

The Pastor's Corner:

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Today is Palm Sunday – the beginning of Holy Week. Today's liturgy and those of the coming week provide us with the opportunity to remember and participate in the Passion of the Lord. During the reading of today's Gospel, people in the pews are given a speaking role – the only time during the liturgical year when that happens. All present are thereby encouraged to be active listeners and enter into the Passion narrative. This year I hope you do just that. I hope you take the time to really ponder the details of Christ's Passion and allow yourself to marvel at what he did for humanity and for you in particular. I hope you are moved anew by all Christ willingly and lovingly experienced, endured, and suffered to save you.

My wish for us, this week especially, is that we experience profound wonder and awe at the magnitude of what Christ did for each of us and what it means for us. God loved us into existence and willingly died to save us. May our acceptance and understanding of that fact do its work in us so we may love and follow him as we should.




Thank you volunteers and Easter flowers donors!


