

# LAY LEANINGS... By Deacon Mike Stewart

"Come on, tell me!" the woman pleaded with her companion, as they stared at a store display of several different styles of chairs. "Just tell me what you think I would like. You know I really, really care what you think." The first woman was clearly frustrated by her inability to choose. Nevertheless, I wondered whether, in fact, she really, really cared as much about what she, herself thought, as she did about the opinions of others.

It's basic human nature to seek out the opinions of others; to varying degrees, we all do it. Consider the number of people who repeatedly post selfies on social media, and then define themselves by the number of 'likes' they receive. Not only does this sort of behavior help us to affirm our own thinking, but it also serves as a sort of failure avoidance. However, the line between seeking the opinions of others versus habitually seeking the approval of others can be thinner than we even imagine. In fact, if we're constantly seeking others to affirm us and our decisions, then what does that say about us, about the mirror we have on ourselves, and especially about the person God made us to be? If we're constantly looking outside ourselves for affirmation, then how can we ever hope to understand who we really are?

Aristotle said that, 'knowing ourselves is the beginning of all wisdom'. Why do you suppose he would have said that? Perhaps because we tend to fear most that which we don't fully know or understand. It's hard and sometimes very emotional work to look into our own hearts and souls, afraid of what we might encounter there. We all have a past, and we all carry within us something no one else knows about. Why then would we want to look in there? And so we look to others to help us reflect a positive image, one that is relatively free of the risk of exposing who we really are on the inside .. vulnerable, broken, hurting, frightened people.

It's interesting to me that we work so hard at keeping hidden those aspects of ourselves that we don't want others to see, and yet care so intensely what others think about that part of ourselves that others can see. Perhaps we forget that we are all made by and in the image of the same Creator; a God from whom nothing is hidden, and who knows every hair on our head. Imagine what the world would be like if we cared as much about what our God sees as what others see. Let's pray about that.

# What are "Mission Direct" ministries and how will they be structured?

Mission Direct ministries primarily work directly with the faithful in achieving the mission, and are designed to firmly root parish pastoral ministry in Synod 16 and the Unleash the Gospel pastoral letter. To accomplish this goal, we have identified five ministry areas that reflect a vibrant and evangelizing parish. These are:

- 1. Discipleship Formation, overseeing all aspects of disciple formation in the Family, with emphasis on encounter, grow, and witness. The Director of Discipleship Formation identifies, recruits, and forms catechists; assists the school faculty in the preparation of creative, spiritfilled liturgies and sacramental experiences; and other related tasks.
- 2. Engagement, assisting parish-

ioners by equipping them for the service of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The Director of Engagement supervises those working in ministry placement, evangelization, communications, RCIA, hospitality, and ecumenical ministries.

- 3. Evangelical Charity, ensuring a full response to Catholic social teaching through charity in areas of human need, both within the parish and beyond. The Director of Evangelical Charity supervises those working in human services; community outreach; visitation of the sick and homebound; Stephen Ministry; and funeral luncheon ministries.
- 4. Family Ministries, assisting families living as domestic churches in their homes.
  The Director of Family Ministry supervises those working with infant baptism; marriage preparation, and family support group ministries.
- 5. Worship, facilitating the worship life of the community by coordinating and providing quality prayer and liturgical experiences. The Director of Worship supervises those working in liturgy; parish music; prayer groups; and wake service ministries.

After years as a Shakespearean actor, Leonardo embarked on a spiritual journey that led him to found a Catholic theater company, Saint Luke Productions, in

1980. Millions throughout the US, Canada, and Europe have seen his work as an actor, producer, and film director. His work has inspired vocations to the religious life, and he has won numerous awards over the decades. One of his most ambitious projects was the direction, production, and distribution of the feature film Thérèse. This was the first motion picture distributed solely by an independent Catholic film company. Leonardo is married to his beloved wife, Patti, and they have been blessed with seven children and reside in Washington State.



# **PRAYER**

St. Charles Borromeo (1538 - 1584) is most known for living during the time of the Protestant Reformation and helped influence reform of the whole Church during the final years of the Council of Trent.

Quietly working behind the scenes, St. Charles Borromeo is credited with keeping the Council of Trent in session and encouraging the pope to renew the Council in 1562, after its 10-year suspension. Afterwards, he devoted his time to serving in the Archdiocese of Milan.

Among his most important actions during his life, St. Charles Borromeo established seminaries, colleges, and communities for the education of candidates for holy orders. His emphasis on Catholic learning greatly increased the preparation of men for the priesthood and benefited their congregations. He died at the age of 46. ©LPi
