




WHY DO PRIESTS KISS THE ALTAR AT THE START OF MASS?

Our churches and chapels are filled with symbols. We might think of the more common symbols (like the crucifix, statues, stained-glass windows, vestment color and altar cloths) as well as major symbols (such as the paschal candle and the baptismal font). But there are some things that we can take for granted in our sacred spaces, because unfortunately, they seem to just be part of the building, including three of the main symbols of our liturgy: the ambo (lectern), the chair for the priest celebrant, and the altar.

These three objects are placed in a specially designated area called the sanctuary. They are the places where the Word of God is proclaimed, where the priest prays and presides at the celebration, and where the bread and wine are offered by the priest during the Eucharistic Prayer. Although each of these objects is sacred because of the role they play in our worship, the altar holds a special place. In a document containing the rules and instructions for the Mass – the "General Instruction of the Roman Missal" — we read: "The altar on which the Sacrifice of the Cross is made present under sacramental signs is also the table of the Lord to which the People of God is called together to participate in the Mass, as well as the center of the thanksgiving that is accomplished throughout the Eucharist" (no. 296).

One of the ways that we recognize the importance of the altar is when the priest and deacon kiss the altar at the beginning of Mass. Kissing is an ancient act of devotion. Remember, we also kiss the cross on Good Friday, and the deacon or priest kisses the "Book of the Gospels" after the Gospel is proclaimed. This act of devotion reminds us that the altar is a symbol of Jesus, the "living stone" (see 1 Peter 2:4), the foundation stone of our faith. It is a symbol gesture, but it is a powerful reminder of the One on whom our faith is built and in whose name we gather as the "household of faith" (see Galatians 6:10).

GOSPEL MEDITATION | MAY 28, 2023

PENTECOST

I hope you'll acknowledge with me a simple fact: it's not normal to have tongues of fire "part and come to rest" on people. It is actually pretty strange. Yet that is precisely what we celebrate in this feast of Pentecost. How can this mean something to us in our daily lives?

Jews had a tradition that heaven is a temple made of bricks of fire. So, through the apostles, the heavenly temple is coming to earth. But this fire looks like tongues, not bricks. That means that heavenly speech will be crucial to building a dwelling place for God on earth among men and women. So, it's no surprise when the apostles begin to speak in a miraculous way that is understood by all language groups. They are speaking of what God has done in and through Jesus: bringing heaven to earth and uniting all peoples to God and to each other.

How often our speech divides: gossip, slander, insults, and so on. How strange and rare it is when people speak in ways that truly unite instead of divide. Imagine how powerful it would be if you and I began to speak at home, at work, and in our community in a way that made people hear heavenly speech. Imagine if you spoke of the mighty deeds of God in a way that everyone could understand. That's precisely what the Holy Spirit descends upon us to do. Ask Him to come as a tongue of fire to you once again, and He will. Then speak!






ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION

As we report regularly, many of our brothers and sisters struggle to feed their families. Here at Saint Bede we have a regular collection and food drop off bin for the House of Mercy. We have another opportunity coming up, supporting the ministry of FISH. Since 1975, FISH has provided food, clothing, and small housewares to persons in need who live in Williamsburg, James City County and York County. FISH is a volunteer-operated, non-profit organization that was started by and is still supported by a number of Saint Bede parishioners. Pick up a bag on the weekend of May 27/28 and bring it back on June 3/4 to the Knight of Columbus volunteers in the parking lot and on the circle drive. Thank you!

FISH FACTS


- In the first four months of 2023, we have served over 2,500 different people.
- On average, we serve about 300 children a month (under age 18).
- We have the traditional "average" families: two adults raising one or two children.
- We have single-parent families with children.
- We have large families, some with ten or more in the household.
- We have many of singles: some young people who are trying to make it on their own; some folks living in their vehicle; some people who have just been released from incarceration.
- We have grandparents raising grandchildren and other multi-generational households.
- We have families who are new to the United States and they come from all over the world.
- We don't ask about job status, but from what clients tell us in conversation, we know that many are employed often with more than one job.
- We are seeing unusually high numbers of folks coming to FISH for the first time. In 2019 we saw an average of 30 new households in a month; in 2022, 41 in a month. So far this year, it's an average of almost 60 new households a month.
