

GOSPEL MEDITATION by FR. JOHN MUIR

Not long ago, I was called to a hospital to anoint a woman in her early 80s. She was dying, and visibly in pain. But what struck me most wasn't her suffering — it was the atmosphere in the room. She had eight children and 30 foster kids, and many of them were gathered around her. You'd expect sorrow, fear, maybe even despair. But the room was filled with something else entirely — a quiet strength, a kind of sweetness. It was as if she was suffering not just with them, but for them. And they, in love, were suffering for her. The pain was real. But so was the peace. I didn't want to run. I felt as if I was in a little paradise, beeping machines and all.

I think of that moment when I hear today's Gospel. Jesus, hanging on the cross, doesn't look like a king. But one of the crucified, dying men beside him sees through the suffering and says, **"Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom"** (Luke 23:42). That word — remember — literally means to make someone a member again. He's asking to be joined to Christ, to become part of his Body. And Jesus says, **"Today you will be with me in paradise."**

He doesn't say, "I'll take your suffering away." He says, **"You will be with me."**

That's the strange power of Christ the King. He doesn't rule by avoiding suffering. He reigns by entering into it, and transforming it with love.

What are you suffering right now in your life? Likely you want it to stop. But if we are willing to suffer with him — paradise begins even today. ©LPI

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Mini Reflection: : It's taken me a few hundred read-throughs of this Gospel passage to finally understand a painful truth: I am Gestas, "the bad thief." I am as close to Jesus as he was, and I ask for all the wrong things.

The King Who Hangs Beside Us

We love to hate the bad thief.

Ancient Christian tradition has called him by the name "Gestas." In contrast to Dismas, "the good thief" who recognized and repented of his own sins, Gestas goes down bitter and swinging. With his last breaths he taunts Jesus, poking fun at the absurdity of a deity who allows himself to be crucified by mortals. "Are you not the Christ?" he sneers.

But his final words betray an undercurrent of desperation. Of terror. In the end, Gestas just wants Jesus to save him.

It's taken me a few hundred read-throughs of this Gospel passage to finally understand a painful truth: I am Gestas. I hang from my own cross — we all do, in this life. But I'm lucky enough that my cross is right beside Jesus, because the sacraments bring him as close to me as he was to Gestas — closer, even. How unfathomable is the mercy of God.

And yet, I am not grateful. I don't rejoice at my proximity to my Lord, to the flesh and blood that have bought my salvation. I don't do what I should do, and what Dismas does. I don't say, "Wherever you are King, please, let me be your subject. Wherever you are going, please, take me with you."

"Are you not the Christ?" I say instead. And what I mean is exactly what Gestas meant: "Get me down. Take this cross away. I don't want it. I can't take it."

What a tragedy it would be, if all Christ had to offer us was an easier life.

None of this looks like anyone thought it would. The long-foretold Messiah, whose majesty and might would eradicate violence and establish peace. The guy who was going to make everything okay again. The King of the Jews. And here he hangs: bleeding and dying and doing what looks like nothing. Staring at Gestas. Staring at me. Staring at you.

What will you say to him?

Eucharistic Adoration is a vital Catholic devotion inviting us to worship Jesus Christ truly present—body, blood, soul, and divinity—in the Blessed Sacrament outside of Mass. It fosters intimate prayer, gratitude, and union with the Lord, as the Catechism describes it: a "duty of adoration toward Christ our Lord." Pope St. John Paul II emphasized its "inestimable value," providing "strength, consolation and support" by prolonging Communion's graces.

This practice, whether a quiet tabernacle visit or monstrance exposition with Scripture and hymns, deepens faith through contemplation of Christ's love. Theologians note its metaphysical depth in making the mystery of faith explicit.

SEVEN BIBLE VERSES EVERY CATHOLIC SHOULD KNOW NUMBER THREE: 2 PETER 1:20-21 SCRIPTURE

St. Peter said: "First of all, you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by the impulse of man, but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke by God." The heart of this text is that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation. In Protestantism, every matter of scripture is a matter of interpretation by man. The logical outcome of sola scriptura is that the Bible and you are all you need to be a Christian. Sola scriptura rejects any authority that may come from Tradition or the Church or the Pope or the bishops. It leaves you with a situation where the bible is your only authority. But then what does it mean? You can't have recourse to Tradition because Tradition is not dependable or the Church because it can't be trusted, so it's all up to you. It ends up in a situation where every individual becomes his or her own pope! Pride and arrogance come into play in this scenario when one makes him or herself the sole arbiter of truth, which is the Protestant principle. In this passage, St. Peter rules out the sola scriptura premise. Then what is our authority if it's not ourselves, our own interpretation of scriptures? Answer: It's the apostolic authority. St. Peter writes this with the authority of an Apostle. In 2 Peter 1:19 he writes: "And we have the prophetic word made more sure. You will do well to pay attention." The "we" he's talking about is the apostolic authority communicated down the ages by the Holy Spirit through apostolic succession. (Source: Dr. John Bergsma, St. Paul Center)



A few weeks ago, we looked at physical grooming and how predators use it to lure victims. Another type of grooming is psychological, in which a predator spends a great deal of time with his or her victim, showering them with attention and making the victim feel a shared connection. When the predator becomes a peer to the child, then he has control. He can then offer special treatment — or threaten to take away that treatment, and even make threats against the child's family, pets, and other friends.
