

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend as we celebrate Mother's Day, we also celebrate what is known as "Good Shepherd" Sunday. Traditionally, the Church marks the 4th Sunday of Easter as a time to reflect upon the various images the Gospels present naming Jesus as the Good Shepherd. He is the gate, He is the



Shepherd who knows His sheep, He is the way, the truth, and the life. "I know mine and mine know me," He says. But do we really know Him? Last week I included a poem about riding a tandem bike with Jesus. When He doubt, He says to us, "pedal!" To trust in Jesus is at the heart of Divine Mercy. What has the Lord ever done to cause us to doubt in Him, to not trust Him with our very lives? When things don't go the way we think they should, we doubt God's very existence, treating Him as if He is the puppet master that doesn't follow the script we wrote for our lives.

Today's youth are filled with anxiety. Everywhere you turn there are articles about the high anxiety levels of youth that lead them to the point of pondering suicide. They become isolated from their peers and family members, but all the while reaching out on social media in search of "friends" who often share similar anxieties. It becomes a spiral that pulls them more and more into themselves and away from those who really are their "friends". Jesus tells us, "You are my friends if you do what I command you; love one another as I have loved you." That's where shepherding comes into play. I have come to believe that part of the growing anxiety problem of our youth begins when parents stop parenting. God did not give you this adolescent to be your friend; He gave him/her to you as your child. And as your child, you are called to shepherd and guide your child into the life He has given them. Yes, children don't like being disciplined or corrected in any way. A thirteen-year-old believes s/he knows more than mom and dad put together. But, that thirteen-year-old also needs boundaries and discipline to grow into adulthood. Without such things, the adult actually becomes an adult-child – selfish, ego centered, entitled, etc.

I have also come to believe that our youth are filled with anxiety because in wanting to be their child's "friend", the parent gives into the world's desire for things that don't last. Soccer, football, band, competitions, etc., all become more important than Mass and Religious Formation. "My child has a tournament and can't be at Confirmation. Is there somewhere else I can take him/her?" The parent has just told the child that playing the sport is more important and valued than celebrating and receiving the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. God can wait because the coach said my child must be at the game. Am I the only one who sees something wrong with this? Last week we celebrated the reception of First Holy Communion for almost 100 of our children and yet our normal number is in the 200s. A parent told me that he had no idea that Mass had started back from the Covid pandemic. Really? Honestly? You had no idea? And why is that? Doesn't one who has been entrusted with shepherding know what is good for those they shepherd? "What father among you would give your child a scorpion if they asked for an egg?" Christ is the answer for our youth. When He is in control of our lives – and not social media, their peers, or their coach - we can allow Him to lead us, trusting that our God wants the best for us. The ancient phrase, "but Mass is so boring," is only fulfilled when one doesn't enter into the mysteries of the Mass. When I studied Spanish literature, the professor made sure we knew all the symbolism, the reasons why the author chose certain words and not others, the history and political unrest in society when the author wrote the piece, etc. It is said that the Mass is a sacred drama. There are particular words to use, a rubric of actions, costuming, and one could say, even audience participation. But, we are not audience members. The word "liturgy" comes from the Greek meaning "the work of the people." Each of us must enter into the liturgy doing our part because the work we do together is worship praise of God the Father who has made us in His own image and likeness. Secondly, we must come prepared. We cannot just walk in and flop down in a seat and expect to be entertained. Like my literature class, we have to know the ins and outs of what we do and why we do it (that's called catechesis or formation). Why do we listen to the stories of our faith before the bread and wine come forth to become the Body and Blood of Christ? Why does the priest hold his hands out over the bread and wine when he says a certain prayer? What is the symbolism in that? Why do we stand, sit, and kneel? Why do we say that Jesus is the Lamb of God? Why should a parent teach their children these things that we have passed on from generation to generation? Why did Jesus say that unless we eat His Body and drink His Blood, we have no life in us? Shepherding – parenting – one and the same and Jesus is the model.

