Dear Friends,

Over these past years, due to the ongoing generosity of so many parishioners, we have continued to grow our technology and security departments. We have also worked so diligently during these past months to not only follow all of the CDC and the AOD guidelines for the cleaning and disinfecting of our campus, but have surpassed that which has been asked of us. As well as all the practical physical upgrades to the property on both sides of Orchard Drive, we have also worked hard to continue my promise to you...the words of Saint Teresa of Calcutta, **“To Create something beautiful for God.”**

In addition to the many beautifully hand-crafted created altar-cloths, vestments, and banners for both the Church and the Chapel, I have also kept my eye and attention on some physical beautification for the Church. A number of years ago, when St. Agatha Church in Redford was closed, as Pastor of St. Robert Bellarmine, I was able to secure a stained-glass window from the chapel at St. Agatha. The thought was to have it recreated to work adorn the east side bank of windows in the church.

Shortly after securing the window, I was asked to leave SRB and to join all of you here at OLV. When leaving, St Robert's, the dream of the stained-glass window from St. Agatha, seemingly went...no pun intended, “out the window!”

A few years ago, when St. Robert Bellarmine was closed, the Griffin Funeral Home made a donation for the stained-glass window, towards the creation of the new Parish in Redford, St John XXIII. The understanding was that the window would be recreated and put to use here at OLV.

Well, the time has come. We have been working with an artist from Toledo, Ohio, Mr. David Wiskirchen, the owner and proprietor of **Wiskirchen Studios**.

Wiskirchen Studios is a family-oriented business that has been devoted to religious arts for seven generations. Their artistic heritage is influenced by their religious background. And their goal is to preserve the religious arts in Cathedrals and Monasteries all over the world. One of the Studio's many offerings is they design and make all types of stained-glass windows—including the restoration of windows. Their German background affords the experience to create hand painted stained glass, any type of Tiffany reproductions, and the creation of new and creative redesigns of older windows.

About five years ago, we found the artist, Mr. Wiskirchen, and with great enthusiasm, created the stained-glass windows for our Kateri Chapel. He created and crafted the design for the windows, using our church windows as his model.

Davis is now excited to design and recreate the original chapel window from St Agatha, which was called the Rosary Window. The Dominican Sisters from Adrian who served so many years at St. Agatha Schools, all loved the powerful bursts of color, which emanated from the window. The Rosary window will be recreated for our use, in what was the former daily mass chapel, which is now used as part of the Gathering Space, referred to as the Annex. Over a year ago, new “clear-story” windows were installed and now the new stained-glass window, will hang in panels the entire length of the clear-story. We hope to begin to see the panels within the next few weeks.

Open discussion follows a short video presentation with, usually, a wide range of questions and issues prompted by the video.

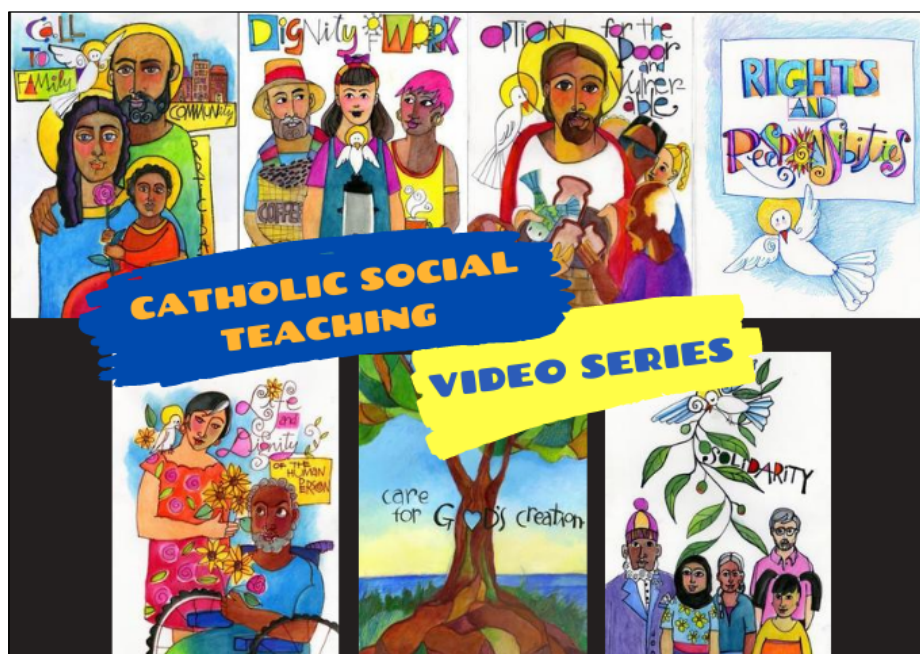

It is the understanding that sometimes it means going out into uncharted waters and giving the reins of our life over to him.

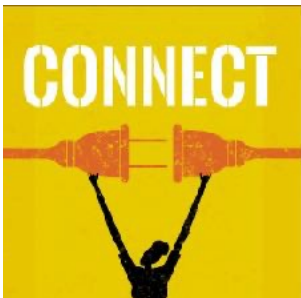

Please read all guidelines (found online) prior to attending Mass for the first time. Below is a highlight of the changes that you will experience during Mass:

- **Limited seating.** Based on the layout of the church, our seating capacity is around 120 per Mass.
- Church doors will open 20 minutes prior to Mass.
- **Social Distance:** Households may sit together but will be distanced (by 6 feet) to surrounding parishioners.
- **Masks:** All Parishioners must wear a mask. Your mask may be moved to consume communion.
- If you have an Offering, it can be deposited in a bin found in the Gathering Space entrance.

We understand that everyone is anxious to get back to normal and public Mass is one of those events that is “normal” to us! However, if you are **sick, have a fever or cough, have underlying health conditions**, or if you have been exposed to someone who is sick (anyone in an “at-risk” category, or uncomfortable in a group setting), please **remain home** and continue to enjoy our live stream offerings.

Archbishop Vigneron has granted **dispensation** from the Sunday obligation to celebrate Mass to all the faithful of the Archdiocese through **Monday, November 23, 2020**. The **Saturday, 5:00 p.m. Mass will continue to be live streamed** and recorded to both our website and Facebook page for an indefinite period of time.
