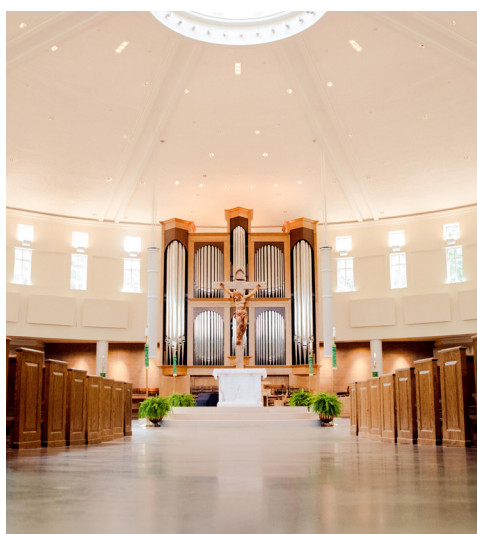

HOW MANY TIMES A DAY CAN A PERSON RECEIVE COMMUNION?

To find an answer to this question, we need to turn to the Church's Code of Canon Law. Here we read, "One who has received the blessed Eucharist may receive it again on the same day only within a Eucharistic celebration in which that person participates ..." (no. 917). This tells us that the standard answer would be that we can receive communion twice in a day.

Having said that, we also want to be sure that we pay attention to the entire instruction. The phrase "within a Eucharistic celebration in which that person participates" is important. It means a) that we always have to think of receiving communion as being within a celebration of the Mass and b) we have to be participants in that celebration – we can't simply show up "in time" for communion.

So, when would this rule apply?

For example, if you attend Mass on a Saturday morning and then take part in the Sunday Vigil Mass on Saturday evening, you could licitly receive communion at both celebrations. Or, another example, if you receive communion at a wedding or funeral Mass, you could also receive communion at a daily Mass or Sunday Vigil celebrated on the same day. We always want to be sure that we observe the rules for fasting from food and drink before receiving the eucharist (see Code of Canon Law, no. 919).

We should also remember that the Code of Canon Law instructs that anyone who is in danger of death or seriously ill may also receive communion a second time (no. 91, §2).

THE PRECIOUS BLOOD RETURNS

AARON RENNINGER, DIRECTOR OF LITURGY AND MUSIC



In recent times, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the policy in the Diocese of Richmond has been to refrain from distributing the Precious Blood during Holy Communion. Bishop Barry Knestout has now granted to pastors the decision for the possibility of distribution of Holy Communion under both species of bread and wine at Mass. The Catholic Church maintains the doctrine of Concomitance-Christ is wholly present in the Eucharist (Body and Blood), whether one receives under the species of bread only, or of wine only.

Beginning at weekend Masses on June 11, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), and Sundays going forward, reception of the Precious Blood from the chalice will be offered to communicants who desire to receive Holy Communion under both kinds. Prudence and courtesy dictate that a communicant with a contagious illness, whether a mild cold or something more serious, should refrain from reception from the chalice. We ask for your patience as we judge the need for the appropriate amount of wine to be consecrated for Sunday Mass.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) published in 2002 "Norms for the Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion under both kinds in the Dioceses of the United States of America". A few citations follow:

From the first days of the Church's celebration of the Eucharist, Holy Communion consisted of the reception of both species in fulfillment of the Lord's command to "take and eat . . . take and drink." The distribution of Holy Communion to the faithful under both kinds was thus the norm for more than a millennium of Catholic liturgical practice. The practice of Holy Communion under both kinds at Mass continued until the late eleventh century, when the custom of distributing the Eucharist to the faithful under the form of bread alone began to grow.

In 1963, the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council authorized the extension of the faculty for Holy Communion under both kinds in *Sacrosanctum Concilium*. The Council's decision to restore Holy Communion under both kinds at the bishop's discretion...enjoys an even more generous application in the third typical edition of the *Missale Romanum*:

Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and clearer expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord, as also the connection between the Eucharistic banquet and the eschatological banquet in the Kingdom of the Father.

The extension of the faculty for the distribution of Holy Communion under both kinds does not represent a change in the Church's immemorial beliefs concerning the Holy Eucharist. Rather, today the Church finds it salutary to restore a practice, when appropriate, that for various reasons was not opportune when the Council of Trent was convened in 1545. But with the passing of time, and under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the reform of the Second Vatican Council has resulted in the restoration of a practice by which the faithful are again able to experience "a fuller sign of the Eucharistic banquet."

Gloria al Padre, al Hijo y al Espíritu Santo. Como era en el principio, ahora y siempre, por los siglos de los siglos. Amén. Esta oración la hemos aprendido desde niños. La rezamos al finalizar las oraciones. Es una alabanza a la divinidad, especialmente a la Trinidad. Tres personas distintas y un solo Dios verdadero. Diversidad y unidad al mismo tiempo. Porque eres justo en todo lo que has hecho, todas tus obras son verdaderas, rectos todos tus caminos, y verdaderos todos tus juicios (Daniel 3,26-27). Solo nos resta en todas las actividades y trabajo invocar a la Trinidad. ¡Que Dios uno y Trino viva en los corazones de toda la humanidad y llene de paz y armonía al mundo!

How many of you remember this: At almost every major sporting event from the late 1970's through the early 1990's he was there, Rollen Stewart. Was he really evangelizing? What message was he trying to convey? What do we think when we see messages today? Are they leading us to a deeper relationship with God?
