
Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

We use the phrase, **“One of these days,”** to suggest something we might think of doing. Sometimes our plan is realistic; sometimes it is pure fantasy. We might say, for example, *“One of these days I’m going to become an astronaut, because I want to go to the moon.”* We know, of course, that such a journey into space is very unlikely; so, this statement is only a dream, sometimes referred to as a “pipe” dream, meaning an illusory or fantastic plan, hope or story. Or we might say, *“One of these days I’m going to travel across the ocean.”* This is a little more probable, and perhaps not just a pipe dream. Or we might express a resolution that has a good possibility of being fulfilled: *“One of these days I’m going to clean out the attic, straighten up the garage,”* or even, *“mow the lawn.”*

By contrast to this, “one of these days” attitude, there are some things we must do, no ifs, ands or buts. It is hard for us to imagine saying, *“One of these days I’m going to school,”* if we are a student, or *“one of these days I’m going to work,”* if we are employed. It would seem even more absurd to say, *“One of these days I’m going to eat.”* These things are immediate, direct responsibilities, that we must do, therefore, in such cases, the expression, “One of these days...” is simply ridiculous.

The obligations related to us and God that Moses here speaks of, have the same immediate urgency as eating or if employed; going to work. We cannot speak of the solemn religious duties that face us as we would speak of a trip to the moon or to Europe. We must resolve to fulfill them here and now. We must place them, as the Book of Deuteronomy says, **“in our mouth and in our heart.”** Moses reminds us that God’s commands should be very near to us, and not just some vague, unidentified actions that we know would be good. They are not something we can say we will do, “one of these days.” They are real and daily concerns and commitments which we must make in exactly the same way as we eat, sleep and perform our other immediate duties each day.



As a little exercise, I pose this little statement to you to complete ... **“One of these days _____.”** But rather than filling the blank with loose general resolutions, I ask you to insert the immediate moral and spiritual obligations that you are sharply aware of at this moment. The statement(s) should be direct and clean about something we know that we have NOT done in regard to God, others or even ourselves. For, however you define the detailed regulations of your religious duties, in terms of the commandments, the laws of the Book of Deuteronomy, or the responsibilities designated by the Gospel of Jesus, all religious rites and practices are summed up in a right love of ourselves, a right love of others, and a right love of God.

Then, after you have done this, *“One of these days I’m going to...”* sentence that contains some direct duty in which we are failing, we should then cross out the words, “One of these days” and replace them with **“Today I will ...”**

This is the message of Moses, that **“The word is very near to you, in your mouth, and in your heart.”** We must do what we should do... now!!

God’s Peace be upon you, during these beautiful summer days, **Father Denis**

CHILDREN'S GRIEF CAMP COMING IN JULY



Angela Hospice is sponsoring a children's grief camp this summer in conjunction with **New Hope Center for Grief Support in Northville**. The camp will take place over two days, **Thursday, July 25 and Friday, July 26, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., at Maybury Farm, on Eight Mile Road, in Northville.**

Organizers have planned a variety of interactive activities from music to equestrian therapy, art projects to foot races, and more. Campers will learn coping skills when it comes to dealing with grief. They will also bond with the farm animals, and learn about how they also endure loss.

In today's Gospel (Luke 10:25-37), when Jesus asks "which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" the scholar of the law answered, "the one who treated him with mercy." Jesus then said, "Go and do likewise."

"There are scripture scholars who say that there is a very subtle twist to the end of the parable. Jesus asks the lawyer: "Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the man who fell in with robbers?" The answer came, "The one who treated him with mercy." It would seem that in asking the lawyer that question, Jesus was saying equivalently to him, "You asked Me 'who was my neighbor?' That was not a good question. The question you should have asked me was: "To whom can I BE neighbor? And the answer to that question is, 'the first poor person you meet on the road.'" (McCullen, Deep Down Things, p. 141)




Hello OLV Altar Servers!



Meditations of a Candle Maven

Some people call us the church mice, but I prefer to be called a candle maven. Faith Bruno enlisted me into this sisterhood in 2012 when we met for daily Mass in what is now the Thomas Aquinas Room or where they have RCIA, you know, the place with the fireplace. Parish Staff also encouraged me to change the candles on Sundays at 7:30, and before daily Mass on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. There are others who serve in this capacity, especially on Mondays with Nancy Tolkacz.

I wanted to share with you what I think about as I replace candles and make sure that the lit ones are not going to set the church on fire. I feel privileged to assist in the prayer health of the community. There are a lot more candles now, and this is what I think about. *What do you think are the prayer intentions of the candle lighters?*

In the Atrium, if somebody lit a candle under St. Anthony of Padua, I think they need help in the intercession of finding someone or something that is lost. If there is a candle to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, I support them in their prayers about the inhumanity of man and how Jesus' heart remained merciful and forgiving despite human frailties. If someone lit a candle under Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal, I support them in their need for some kind of miracle that Our Lady could provide. If someone lit a candle near Danny Thomas' St. Jude, I figure they must be hoping for an intercession in a medically impossible situation. If some one lights a candle under Blessed Solanus Casey's statue, I am delighted to think they are very grateful for something that God has done for them.

Then I move my candle maven skills into the church. If someone lights a candle under Our Lady of Victory, I support them in their belief in the power of prayer through the rosary and feel their connections with the Communion of Saints. If they light a candle around St. Jude the Apostle, I feel they might be asking for help with some really impossible situation. And lastly, when someone has taken the time to light a candle around St. Joseph, I figure they were praying for family acceptance.

That's what I pray about as I replace the candles. And you thought I was just a pretty face. Ha!