Be a goodness trafficker

Many of us are proud to be good at what we do whether it is a trade, craft, profession, or pastoral role. Yet few of us claim to be experts at our special task. Sister of Charity Blessed Miriam Teresa Demjanovich of New Jersey is called a "genius of the soul" for her instructions on the mystical life collected after her death in 1927 under the title Greater Perfection. In a key closing lesson, she writes: "Union with God, then, is the spiritual height God calls everyone to achieve—anyone . . . who specializes in the traffic of eternal good, who says 'yes' constantly to God." On this Mother's Day, pray that every mother may become, and also nurture, "soul geniuses" and traffic in eternal good.

Flying in formation

Did you think that Catholic cardinals came to be so called because their red robes were reminiscent of the birds with the same name? Nope—it's actually the other way around. Cardinals—that is, the senior members of the clergy—wear red because it symbolizes their willingness to sacrifice for their faith. The birds came to be called cardinals because they reminded people of the red-clad men who make up the church's College of Cardinals. The word cardinal comes from the Latin word for "hinge"—upon which a gate or door opens. Pray for these leaders and their flocks to open their eyes, ears, and hearts as we find our way together into the future church.

MEMORIAL OF JOHN OF ÁVILA, PRIEST, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Thank you, God

German Catholic mystic Meister Eckhart gets credit for these eloquent words: "If the only prayer you ever say in your entire life is 'Thank you,' it will be enough." More than a century later, another Catholic mystic would offer a slightly different view. Spanish priest Saint John of Ávila, recognized as a doctor of the church, wrote: "A single 'Blessed be God' in adversity is worth more than a thousand acts of thanksgiving in prosperity." But in the end, you can't go wrong following King David's direction in Psalm 34 to "Bless the Lord at all times"—even when it seems impossible.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 11:19-26; John 10:22-30 (280). "He rejoiced and encouraged them all to remain faithful to the Lord in firmness of heart."

Cultivate a missionary's heart

Today we celebrate the feast of Servant of God Matteo Ricci, a Jesuit missionary to China during the 16th and 17th centuries. He was known for his multitudinous academic ventures for the benefit of his constituents and for his openness to (and adoption of) the local culture. He is famous for creating a Chinese map of

the known world, for his consultations with Chinese royalty on matters of astronomy and science, and for his assistance in translating important works from Latin to Chinese—and vice versa. Let your own gifts overflow in a life of witness.

MEMORIAL OF NEREUS AND ACHILLEUS, MARTYRS; PANCRAS, MARTYR

Pray for the courage of conviction

Today we honor three martyrs, Saints Nereus, Achilleus, and Pancras. Attitudes toward martyrs can run hot and cold. "Ugh, they just want to be a martyr," we say about the self-aggrandizing who put their sacrifices on display. In one of his sermons, Saint Augustine chided false martyrs, those who flaunted punishments they received for promoting schismatic beliefs. But when we see the real deal, a person whose heart is so big that "sacrifice" feels less like pain and more like love, we applaud their martyrdom. Open our hearts, O God, so that we can sacrifice like that.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 13:13-25; John 13:16-20 (282). "Whoever receives me receives the one who sent me."

MEMORIAL OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

Let a new era of peace begin

In 1917 during a time of great turmoil in Europe, three Portuguese children reported seeing an apparition of Mary in which, it was later revealed, the Blessed Mother called for people to imitate her faithfulness to Christ as a way to achieve peace. According to Carmelite Sister Lúcia dos Santos, one of the children of Fatima, Mary also promised that the consecration of Russia by the world's bishops would lead to an era of peace. Amid the devastation of Russia's 2022 invasion of Ukraine, the Catholic bishops of Ukraine requested Pope Francis to consecrate Ukraine and Russia to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, which he did on March 25, asking all the world's bishops to join him from their own dioceses. May we continue to follow Mary's example of discipleship as a way of achieving peace at home and abroad.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 13:26-33; John 14:1-6 (283/563A). "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it."

