fidelity, inscribe their name into the Book of the Elect, which will be signed by the bishop at the Rite of Election.

On Sunday, they will travel to Norfolk where the Bishop will preside over the **Rite of Election** for the Eastern Vicariate. The Rite of Election is held three times this weekend in our diocese, once in the Western Vicariate, once in the Central Vicariate, and once in the Eastern Vicariate. The Rite of Election is usually celebrated at the beginning of Lent and signifies the beginning of their final preparation for the sacraments of initiation. At this Rite, their sponsors and catechists affirm to the bishop their readiness for the sacraments, and the catechumen affirms their intentions to enter this final phase of preparation and to come to the waters of baptism at the Easter Vigil. The Church, represented by the bishop, then declares them The Elect. The Church's election is founded on the election of God, these people have been chosen by God for baptism into the Catholic Faith this Easter.

Please pray for these catechumens as they become our newly Elect and continue their faith journey and preparation to receive the sacraments of initiation at Easter. Look for the Book of the Elect which will be displayed by the Cross in the Commons during Lent.
