo Santo” en la Misa, cantamos, *Sanctus, Sanctus, Sanctus*. En latín nos referiríamos a San Ignacio como Sanctus Ignacio. Entonces, ¿ser sagrado es ser un santo! La pregunta entonces es ¿cómo llegar a ser sagrado, es decir, un santo? La respuesta obvia es vivir de acuerdo con las enseñanzas de Jesucristo. Esa es una manera infalible de lograr la santidad: amar como Cristo amó, con sacrificio, sin contar el costo ni esperar la recompensa. Pero, en el centro de vivir como Cristo, debemos ser personas de Cristo. Debemos de tener Su mentalidad, debemos ser Su misma presencia en el mundo. En virtud del Bautismo y la Confirmación, somos llamados y enviados en misión para ser Su presencia en el mundo. Esa es nuestra misión como los que llevan el nombre de “cristianos”. La Eucaristía, que es Cuerpo, Sangre, Alma y Divinidad de Jesús, es el alimento que nos fortalece para vivir este compromiso. Necesitamos que la Eucaristía sea una persona santa. Necesitamos la Eucaristía para superar los obstáculos que nos impiden amar como ama Cristo. Debemos comer y beber del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo para convertirnos en Cristo. San Agustín enseñó esto en sus palabras: “¡Mira quién eres, conviértete en lo que recibes!” Agustín opinaba que, si realmente comprendiéramos el significado de esa declaración tan profunda, la forma en que vivimos nuestras vidas se transformaría enormemente. “¡Conviértete en lo que recibes!” - “¡Conviértete en alimento para todos con quienes interactúas cuando salgas de la iglesia hoy! Se pan, partido y dado para nutrir la vida de aquellos con los que te encontrarás hoy y en el futuro. Entrega desinteresadamente de ti mismo y de tu tiempo y energía. Da vida y esperanza a los demás, a los miembros de tu familia, a tus amigos, a tus compañeros de trabajo y a los extraños que conocerás”. ¡Eso es lo que nos convierte en santos! Esas son las vidas vividas por aquellos que ahora llamamos *sanctus/sagrado/santo*.

Pero ¿cómo puede suceder eso si no vienes al banquete eucarístico y recibes la Sagrada Comunión? ¿Cómo es posible convertirnos en lo que recibimos si no lo hemos recibido? Muchos de nosotros buscamos la salida fácil y encontramos atajos para vivir nuestro cristianismo. Muchos de nosotros preguntamos: “¿Qué es lo mínimo que puedo hacer y seguir siendo la presencia de Aquel que lo dio todo?” ¿Te imaginas a Jesús diciéndole al Padre: “¿Realmente tengo que cargar esta cruz? ¡Es tan pesada!” En su lugar, hacemos comentarios como “Es realmente muy difícil preparar a los niños para la misa. ¿Por qué la transmisión en vivo no puede ser suficiente?” “¿No es la comunión virtual lo mismo que la Sagrada Comunión?” “Estoy tan cansado(a), seguramente Jesús entenderá si duermo hasta tarde, aunque se cayó tres veces cargando su cruz”. Todas estas excusas y más no son las que nos llevan a la santidad. Imagínese a uno de los grandes santos de la Iglesia buscando la salida fácil; no los llamaríamos santos hoy. Convertirse en santo, es decir, *ser santo*, es tomarse en serio las palabras de San Ignacio: “Toma, Señor, y recibe toda mi libertad; mi memoria, mi entendimiento y toda mi voluntad; todo lo que tengo y llamo mío. tu me lo diste y a ti lo regreso; todo es tuyo, dispón Tú de ello según tu voluntad. Dame solo, tu amor y tu gracia, que estas me bastan”. ¡Nada mínimo allí, de seguro!

Dios te llamó a ser Suyo en el bautismo y Dios proveerá todo lo que tú y yo necesitamos para convertirnos en santos. Toma Su yugo sobre tus hombros y aprende de Él. Él es el camino, la Verdad y la Vida. Para ser contado entre los santos comienza viviendo tu llamado bautismal como discípulo. Cada uno de nosotros puede hacer esto mientras nos apoyamos unos a otros en nuestra Comunidad Eucarística. Haz lo que haces con toda tu mente y tu corazón, completamente listos en servir y agradecer al Señor.

El martes 2 de noviembre es La Conmemoración de Todos los Fieles Difuntos. Es un día que reservamos para orar por los muertos. un tiempo y recuerden a aquellos a quienes amaban y que ya han pasaron al otro lado de la vida. Oremos para que sus almas y las almas de todos los fieles difuntos descansen en la paz de Cristo. Recuerden, nuestra fe nos enseña que un día los volveremos a ver y disfrutaremos de su amistad cuando todos nos encontremos en Cristo y con ellos para siempre. La oración más grande que puedes ofrecer es la Santa Misa.