FEAST OF MATTHIAS, APOSTLE

The making of an apostle

There are alternate ways of becoming an apostle. Number one is being called directly by Jesus, as were the 12 apostles. Then there's today's saint, Matthias, who was chosen by drawing lots. Saint Paul was a self-proclaimed apostle. Junia and her partner Andronicus are called apostles in Romans 16:7. The church also designates apostles: Patrick was the "Apostle of Ireland," Boniface the "Apostle to the Germans," and Mary Magdalene has the honor of being the "Apostle to the Apostles." The word apostle means sent, so in a sense when we are sent forth at the end of Mass, we're all apostles. How does that change your understanding of who you are?

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 1:15-17, 20-26; John 15:9-17 (564). "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you."

Vocation Director 'Boot Camp'

TRAINING THE GATEKEEPERS FOR SEMINARIES

Every year, about 50 new Vocation Directors are appointed in the 250 dioceses in the U.S. and Canada. Often they are younger priests, typically ordained just three to ten years, whom bishops have chosen for a critical job: to inspire, mentor, and screen men who feel called to the priesthood.

"I'm more of a guide, not a recruiter," said one Vocation Director from a Southeastern diocese. "I help guys listen to God's voice; whether it's to marriage or priesthood, that's up to Him, not me." Importantly, Vocation Directors act as gatekeepers, ensuring that very rigorous standards are upheld before accepting men to seminary.

But who trains the Vocation Directors on how to vet future seminarians? For the past 15 years, a very robust "bootcamp" for new Vocation Directors has been held by the NCDVD (National



Diocesanpriest.com lists all Vocation Directors in the U.S. and Canada.

Conference of Diocesan Vocation Directors). Officially called the "Institute for New Vocation Personnel," it features veteran instructors who dive deep into the candidate screening process, with a strong emphasis on human maturity and psychological evaluation.


Vocation Directors are well aware of the gravity of their task. "People are always going to ask you how many seminarians you have, but don't get fixated on the numbers," said one of the instructors. "Instead focus on forming good, holy men who can serve as faithful priests."



ONE RING TO SERVE THEM ALL

Pope Pius X (1835-1914) was a very humble man who had a saintly mother, Margarita Sanson. Because they were so poor, she worked as a washer woman and a school janitor to earn enough money so that he could go to the seminary. (In those days, the family had to pay for the seminarian's education.) When he was installed as Pope, his mother was present, and as was the custom, she kissed his large papal ring. She then presented her tiny hand with her wedding ring and said, "Now you kiss my ring—for without it, you never would have received yours!"







Discerning Together

"Discernment groups" are a growing trend among young Catholics. Last fall, a group of college women at Oklahoma State University spent six weeks discerning religious life together. They met for prayer and discussion, served the poor together, and ended with a fun outing.



COLUMNA DEL PÁRROCO

Queridos hermanos,

Este fin de semana, al celebrar el Día de la Madre, también celebramos lo que se conoce como el Domingo del "Buen Pastor". Tradicionalmente, la Iglesia marca el cuarto Domingo de Pascua como un tiempo para reflexionar sobre las diversas imágenes que presentan los Evangelios que nombran a Jesús como el Buen Pastor. Él es la puerta, Él es el Pastor que conoce a Sus ovejas, Él es el camino, la verdad y



Los jóvenes de hoy están llenos de ansiedad. Donde quiera que miren hay artículos sobre los altos niveles de ansiedad de los jóvenes que los llevan al punto de considerar el suicidio. Se aíslan de sus compañeros y familiares, pero al mismo tiempo se comunican en las redes sociales en busca de "amigos" que a menudo comparten ansiedades similares. Se convierte en una espiral que los atrae cada vez más hacia sí mismos y los aleja de quienes realmente son sus "amigos". Jesús nos dice: "Vosotros sois mis amigos si hacéis lo que yo os mando; amaos los unos a los otros como yo os he amado." Ahí es donde entra en juego el pastoreo. He llegado a creer que parte del creciente problema de ansiedad de nuestra juventud comienza cuando los padres dejan de ser padres. Dios no te dio a este adolescente para que fuera tu amigo; Te lo dio a ti como tu hijo. Y como tu hijo, estás llamado a pastorear y guiar a tu hijo hacia la vida que Él les ha dado. Sí, a los niños no les gusta ser disciplinados o corregidos de ninguna manera. Un niño de trece años cree que sabe más que mamá y papá juntos. Pero ese niño de trece años también necesita límites y disciplina para crecer hasta la edad adulta. Sin tales cosas, el adulto en realidad se convierte en un adulto-niño: egoísta, centrado en el ego, con derecho, etc.

