





WHY HAVEN'T CATHOLIC CHURCHES GONE THE WAY OF DISPOSABLE CUPS FOR WINE DISTRIBUTION?

If a Catholic has ever attended a Protestant worship service and saw the communion service that was offered for that community, one of the things that might have stood out was the use of small, disposable cups for distributing the wine or grape juice. This is in stark contrast to the precious metal chalices used in Catholic churches during the Mass. Although practices for Protestant Christians can vary (ranging from large shared chalices, to personal-use cups, to dipping the bread in the wine/grape juice), the norms governing Catholic practices are fairly direct: "Sacred vessels are to be made from precious metal. If they are made from metal that rusts or from a metal less precious than gold, then ordinarily they should be gilded on the inside. In the Dioceses of the United States of America, sacred vessels may also be made from other solid materials that, according to the common estimation in each region, are precious ... they are to have bowls of nonabsorbent material" (nos. 328-330). Rather than being a commentary on the beliefs or practices of those other communities, these rules are intended to highlight the reverence that Catholics have for the bread and wine consecrated at Mass, which become the Body and Blood the Lord.

GOSPEL MEDITATION | MAY 7 2023

May 14, 2023 6th Sunday of Easter

My dad was adopted as a baby. It's a big part of my family's story. His birth mother placed him in a Catholic orphanage not long after birth. A young couple longing for a baby strolled among the bassinets. My father, then only a few months old, looked at the husband and smiled. The man said, "That's my son." They took him home and the family grew. This moment of adoption was a wonderful truth they celebrated even when my dad was a young boy. They told him, "You're even more special than the other children, because we chose you to be our son." My dad's eyes well up with tears of gratitude whenever he tells the story, even eighty-three years later.

What is your story? Do we think or act like unwanted orphans? Who do we believe ourselves to be? As we continue to ponder Jesus' resurrection, we hear him say to us this Sunday, "I will not leave you orphans." God doesn't leave us alone like spiritual orphans. The power that raised Jesus from the dead is the Holy Spirit, who is also called the Spirit of Adoption. He chooses us to be His children, to share God's life forever. He gives us a future filled with hope.

We are not orphans anymore! This Easter, that's the story we should share with others. It's the true story we are living right now.

En este VI Domingo de Pascua, el Señor nos pide ser coherentes en la fe. Es decir, si alguien dice y afirma que ama al Señor y no práctica lo que afirma, no le ama realmente. ¿Desea saber si ama al Señor como dice? Si cumple los mandamientos, va por buen camino, pero si no lo hace, se engaña usted mismo; aunque rece el rosario y novenas, sepa la Biblia de memoria y vaya a Misa con frecuencia. El Señor Jesús lo dice directo: "Si ustedes me aman, guardarán mis mandamientos" (Juan 14,15). Muchos creyentes dicen cumplirlos, pero obran lo opuesto. Jesús insiste aun más con lo siguiente: "Y yo rogaré al Padre y les dará otro Protector que permanecerá siempre con ustedes" (Juan 14,15-16). ¿Qué más podríamos desear?
