



Cass Benton, one of the oldest and hillier areas of Hines Park, has been popular since the 1920's when it was gifted to the Park Trustees by Cassius Benton, a former Wayne County Road Commissioner.

This picnic area is nestled under some of the largest beech and oak trees found in the park. It offers a picnic shelter and play structure. The area can hold over 100 people. The historic comfort station is a beautiful Tudor structure with slate-covered gables and oak lintels.

If you prefer to attend the 11:30 a.m. Mass in Church, Father Peter Opera, from St. Mary's Hospital, will be the Presider. I will Preside at the Picnic Mass. 

Altar Server Training

Mrs. Skene and I will be holding a training session for **new Altar Servers** on **Saturday, September 10, at 1:00 p.m., in the church**. The training will take just over an hour. We ask that parents be present for the training session. This is the only one we will hold in the fall due to all of the weddings and other events that are scheduled

The Mass times your child serves at will be according to your stated family preference. The schedule is done about every two months, so you will know in advance when your young person is assigned to serve. Parents can then do a group email to other families if a sub is necessary for a certain date.

Having our young people serve in this way during the Eucharistic Liturgy provides for them a very unique way in which to participate in the Mass! If there are any current servers who would like a refresher course, you are most welcome to join us. Don't forget to mark your calendar!


I am reaching out to all Youth who have an interest in making videos and editing them. We would meet to discuss ideas for the video and how to make them

September Theme: The Dignity of Work and the Right of Workers

An excerpt from Michael Hovey's brochure Major Themes of Catholic Social Teachings

"Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God's creation. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected- the right of productive work, to decent and fair wages, to organize and join unions, to private property, and to economic initiative. The economy exists to serve people."



It came to the pastoral staff's attention that after Masses, the last couple of weekends, we have had several different individuals and families standing outside in the church parking lot looking for financial assistance. Even though our hearts go out to those in need, the pastoral staff ask that you do not give them any monetary assistance directly. One of

the reasons we established our St. Vincent de Paul conference was to assist those in our parish community. While it is tempting to hand someone in need money, we hope that you will instead inform him/her about our St. Vincent de Paul conference which will be glad to assist them if funds are available. Members of the conference will meet with him/her to discuss their specific need(s). They will then either refer them to the proper agencies for assistance or assist them directly, if possible. We encourage you to give those individuals our parish paper and direct them to our St. Vincent de Paul number. Please tell them that our members respond back within 24 hours after the message is received. There are also informational tri-fold brochures available to pass out located in the ministry display case near the glass door entrance way. Feel free to grab one and hand it to those in need.

If you still feel like you need to provide monetary assistance then donate to our St Vincent de Paul conference. You can do this through the church envelopes. We have specific Christian Service/St. Vincent de Paul envelope collections four times a year or simply write a check made out to Our Lady of Victory-St. Vincent de Paul Conference #437 and drop it off or mail it to our parish office. Your money will assist those in the area.




Archdiocesan Chorus of Detroit



Canonization of Mother Teresa of Calcutta

Mother Teresa was born Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu in Skopje, Macedonia, on August 27, 1910. She entered the convent at an early age, and became a missionary in India as a teacher.

When she was 36, she felt the call to minister to the poorest of the poor in India. By 1950, she founded the Missionaries of Charity who still serve the poor around the world including the city of Detroit. Their mission is to take care of "the hungry, the naked, the homeless, the crippled, the blind, the lepers, all those people who feel unwanted, unloved, uncared for throughout society, people that have become a burden to the society and are shunned by everyone". Among the many honors she received during her lifetime was the Nobel Prize for Peace in 1979.

As we celebrate her canonization in Rome, it is good to remember her true legacy. She was an ordinary woman who did the extraordinary by looking for the will of God in all that she did. Always open to the way he showed and learning to rely upon his help and mercy, she brought to many his face and unconditional love.

When asked why she did what she did she would simply say she saw Jesus in every face she saw. She would teach this belief by holding up the fingers of one hand and counting off each as she spoke five simple words, "You Did It To Me."

This week encourage your family members to remember what St. Teresa taught. Sometimes it is a struggle but when we lean on God for his insight and vision we can find him in each other. Strive to minister to each other and be attentive to each other's needs. Then take this lesson to school or work. Lean on Jesus to help you know how.

Preventing Back Injuries and Healthy Back Care Posture

The human spine is made up of small bones called vertebrae, forming a long, stretched out 'S' curve with two curves to the front and one to the back. The vertebrae are stacked on top of each other to form a column. Between each vertebra is a cushion known as a disc. The vertebrae are held together by ligaments, and muscles which are attached to the vertebrae by bands of tissue called tendons. When your back is not in this neutral 'S' position, the muscles, ligaments and joints have to work harder:

- Fatigue, discomfort and injury can result from awkward posture.
- Every time you bend over, lift a heavy object, or sit leaning forward, stress is placed on the components of the back and spine.

Techniques to Reduce Stress to the Lower Back:

- Avoid lifting and bending whenever possible:
 - o Place objects up off the floor. Set objects down on a table or other elevated surface instead of on the floor, so you won't have to reach down and pick it up.
 - Raise/lower shelves. The best zone for lifting is between your shoulders and waist. Put heavier objects on shelves at waist level, lighter objects on lower or higher levels.
 - o Use carts and dollies to move objects, instead of carrying them.
 - o Use cranes, hoists, lift tables, and other lift-assist devices whenever possible.

Use Proper Lifting Procedures

You cannot always avoid lifting, but there are ways to reduce the amount of pressure placed
on the back. By bending the knees, you keep your spine in a better alignment, which
removes the lever principle forces.

Follow these steps when lifting:

- 1. Take a balanced stance with feet about shoulder width-apart. One foot can be behind the object and the other next to it.
- 2. Squat down to lift the object, but keep your heels off the floor. Get as close to the object as you can.
- 3. Use your palms (not just your fingers) to get a secure grip on the load. Make sure you will be able to maintain a hold on the object without switching your grip.
- 4. Lift gradually (without jerking) using your leg, abdominal and buttock muscles and keeping the load as close to you as possible. Keep your chin tucked in so as to keep a relatively straight back and neck in alignment.
- 5. Once standing, change directions by positioning your feet in the direction you want to go, and then turn your whole body. Avoid twisting at your waist while carrying the load.
- 6. When it is time to put the load down, use these same guidelines in reverse.