También he llegado a creer que nuestra juventud está llena de ansiedad porque al querer ser el "amigo" de su hijo, el padre cede al deseo del mundo por cosas que no duran. El fútbol, el fútbol americano, la banda, las competencias, etc., todos se vuelven más importantes que la Misa y la Formación Religiosa. "Mi hijo tiene un torneo y no puede estar en la Confirmación. ¿Hay algún otro lugar al que pueda llevarlo? El padre acaba de decirle al niño que practicar el deporte es más importante y valorado que celebrar y recibir los Dones del Espíritu Santo. Dios puede esperar porque el entrenador dijo que mi hijo debe estar en el juego. ¿Soy el único que ve algo malo en esto? La semana pasada celebramos la recepción de la Primera Comunión para casi 100 de nuestros niños y, sin embargo, nuestro número normal es de 200. Un padre me dijo que no tenía idea de que celebrábamos la Misa nuevamente después de la pandemia de Covid. ¿En serio? ¿Honestamente? ¿No tenías idea? ¿Y por qué es eso? ¿No sabe el que tiene el encargo de pastorear lo que es bueno para aquellos a quienes pastorea? "¿Qué padre de ustedes le daría a su hijo un escorpión si le pidieran un huevo?" Cristo es la respuesta para nuestra juventud. Cuando Él tiene el control de nuestras vidas, y no las redes sociales, sus compañeros o su entrenador, podemos permitir que Él nos guíe, confiando en que nuestro Dios quiere lo mejor para nosotros. La antigua frase, "pero la Misa es tan aburrida", solo se cumple cuando uno no entra en los misterios de la Misa. Cuando estudié literatura española, el profesor se aseguró de que supiéramos todo el simbolismo, las razones por las que el autor eligió unas palabras y no otras, la historia y la conflictividad política de la sociedad cuando el autor escribió la pieza, etc. Se dice que la Misa es un drama sagrado. Hay palabras particulares para usar, una rúbrica de acciones, vestuario, y se podría decir, incluso participación de la audiencia. Pero, no somos miembros de la audiencia. La palabra "liturgia" proviene del griego y significa "el trabajo del pueblo". Cada uno de nosotros debe entrar en la liturgia haciendo su parte porque el trabajo que hacemos juntos es adoración, alabanza a Dios Padre que nos ha hecho a su imagen y semejanza. En segundo lugar, debemos venir preparados. No podemos simplemente entrar y sentarnos en un asiento y esperar que nos entretengan. Al igual que mi clase de literatura, tenemos que conocer el porqué de lo que hacemos y por qué lo hacemos (eso se llama catequesis o formación). ¿Por qué escuchamos las historias de nuestra fe antes de que el pan y el vino se conviertan en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo? ¿Por qué el sacerdote extiende sus manos sobre el pan y el vino cuando dice cierta oración? ¿Cuál es el simbolismo en eso? ¿Por qué nos paramos, sentamos y arrodillamos? ¿Por qué decimos que Jesús es el Cordero de Dios? ¿Por qué un padre debe enseñar a sus hijos estas cosas que hemos transmitido de generación en generación? ¿Por qué Jesús dijo que a menos que comamos Su Cuerpo y bebamos Su Sangre, no tenemos vida en nosotros? Pastoreo – paternidad – uno y el mismo y Jesús es el modelo.


