Apologetics

This course explores the scientific evidence for God as well as philosophical proofs of His existence, the historicity of Jesus's miracles and Resurrection, the reasons to be Catholic, why an all-loving God would allow suffering, and medical evidence for our transphysical soul. Each chapter includes a study of primary sources from Church history, focus and reflection questions, complete instructions for interactive activities, art, and other visual reflections, Scripture readings, and biographies of Catholic scientists and saints.

Advanced Math Lab

This lab-style class is designed to include family choice and span a broader range of mathematical branches to meet students of all high school grade levels where they are. The class will provide a framework of concepts on campus while families can choose, depending on the student's grade level, which textbook and branch of mathematics is right for them at home. This lab will be conducted as a math class with fundamental concepts taught throughout the year, including organization and problem solving while providing a student-led aspect with hands-on engagement.

Biology with Lab

This course focuses on a pro-life approach to the study of Biology. The text begins with human biology (including cells and cell structure, systems of the human body, and genetics), and then covers general biology (including biological classification, systems of plants and animals, and non-human organisms). This class will also develop analytical and problem-solving skills, preparing students for further studies in the field of biological sciences and enhancing their understanding of the natural world. Biology lab will focus on dissection of small animals, teaching students about the internal structures of animals and how organs and tissues are related.
