

Around the Table

The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

My Dear Friends,

In the experience of each of us there has no doubt been an occasion when we heard somewhat vaguely and unclearly the sound of our name. This might have happened to you when you were sitting in a crowd of people. Then you may have hushed everyone and said, "I think I can hear someone calling me." A number of people might have replied, "I didn't hear anything." So, you went back to your conversation or whatever you were doing. But then again you suddenly hushed the group, saying, "I'm sure someone is calling me." But once again you may have been reassured by the group that no one else heard anything. Then, with a laugh, you might say something like, "Well, I guess I'm just hearing things!" This same sensation can happen when you are alone and you hear your name not too clearly in the distance. There can even be a sense of discomfort about this until you can identify who it is that is calling you... if anyone. I have found myself, in such a situation asking loudly, "Hello, is someone calling me?" and if I hear in response someone saying that they've been looking for me, I feel relieved and reassured. Finally, I've identified the "voice" calling me.

In today's First Reading, we see something of the same discomfort of Samuel who has been staying in the Temple with the high priest Eli. At first, Samuel thought it was Eli who was calling him, and when Eli denied this Samuel was a little confused; he thought he might just be hearing things. And, as this happened at night, he then went to bed once again. But when it happened a third time, Eli began to realize that this was something different and perhaps unusual, that it was, in fact, God who was calling Samuel. And so, he told the boy what to reply to God: "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." Samuel, now clearly aware that he is being called, and by God, is prepared to listen to him.

I think that often, in our lives, we might wonder if we are called in any way or another. For many people life doesn't seem to require any special call from God nor does it take any special listening to respond. So, instead of being alert to "hear" some special call by God for us, we become closed to any such call.

Ideally, though, we would be like Samuel. When God calls us... speaks to us in our hearts, like Samuel, we will be listening and alert. We let God speak, recognizing ourselves as God's servants. Then we strive to carry out whatever it is that God asks us to do.

But sometimes we can become quite lost in our everyday activities and we do not hear God over the voices around us. Occasionally, we may have a vague sense that we heard something in the background, but we need, then, to stop and pay attention. We need to be ready to stop, silence our minds and LISTEN. The calling can come to us in many ways. For most of us it is not dramatic, perhaps not even too obvious, but vague, as it was first experienced by Samuel. But by our constant alertness and effort to hear even the smallest voice and to respond to it, we stand a much greater chance of hearing and discerning the Lord's call for us.

Trying hard to calm my mind and to open my heart, that I might LISTEN, Father Denis

Help each other to listen carefully in conversation, those things that may be unsaid, the requests that are made, feelings, intuitions, and thought patterns. And then, like Andrew and Peter take whatever that call is to Jesus to help you understand its intent and how you are to respond. He invites us to come and see. He wishes to shed his light on our lives. It may be something we have been ignoring, or have misunderstood. It may be a call to view life in a new way. It may be a call to open our hearts to another's situation and be Jesus to that person.

However you hear your call, pray that you will be ready like Samuel to tell our Lord "Here I am." This is how we live out our baptism. This is how we respond to the love God has showered upon us; by following Jesus, through the highs and the lows of family life.

Take the invitation from Jesus. Come and see what he intends for you and your family and do not forget to remind each other that you are never alone! You are always under the guiding care of God.

While the way of Jesus may not be easy, those who follow will find with his help the way to weather every storm. With him one can find reason to rejoice at every blessing he has bestowed and the path he has placed before you! His call to follow is filled with love. Once you have answered it you will never want to follow another!





UPDATED PLAYER PARTICIPATION RULING: Beginning in 2018, CYO will once again allow players in baseball and softball to participate in the same sport in any other organized league with the exception of playing on a Junior High School, Middle School or Elementary School team.

Caring for Your Toothbrush

How Should Toothbrushes Be Cared For?

In removing soft plaque and other debris from the teeth, toothbrushes become contaminated with bacteria, blood, saliva, oral debris and toothpaste. Because of this, it recommended to rinse one's toothbrush thoroughly with running tap water following each brushing.

Recommended toothbrush care:

- Do not share toothbrushes. Toothbrushes can have germs on them even after rinsing that could raise the risk of infection especially with people whose immune systems are compromised.
- After brushing, rinse your toothbrush with tap water, until it is completely clean, let it air dry and store it in an upright position. If more than one toothbrush is stored in the container, do not let them touch.
- Soaking toothbrushes in disinfectant solutions is not necessary. It could spread germs under the right conditions.
- Avoid storing toothbrushes in closed containers. This could cause bacteria to grow.
- Replace toothbrush every 3-4 months or sooner if bristles are worn or bent. Worn toothbrushes may carry more germs.

- Wet your hands with clean running water (warm or cold), apply soap.
- Lather hands together by rubbing them with soap. Be sure to lather backs of hands and between fingers and under nails.
- Scrub your hands for 20 seconds.
- Rinse your hands well under clean running water.
- Dry your hands using a clean towel, hand blower or let them air dry.




