





EASTER TRIDUUM 2023

The Easter Triduum is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. It begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, reaches its high point at the Easter Vigil and concludes Easter Sunday evening. These celebrations are of the utmost importance in the spiritual and pastoral life of the church. These three days are counted not from midnight, but from sunset to sunset the way the Bible reckons days in the creation story.

HOLY THURSDAY

We begin the sacred Easter Triduum on Thursday Evening, and devote ourselves to the remembrance of the Last Supper. At this supper, the Lord Jesus, offered his body and blood to the Father under the appearances of bread and wine, gave them to the apostles to eat and drink, then enjoined them and their successors in the priesthood to offer them in turn. This Mass is the memorial of the institution of the Eucharist and institution of the priesthood-by which Christ's mission and sacrifice are perpetuated in the world. In addition, this Mass is the memorial of that love by which the Lord loved us even to death. The exterior bells are rung during the singing of the Gloria and then remain silent until the Gloria at the Easter Vigil. In the mandatum (washing of the feet), we are reminded by Jesus that what he has done, we also must do. On this night the Church collects the Lenten alms, which are the money and goods we share with the poor that have been put aside throughout Lent. All are encouraged to bring their rice bowls and other offerings such as food for the poor. Unlike Sundays, this collection is for the poor only. After Holy Communion, with chant and incense as signs of honor, the Blessed Sacrament is processed to the Altar of Repose in Kaplan Parish Hall for solemn adoration until Midnight. The faithful are encouraged to spend time during the night in adoration. The Blessed Sacrament is reserved for distribution on Good Friday when no Mass will be celebrated. After Mass the altar and church are stripped.

GOOD FRIDAY

On this day, what had long been promised in sign and figures was at last revealed and brought to fulfillment. The true lamb replaced the symbolic lamb, and the many offerings of the past gave way to the single sacrifice of Christ. For it was from the side of Christ, as he sleep the sleep of death upon the cross, there came forth the sublime sacrament of the whole Church.

The Church strongly recommends the participation of the faithful in Morning Prayer on both Good Friday and Holy Saturday as the church continues to keep watch.

The Celebration of the Lord's Passion consists of three parts: Liturgy of the Word, Holy Communion, and Veneration of the Cross. The community of believers gathers in silence. There is no opening greeting or sign of the cross, since the liturgy really began with Mass last night. It has no dismissal or blessing because this liturgy continues through the Easter Vigil. All are invited to come forward to venerate the cross. You may remove your shoes, like Moses before the burning bush. The collection at this liturgy is for the support of Christians in the Holy Land.



HOLY SATURDAY

Today, the church is, as it were, at the Lord's tomb, meditating on his passion and death, and on his descent into hell, and awaiting his resurrection with prayer and fasting.

The Church strongly recommends the participation of the people in 9am Morning Prayer on both Good Friday and Holy Saturday as the church continues to keep watch.

The blessing of Easter food links the Eucharistic table with the family table. Families may bring to Morning Prayer some foods from home that will be shared at your Easter meals. Children may bring Easter baskets for the Church's blessing. The final preparation rites of the Elect, those to be baptized this evening, are also celebrated at Morning Prayer.

EASTER VIGIL AND EASTER SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S RESURRECTION

At the vigil all the meanings of light at Christmas and Epiphany are gathered here and given new force. The light of Christ has descended into the deep darkness of death to lead us into the light of eternal life. This night is a night of vigil for the Lord, and, as the memorial of the holy night of Christ's resurrection, the Vigil celebrated is the mother of all holy vigils. The Church awaits the Lord's resurrection and celebrates it with the sacraments of Christian initiation.

It begins with the Service of Light, the kindling of the new fire, and the preparation and lighting of the Paschal Candle. The candle is carried in procession into the darkened church, the Light of Christ is sung and all light their candles from the Paschal Candle. This is followed by the singing of the Exsultet, Liturgy of the Word, and singing of the Gloria accompanied by the ringing of the exterior bells (silent since Holy Thursday). The Liturgy of Baptism follows and culminates in the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Easter Sunday continues to celebrate the wonderful mystery of Christ's Resurrection. It also invites the faithful to participate in this mystery by renewing their Baptism, and recognizing their call to live in newness of life.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

On all Sundays, we together express a summary of the central truths of our Christian faith in the words of the Creed. The Church recommends that during the Sundays of Lent and Easter, we use the Apostles' Creed rather than the Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed. The Apostles' Creed is the baptismal symbol of the Church. It was formulated from the questions asked those about to be baptized at the Easter Vigil and those same questions asked of us when renewing our baptismal promises. The words are few, but the mysteries they contain are great. Let us receive them with a sincere heart and be faithful to them.

SANCTUARY CANDLE

The sanctuary candle burns for the Blessed Sacrament. If you would like to have a loved one remembered at this time, please contact the Parish Office to reserve a week.

La Bendición de las Canastas de Comida de Pascua será el Sábado Santo en la Iglesia. Usted trae su canasta a las 8:45am, y la pone en las escaleras del altar. La bendición de las canastas ocurre al final del Servicio de Oración de las 9 am.

Las raíces de esta tradición se remontan a la historia de Polonia a principios del siglo XII, pero este ritual católico ha sido adoptado por personas de todos los orígenes étnicos que disfrutan de esta rica tradición simbólica.

La bendición de la Comida de Pascua es una ocasión festiva. Las familias se enorgullecen de preparar una canasta de buen gusto con paños decorativos, cintas de colores, vegetación y flores para simbolizar la primavera, la renovación y la Resurrección. Si bien los gustos varían, las canastas de nuestros hermanos polacos generalmente contienen carnes ahumadas, salchichas, mantequilla, rábano picante, queso, pan, sal, huevos decorados, golosinas y agua bendita— cada una de estos elementos tiene un significado especial asociado con la Muerte y Resurrección de Jesús. ¡Y no falta una vela blanca que simboliza a Jesús, la Luz del Mundo!
