






A NOTE FROM FATHER DAVID

As we continue in this summer season, let us walk in faith and hope wherever we go and whoever we meet. During this summer, for a few weeks, our Sunday gospel readings take a break from the gospel of Mark, and go to John's gospel, chapter 6. This chapter is very important for us as Catholics, laying a solid Scriptural foundation in our belief in the sacrament of the Eucharist. Last Sunday, we began the chapter with the account of the miracle of the multiplication of the bread and fish. This miracle reminds us of God's abundant providence to take care of our true needs, with lots of "leftovers". Nothing is wasted when it comes to God's care for us. It's just that sometimes we fail to ask, to trust, to seek, and knock. Sometimes we focus on what we want, rather than truly need.

As we continue through John 6, we will hear Jesus' "bread of life" discourse, which invites us to reflect on the great gift of the Eucharist, and what it means for us as Catholics. I invite you to ask yourself, as an individual or as a family: what is the level of your

faith in Jesus when He states: "I am the bread of life"? Second, what motivates you to go to mass: an external obligation or a deep desire to experience the Lord Jesus more intimately and powerfully? Finally, how can you give witness to others to your belief in the centrality of the mass and the Eucharist for you as a Catholic? May we ask the Lord to give us this bread always.

This weekend we welcome Fr. Phillip Mayfield, PIME, to St. John the Baptist parish for our annual mission appeal. This appeal is coordinated by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. Please hear Fr. Phillip's message about how the Gospel is brought to the world through the missionary work of the PIMEs. For us who have not been missionaries sent to faraway lands, it is easy for us to take our faith for granted.

LAY LEANINGS... By Deacon Mike Stewart

I should have known better, as I've been running for many years. Nevertheless, I planned a longer run even though the weather forecast looked ominous. Maybe I could beat the storm clouds, I thought to myself. I bet wrong. A few miles from home the winds began to blow and the skies opened up. As luck would have it, I was in a rural area with no place to seek shelter. Fortunately, there was very little lightning; just torrential wind and rain.

As I was running in the heavy rains without an adequate place to seek shelter, I thought about the many times when I've latched onto something or somebody to protect me from the storms in my life. When we're young, it's usually our parents who shelter us from the storms of this world; but as time goes on, we begin to find other corners that make us feel safe. Sometimes we pick the right corners; other times we don't.

My younger brother and I were born less than a year apart. We shared the same bedroom. We looked nearly identical; but the similarities ended there. Like many families, there was stress in our household

growing up, and I didn't always feel safe. Through the years, it occurred to me that the rootedness of my faith; the importance of prayer in my life could be traced to the many nights of pulling the covers up over my head asking God to make it better. And God did indeed answer my prayers on many occasions. Sadly, however, my brother took a very different road; a road that led him to alcohol and drugs, and eventually to a very early death.

I've lived enough years to recognize that there will always be storms in our lives. All of us will eventually find ourselves caught in the midst of a raging storm from time-to-time. And in our humanness, there will always be a tendency for us to seek protection from those storms, leading us to make choices that can change the course of our lives. It's in those choices that we can either seek to choose God ... or something else.

Let's pray about that.

And he said to them, "Why are you afraid, you of little faith?" Then he got up and rebuked the winds and the sea; and there was a dead calm. Mt 8:26



LIVE THE LITURGY: Inspiration for the Week

When we lose our ability to trust, we become afraid. When we are afraid, we may begin to grumble and question whether where we are is where we need to be. For us who have faith, we even question whether God is who God says He is. Trust is so important to our success on our journey. Often, the road of our lives can become a bit treacherous. We may find ourselves feeling more unsettled than comfortable and less fulfilled than we would like to be. As much as we try, the pieces of our puzzle don't quite fit together as they ought. We wonder if we will ever experience happiness again. Then, something reminds us that God is very much present in this mess we call life. God is still bringing hope out of despair and life out of death. After all, God is the true bread that comes down from heaven to give life. All that is necessary is for us to trust in this truth, even when we may be lacking in some of life's essentials. The God who gives life is the same God who sustains it. He is also the same God who assures us that we will not perish.

STEPHEN MINISTRY

Stephen Ministry Parishes equip and empower lay caregivers-called Stephen Ministers, to provide high quality, confidential, Christ centered care to people who are hurting. Stephen Ministers are parish members trained by Stephen Leaders to offer high quality, one to one Christian care to people going through tough times. A Stephen Minister usually provides care to one person at a time, meeting with that person once per week for about one hour. Twice a month, Stephen Ministers gather with their Stephen Leaders for supervision and continuing education.

- Stephen Ministry multiplies blessings throughout the church and community.
- Parishes receive a practical and powerful way to respond to Christ's commandment: "Love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12 RSV)
- Priests, Deacons, Pastoral Ministers, have a team of gifted, trained, and committed lay caregivers ready to minister to people that are hurting.
- Laypeople nurture and use their gifts in meaningful ministry, growing spiritually as they serve others.
- Parish members who are hurting have a compassionate companion-a caring Christian friend who provides emotional and spiritual support.



QUESTION:

What can I do to help our family practice our faith each day?

ANSWER:

Some families practice their religion together as just another event on their schedule: go to church, observe Lent, help at the parish picnic, go to a meeting, volunteer time, make your confession, use your envelope... But the focus needs to be on who we are—God’s people, in relationship with him, loved, forgiven, and redeemed, and called to live and proclaim the Gospel. Our awareness of God’s presence and our sense of mission are supported by the daily rituals, celebrations, and traditions that help us stay focused. Sharing our faith strengthens us and clarifies the beliefs and values of Christian living.

Daily family practices include time for prayer—before meals, before bed, before important meetings and activities. Attend Sunday Mass together and discuss the homily afterward. Create family celebrations for holy days and holidays. Make religion a regular part of your discussions. Include others, especially the elderly and the less fortunate, in your activities and charitable efforts. By applying the virtues of faith, hope, and love to each day, faith becomes part of who your family is. It influences how you act towards others, what you value, and how mindful of God you are. Faith is the leaven of life that helps all of us rise to our calling and dignity as God’s people.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How will this affect parish staffs?

As parishes come together to form Families of Parishes, they will begin to discuss the practical ways in which the clergy and staff will interact within the Family, as well as finalize the new leadership structure, including items such as leadership teams, key staff mission, and operations staff positions. During this process, some parishes may lose some staff members (e.g., if a Family of Parishes opts to share one bookkeeper instead of having each parish maintain its own). At the same time, some Families will be able to add positions that better serve the mission going forward. In addition, we expect that natural attrition (e.g. through retirements and normal staff turnover) over the next few years may assist the parishes' efforts to further consolidate their staffs.

These and other staffing decisions will be left to the discernment of each Family of Parishes, led by parish leadership and with assistance, as needed, from the Archdiocese of Detroit Curia. All decisions will be guided by a complete focus on mission and the best interest of the entire Family of Parishes.
