


Around the Table

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

We generally surround something that is precious with clues and other indications that give evidence of its value. The beauty of a diamond, for example, is highlighted by an artistic setting. Applying this to persons and how we value visitors or guests, we often specifically clean and decorate the house in preparation for their coming. We also observe certain rituals of respect, such as bowing, or taking off one's hat, when we come into the presence of someone we respect and honor.

In a similar way, we also act out particular ceremonies when we wish to express a type of commitment to someone. Shaking hands is one such ceremony, and the exchanging of rings is another. But there are many more that we all know. These are commonly accepted ways of indicating how much we appreciate and esteem a particular thing, person, place or situation.

Today's First Reading, from the Book of Nehemiah describes the special ceremonies the Israelites observed to express their appreciation of God and His law. The author tells us first that a platform had been erected from which the Book of the Law could be read by Ezra: "Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden platform that had been made for the occasion." Today, for example, we still build similar platforms for the dignitaries at any important event.

The Book of Nehemiah then continues, detailing how Ezra displayed the scroll on which the law was written, and how the people responded with great reverence: "He opened the scroll so that all the people might see it, for he was

standing higher up than any of the people; and as he opened it, all the people rose. Ezra blessed the LORD, the great God, and all the people, their hands raised high, answered, 'Amen, amen!' Then they bowed down and prostrated themselves before the LORD, their faces to the ground."

The declaration, "Amen, amen!" was here a symbol of serious commitment for the Israelites. They were giving themselves to God as both a privilege and a responsibility. To emphasize their further reverence for this sacred commitment, they then ceremoniously bowed and kissed the ground. All these external signs testified to how deeply the Old Testament people understood the significance of their personal relationship with God and their own unique and personal engagement in this solemn agreement.

We, too, are deeply and closely related to God. Our commitment, through Jesus, is that of sons and daughters. This is indeed a possession of highest value and significance. Like the Israelites, therefore, we proclaim our gratitude and appreciation through ceremonies and rituals. And the most beautiful of these, fortunately for us, is not merely a ceremony, but a living experience of our being God's own, whom God feeds as "daughters and sons," in our Eucharistic celebration! We offer ourselves to God—in and through and with Jesus our brother, and we seal our commitment as the Israelites did, with our own profound and joyous, resounding "AMEN!" God's gift to us of the Eucharistic celebration, in its setting through which to demonstrate our precious awareness of our closeness to God and our eternal gratitude for this unique privilege.



Haiti Outreach Mission

Roger and Dr. Dominique Matthews began the Mission in 1998. It has grown to become a non-profit outreach program that is dedicated to helping the people, especially children of Mirebalais, Haiti—a mountain town approximately 35 miles

from Port-au-Prince, Haiti and educating people in the U.S. about this devastated country.

OLV, along with other Catholic, Episcopal, and Baptist churches, provides health care, education, and other services with our partner churches in Mirebalais: They give us a reliable base from which to operate in Haiti (St. Louis Catholic and St. Pierre Episcopal).

The 2019 Mission trip is now scheduled for April 5-12. Applications now being accepted.

The mission team, made up of doctors, dentists, nurses, and lay people from the member churches, as well as doctors and medical students from Port-au-Prince visit Mirebalais once each year. The Medical team treat patients, at various locations. The Fluoride/Dental hygiene team treats over 1,500 school children and staff with anti-parasite medicine and Fluoride. A small HOM construction team does maintenance work on electrical and water systems. To be a part of this team, please apply by February 15, 2019. There are a limited number of spaces available. Help will be needed setting up mobile medical/dental/fluoride clinics and crowd control.

To apply online: The application form is accessed at www.haitioutreachmission.org. At the bottom of the home page click on the **Mission Trip Application** bar. Then read the directions and click on the Go to Form bar.

OLV has participated in the Haiti Outreach Mission (HOM) since 2003, providing medical supply donations, financial support with Seed money and leadership. Our Stitching Busy Bodies make clothing and bags for the Children. Founded in 1999, HOM is a tax-exempt 501(c)(3) charitable, ecumenical, organization providing medical and humanitarian aid to the people of Mirebalais, Haiti.

HOM work continues in Mirebalais. The medical/dental St. Pierre Clinic, with full-time physician and full-time dentist, serves patients daily and is fully supported by HOM (\$43,550 annually)—service to all children is FREE. The clinic is HOM's single most significant ongoing presence in Mirebalais. HOM also provides financial and maintenance help to 4 local schools.
