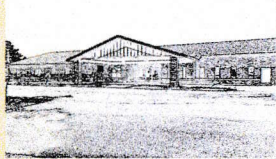

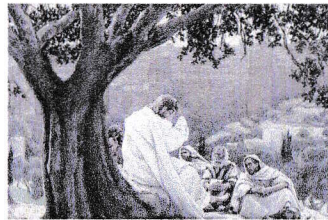

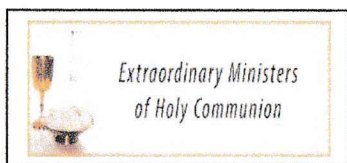

From the Pastor's Desk

THE LORD'S DAY

Readings:

Malachi 3:19–20

Psalm 98:5–9

2 Thessalonians 3:7–12

Luke 21:5–19

We have one more Sunday and in that Sunday; we will celebrate the Kingship of Christ then the church's calendar year will be over. So it is in the right direction that we hold onto our faith in Jesus Christ, the resurrection of the dead and life after death. That is why we cannot continue with the Epicurean way of life or the Sadducees Christianity. Avoiding this kind of life will usher us into a new life that is described in the book of the prophet Malachi as we heard from this weekend first reading.

Our attention is drawn to the fact of end time where God is going to execute His judgment for both those who fear His name and those who are proud and evil doers. According to the prophet there's a day coming that God is going to set on fire people who engage in sin and evil things. But then there is going to be a great reward for those who honored God. And as others fall sick and suffer those favored by God will receive healing from the rays of the sunshine.

The image of fire and blazing oven signifies the wrath of God to punish evil doers. And so, getting to the specifics, the prophet warns the proud and the wicked and he directs a message of encouragement to those who live upright lives in respect to God's name.

In the gospel Jesus speaks of the end times and the signs that will precede His second coming. He mentioned that before the destruction of the world or the end of time we will go through persecutions. Family members will hand over to the

authorities their own. Everyone will hate us. But in all these not a hair of our head will be lost. If we persevere, we will save ourselves.

We are most of the time overwhelmed when friends and church members turn their backs on us. But we should not because Jesus predicted our family members. When we are faced with these things they are to help us to raise our eyes to God and pray for the strength to persevere. Yes, we are in hard times. We are not in good times. People are trying to show us or shift our attention to different places of worship as Jesus spoke about, however, He commanded us to stay put and wait on Him.

People were praising how magnificent the temple in Jerusalem was at the time of Jesus and a prophesy about it came from Jesus that "... all that you see here, a day will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down..." This prophesy was fulfilled when the temple was destroyed. This can be seen in another way that can be associated with our personality. Today we are so strong, beautiful, we wear nice things, people praise our beauty and so forth. This is to tell us that a time will come that we will not be that strong and beautiful as we are now and so what we need to do is to prepare ourselves for that day.

This does not mean we have to sit aloof doing nothing. Not working for our food. Paul, using himself and his companions as an example has proven that even though he was waiting for the second coming of our lord Jesus Christ, they kept on working so hard to feed themselves. They didn't not rely on others for their living.

He spoke against busy body people and encouraged everyone to work for what he or she will eat. There is a saying that " the devil finds work for the idle hands" we need not to stay idle and engage ourselves with things that are not associated with heaven. While we wait the second coming of the lord, lets engage ourselves with something. If anyone will not work, that person should not eat. We will keep ourselves busy in anticipation of the Lord's coming with prayers and fasting, almsgiving and good deeds. May the lord help us. Amen. Peace!!!
