

Am I appreciative enough to God?

Readings: 2 Kings 5:14–17 Psalm 98:1–4 2 Timothy 2:8–13 Luke 17:11–19

A lot of themes can be drawn from the readings of this weekend. Some of them are the curative power that emanates from God that can be found in the first and third or gospel readings. The spirit of appreciation that should be part of our lives as Christians can also be found in the two readings. Paul entreats us through his letter to Timothy that we should bear the cross of Christ.

Naaman, a very reputable person in the government of Syria at that time, a soldier, a commander in chief, who had won much respect before the king and his people, was suffering from a very disgraceful, humiliating disease that was considered a curse from God at the time.

Fortunately for him, he had the healing from God through the instrumentality of the prophet Elisha. Naaman did not take such a miracle for granted and loaded his retinue for the purpose of appreciation to what he had experienced. The prophet Elisha refused these material appreciations but needed the immaterial aspect of it. A heart full of praise to God. Yes, our hearts are filled with praise because God has revealed his saving power.

Truely, Naaman resolved not to serve any other God, but the God of Israel who had granted him healing through the prophet Elisha. We in many ways have received miracles from God ranging from all facets of our lives. The question is are we that appreciative from our hearts? Have we come to the conclusion of choosing only God as our everything?

Everything about us should be the reason for us to serve God alone just as Naaman decided to. There have been physical and spiritual healings. There have been special favors on us as individuals and as a nation that we should concentrate on God and serve Him well if not better. But what do we see? This is the time and moment people unlike Naaman do not want to have anything to do with God. If we are to put ourselves on a weighing scare, are we going to weigh better than Naaman or he will weigh more than us?

Jesus shows His curative power over our weaknesses by commanding the ten lepers to go and show themselves to the priest as a custom to accept them back to the society or community. These lepers were kept at the outskirt of the town so they were virtually not considered to be part of the society or community. That was the reason they saw their plight and need of Jesus at the time of their isolation from the people. So, they called on Jesus with a loud voice saying "...Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!" (Luke 17:13)

Jesus, like always granted them the healing they so desired and asked them to use the customary way to join the community. On their way, they realized their healing and one of them like Naaman (a Samaritan) returned to thank Him. The nine who refused to come back to Jesus are like the people we know around us and some of us who have every reason to thank God but refuse to. The Samaritan showed us the way to express our appreciation. Jesus asking about the rest of them indicates that He loves it when we are showing our gratitude. Let us sit down and look back in our lives and show our thankfulness to God.

Paul in his letter to Timothy gives the reason why he finds himself in prison. And he wants us in our little way to suffer a little bit for Christ because Christ Himself did everything for us. If He died for us, we need to die with Him. And whatever we go through because of Christ will end up in our victory with him since we have associated ourselves with Him.

May He grant us the grace to align ourselves with Him so that we will win the trophy at the end of our time. Amen. Peace!!!





