



#### The Solemnity of Christ the King

## From the Pastor's Desk

#### WHO IS YOUR KING, LORD AND MASTER?

2 Samuel 5:1–3 Psalm 122:1–5 Colossians 1:12–20 Luke 23:35–43

Last week I brought to your notice during my introduction that this is the last Sunday of ordinary time, however this weekend is devoted to celebrate the Kingship of Christ. There are various names given to this day among them are: The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, Christ the King, Christ the King Sunday or Reign of Christ Sunday. This is a feast in the liturgical year which emphasizes the true kingship of Christ. And since the kingship of Christ has some human trace from King David, the king par excellence, the book of Samuel talks about how the leadership of the Israelites approached the young David with a request. They illustrated the achievements of David for already leading the people and bringing them back and then the promise God had made to make him a King.

They therefore appealed to him to lead them as a king. King David agreed to lead the people and God made a covenant with him that He will establish a house and after his death he will raise another king from his loins who will rule for ever. ...! will raise your offspring to succeed you, your own flesh and blood, and i will establish his kingdom...! will establish his kingdom forever, I will be his father, and he will be my son. (2 Samuel 7:12-14) We are all aware that Solomon successfully succeeded his father David but he died. And so that prophesy was about Jesus Christ who is also a descendant of David whose Kingship will last forever. Jesus is not only a king with territories. His kingdom has no boundaries like the chiefs and political leaders of our time. He actually the king of all the kings.

In the gospel we hear that the rulers of that time sneered at Jesus. In our days people do same when we preach and live Christian lives faithfully. They think we don't know what we are doing and that it is a waste of time. We have some young people in today's life acting like the soldiers who jeered at Jesus. Our fellow Christians even sometimes get involved and they are wrong because this criminal received salvation at the grace of God when he showed respect to the Sacred.

The grace that was available for this criminal who received the promise of Paradise from Jesus was very great. I am convinced and always say that the good that we are able to do as Christians are as a result of the abundance graces God gifts us. The criminal who also joined in the sneering of Jesus was not having that grace I am talking about here. We are given; however, it is left with us to accept it or not. The one who jeered at Jesus might also have had the same grace, but he didn't make good use of what he had. Many Christians fail to use their God given talents and graces therefore the end result is they lose heaven.

Jesus as a king pronounced judgement while He was on his throne: ... today you will be with me in Paradise. Kings and presidents sit on their presidential seats and sign treaties or give orders. Jesus gave his order or judgement on the cross to see someone in a world or place that is not in our world. That tells us that His kingship unlike those we have here is material and immaterial.

Leadership as far as God's kingdom is a God-given not elected by constituents and senators. However, since Jesus of Nazareth is the man in whom God dwells in such a way that he is called the son of God and even simply GOD, we do not have to worry about His invisible God. Jesus is king but His kingship is different. He is the image of the invisible God. Everything was created through Him and for him. He is before all things even first born from the dead. He is the head of the body, the church.

The head of the body "the church" the article here THE signifies that there is one CHURCH. And for that matter Jesus is the head. If we want to have the fullness of God, then it is found in Jesus Christ.

Like Paul said we need to be grateful to God for giving us the opportunity to be part of this body which Christ is the head. As if that was not enough, He has delivered us from the power of darkness and brought us to His marvelous light. We pray that He will keep us free from sin and keep us safe as king by protecting us always. Amen. Peace!!!
