



#### TRUST IN THE LORD

Readings: Jeremiah 17:5–8 Psalm 1:1–4, 6 1 Corinthians 15:12, 16–20 Luke 6:17, 20–26

Everyone in this world desires happiness. Not even only human beings, but every living creature. Therefore, where and from whom we get our happiness will indicate whether our happiness will be lasting or short-lived.

Jeremiah in the first reading of today showers curses on any human person who seeks happiness, prosperity, strength and success in a fellow human being. And has turned his or heart from the Lord. Such a person according to the prophet Jeremiah, as instructed by God, is like a barren desert land that enjoys no change of season, but stands in the lava waste, a salt and empty earth.

You may have the best of father or mother. The finest and best of husbands, sons, daughters who may be making you happy, providing you all that you need in this life. However, you will wake up one day and realize that such a person is no more.

Some people were lucky they got a very generous husband, wife, uncle, auntie, sister or brother to assist them to survive in life. Those who realized God's message for us through Jeremiah in the reading of today make good use of these good people they come across to become meaningful people in society. However, those who think the people who were so kind and good will remain forever rose up from their sleeps and these kind and generous people were dead or no-where to be found, become burdens to themselves and to the society.

Many people have seen the bitter side of life because the people they trusted so much eventually disappointed them. They were not lucky to meet the right people and their future brighter lives were dimmed.

The message for us is simple, whether we have good people we can rely on or not we need to rely on God who exist for ever and will never fail us.

Blessed shall we be if we trust not in men but in the Lord. We would be like a watered garden and forever green. Even in the days of drought, no distress will come our ways.

Our happiness can also be based on the hope that there is more joy to come in our lives. We need

to look at the endless joy that comes even beyond the grave. We have hope that since Jesus rose

from death, we will also share His resurrection. This alone helps us to have more hope in depending on the rock of ages.

St. Augustine once said that "if for this life only we have hope in Christ, then we are the most pitiable people of all". For Augustine, Christianity is the philosophy of life which offers hope to our restless hearts till we find rest in God. And so, since Christ has become the first fruit from the dead, we too have the hope of resurrection and that gives us joy.

The first reading had some curses and blessings for those who had their trust in God and man. The gospel of Luke just like Matthew also has the beatitudes. They are the blessedness of absolute faith and dependance in God and the pains and miseries that comes at the refusal to trust in God.

Jesus addresses his disciples, as they were increasing in number and most of them were divided whether to trust in God or the ruling government: Herod the great was ruling the people at that time, or to rely on their riches.

And so, in order not for the people to put their trust in the ruler and human beings as well as material things, Jesus brings out the consequences of the sides they will take.

Those who see their need of God are considered poor. No matter their state of mind or status in the society or in life as a whole. The poor here should not be misconstrued as only those who do not have something to eat or wear. One may have all it takes to live long but may still be poor. As we consider ourselves as people who need God, we can be assured of the kingdom of God. When we desire things of God, we are hungry for more and wait on him, he will definitely feed us, but if we eat the worldly good and get satisfied and fail to seek or desire God, we will remain hungry forever.

If by any reason you are weeping because of the good you did some time ago or now, leave it in the hand of the Lord and he will make you laugh.

Many people envy you because you struggle more to achieve righteousness. They sit aluff and don't do anything like you do and they retort and give you names and categorize you to a group or some group, be strong and rejoice your effort will be rewarded.

Let's talk about the woes a bit. People who depend on the material things they have acquired and out their hope and trust in what they can possess are accursed because their materials will end with them. There's no here- after for such people.

Woe to all who think they are filled with everything so they lack nothing. They are actually missing the great deal and they have nothing to laugh about. They will be hungry and weep. If all people are praising you be careful, it's an indication that you are living your life to please men not God. Our lives should be to please God, so woe to anyone who wants to please a person.

May the Lord help us to seek the blessedness of this life than the woes of this life. Amen! Peace!!! Rev. Fr. Dominic Y Afrifa






