FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK Fr. Dominic Y. Afrifa

Going to pray in Humility

Readings:

Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18

Psalm 34:2-3, 17-19, 23

2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18

Luke 18:9-14

Mother church communicated with us last week on the message of God on how consistent we should be in prayer. The first reading where Moses raised up his hands was in prayer to God that His people (the Israelites) will be at advantage. When Moses was tired and could not hold unto his own hands, he needed the help of Joshua and Hur. We need to pray and then support each other so that we can win this spiritual and physical warfare together.

Jesus with a parable in the gospel encouraged us to be consistent in prayer without growing weary since God, the just judge will not frown His face upon those who call upon Him. We sometimes think God will not respond to us because we are not worthy but this taxe collector is proving to us that God listens.

This week, we have another direction on prayer but the theme is on the disposition and attitude towards prayer. Yes, prayer is important however the way we carry ourselves in prayer is very necessary when it comes to God answering our prayer. The question I have for myself and you is that WHAT IS OUR DISPOSITION AND ATTITUDE TOWARDS GOD THIS WEEKEND AS WE COME INTO THE PRESENCE OF GOD?

Ben Sirach in the first reading of today is acknowledging the justice of God and how God shows no favoritism. God is not deaf like human beings for us to say that I have prayed but God didn't hear. According to Ben, the category of people in society that we human beings will discriminate against (poor, orphans and widows) are listened to when they call on God and acknowledge His place in their lives. It is through prayer that these people become great at the very moment they confess their insignificance before God. This does not mean that all who find themselves in situations like that prays to God and they receive what they asked for. Some people at an advantage (the rich and powerful) can also lower themselves and acknowledge their insignificance before God and receive what they need and want.

"...The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds; it does not rest till it reaches its goal, nor will it withdraw till the Most-High responds..." (Sirach 35:21) we need to understand that the LOWLY here is not the weak in society but the humble person before God. So, the prayer of the humble

pierces the clouds... this will help us to answer the question I asked, what is our disposition before God this weekend?

Jesus gives us a story of a prayer He witnessed for us to learn and manage our attitudes and dispositions before God. In the eyes of his contemporaries, the pharisee of the gospel of today, was a good man and the taxe collector was a sinner. But as we all know God looks at the heart while we human beings look at the appearance.

The one who disposed himself as a sinner with humility before God, ended up being justified by God. His prayers pierced the clouds and went home with joy in the presence of God. But the one who throws his waste about, left the presence of God without his prayer being heard.

We don't come to the presence of God and tell Him what we have been able to achieve. Even at all, what we are able to achieve is by his grace. The sins we are able to avoid are as a result of His bountiful love and mercy. Instead of this pharisee praising God for what God has helped him to achieve, he was taking the glory and wallowing in the good he has been able to do. To God be the glory, should be what we say and in a humble and repentant way, submit ourselves as the weak and insignificant people before God.

Prayer should be seen and known as our encounter with God. Those around us and how they see us when it comes to our relationship does not matter. We have to humble ourselves before our maker so that He who sees from afar and probes our hearts will reward us. The moment our attention will shift from God, we will try to prove our holiness before men. But that will not earn us any good.

This pharisee looked down on the tax collector. Sometimes we do not only show off what we are but we also put others down. He said, I am not like the rest of humanity-greedy, dishonest, adulterous-. Yes, He might not have been any of these vices he mentioned but he was not better than that humble person who acknowledged his insignificance before God. That tax collector might have been very good in all the areas the pharisee mentioned but humility ruled his life and so he stood afar off and offered his prayer.

Many a time, the holier-than-thou-people offer long and uninterrupted prayers. They will say so many things. But that is not what God is looking for. The humble person says the shortest prayer and God who knows our needs looking at our hearts will respond because such humble prayers will not stop till the Most High hears. Let us learn from the prayer of the tax collector and be humble.

Paul at his last moment put his faith in God alone. His end was near, he said he holds nothing against those who left him to stand alone during his trials. Would we do that? Many people are not in our good books because when we needed their help they turned their backs to us. We are not ready to let that go. Let us learn from Paul who even prayed for them. Paul could do this because of the strength he found in prayer. May we always rely on God for all our needs Amen. Peace!!!


