Pastor's Update

Greetings to all and blessings.

The Priest's Convocation last week in Harrisonburg was a grand event. It has been a while since we've seen our brother priests assigned to parishes in the western part of our Commonwealth. I was able to chat with almost all of the African priests who were assigned to Saint Bede as parochial vicars: Fathers John Asare, Charles Sebalamau, Alex Muudu, Herman Katongole, Francis Boateng, and Peter Naah. They all send their greetings and thanks and spoke warmly of your welcome to them. We also saw Father John Baab who looks good and shared with us that he has presided over only one funeral since being in Harrisonburg.

We received word that the mosaicists have purchased tickets and have been cleared to come to install eight more mosaics in mid-November. They will set up a workshop in the commons (opposite the sacristy). Plans are in the works for a workshop or two so we can better understand the elaborate process, skill, and artistry involved in this ancient art form. Benvenuto, artisti Italiani.

Mark your calendars and save the date for Our Candlelight All Souls Day Vespers on November 2 at 7:00 pm. We will remember and pray for all who have died, but we will remember, by name, those parish members who died since last November 2.

Our prayer will end with a procession to the Columbarium and a reception in the Commons. It's a most moving evening. Join us. Speaking of the Columbarium, a new wall with individual niches was installed yesterday. If you get a chance to see it, please do. It's a beautiful addition.
