

A NOTE FROM FATHER DAVID

Recently, the archdiocese, in response to the evolving situation with COVID-19, has communicated to the parishes a few points of clarification. First, there is no mandate to wear face coverings at this time. We realize that more people are choosing to wear face coverings, and we respect this. If someone is uncertain about their comfortability in coming to mass, you are encouraged to wear a mask if this enables you to come to mass. So, we respect everyone who comes to church, whatever your decision is at this time. Extra clean masks are available in the usher's room for those who need them. All clergy and EMEs are expected to wear face coverings while distributing Holy Communion.

We also want to do the best we can to honor those who may desire some physical distancing. No

pews are currently blocked off in church, but if anyone has a request for this, we can accommodate it. Please contact the parish office if you have this request. At the traditional time of the sign of peace, whether the priest or deacon verbally invites you to do so or not, you are welcome to share peace according to your comfortability. This may be as simple as a nod, smile, or a wave to those around you.

Finally, the particular dispensation from the obligation to participate in Sunday and holy day mass remains in effect for those who are ill, concerned about their health for a good reason, or in some other special circumstance. If you do not come to mass, please continue to tune in to mass via livestream or on television, and spend praying with the Sunday

Scripture readings. Also, please consider coming to a weekday mass, which is less crowded and allows for more spacing.

I ask everyone to be aware of the sensitivities and safety of those around them, so that we can continue to be a family of faith through this time. We believe that the Lord will continue to guide us. Let us recall the words of Moses in today's first reading: "What great nation is there that has gods so close to us as the Lord, our God, is to us whenever we call upon Him?" Do we believe this?



Faith formation classes begin September 14, 2021 and will take place at the St. Mary Campus on Tuesdays from 6:00-7:15pm. We are still in need of wonderful volunteers, specifically catechist assistants, to serve this ministry. The role of a catechist assistant is to offer classroom management support to the catechist. The assistant will often help work with a child who needs extra assistance or help the catechist in a classroom activity. The assistant typically does not help prepare lessons, unless the catechists and the assistant make some prior arrangement for him/her to do so. LAY LEANINGS... By Deacon Mike Stewart

I was walking deep in thought with my head down, so at first I never even noticed her. But then I wondered ... why would someone be knelt down in the middle of a busy road; and worse yet, just over a set of well-traveled railroad tracks where it's nearly impossible to see the road fully on the other side? I wasn't sure if she was ill or hurt in some way, so I was preparing to come to her aid. Finally, I saw her get up with something cupped in her hands, seemingly oblivious to the traffic coming in both directions. Whatever it was, she was fixated.

Out of concern, I crossed over and asked her if she was okay. "A butterfly", was all she said, looking as if she had just lost her best-friend. "Well, thank God that you were there to save it," I said. "I didn't save it", she replied, "and that makes me so sad."

Risking her life for a small creature that never had a chance anyway? Who would do that? Something maybe only St. Francis of Assisi would have done, I supposed. Perhaps, but it left me with an image of passion that seems so foreign to our disengaged and often unkind world.

A number of years ago, my wife and I were traveling on a remote, but heavily traveled stretch of road in the Upper Peninsula, when we came upon a very serious head-on collision. Though we didn't witness the accident, we were

among the first on the scene. When I ran to the first vehicle, young children were crying inside, and a woman was pinned in the passenger seat. It was clear to me that she was the mother, and sadly, she did not survive. By then, others had stopped, and were beginning to lend a hand. But I'll never forget one car, driving by this horrific scene. The driver honked his horn, motioning that he was clearly unhappy with having been inconvenienced by being stopped for several minutes. I've never forgotten that scene, but that man's insensitivity sadly made it all the more tragic.

St. Paul wrote his Letter to the Philippians from prison in horrific conditions that would be considered inhumane by our standards today. Nevertheless, Paul wrote this, "Rejoice in the Lord always. I say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near." (Philippians 4:5)

Perhaps, in this world where kindness seems out-of-place, perhaps we can reflect in honesty ... am I only kind to others who are kind to me? Do I love the people God loves, even when they are unlovable? Would I risk it all for those more vulnerable? Let's pray about that.

And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ. Ephesians 4:32






