# WEEKLY CLERGY REFLECTION

In Jesus' time, a suspected leper had to go to a priest for examination. If found to be infected, the person should wear torn clothes, hair should hang loose, cover his upper lip, and cry out "Unclean! Unclean!" He should also live alone. An outcast, he was considered utterly unclean – both physically and spiritually.

This sounds familiar to all of us. Some of us have had the experience of being "quarantined." I, myself was quarantined for fourteen days, isolated from the community. I was sad and lonely, I couldn't hang out with my friends out of fear of spreading the virus. During those days, it was just me and God. I asked God to heal me both physically and spiritually.

The powerful healing story of the Gospel this week encourages us to present ourselves to the Lord for whatever restoration we need. Like the leper, there is a need for us to surrender ourselves to Christ, our hope! "If You wish, You can make me clean."

This coming Wednesday, February 17, is Ash Wednesday, the start of our Lenten journey. Many times in our lives, we are dropped, crumpled, and ground into the dirt by our own decisions or those of other people. We feel as though we are worthless. But no matter what has happened or what will happen, we will never lose our value: dirty or clean, crumpled or finely creased, we are still priceless to the One who knows us through and through, and values us so much that He wants to live in friendship with us forever.

Look closely at the crucifix. That is the real message of Lent. Christ wants us with Him forever in heaven, so much that He was willing to be torn and crumpled, stomped on and humiliated - just as much as we have been - to show each of us how much He loves us.

## A MESSAGE FROM MR. JOHN MCGUIRE

This weekend offers us the perfect opportunity to reflect on the meaning of love. On this, the last Sunday before Lent begins, we meet up with two expressions of love. We have the romantic love of spouse celebrated with Valentine's Day and the love of nation as expressed by Presidents' Day. Both of these celebrations can be met with sentimentality. However, if we take a moment to reflect, I think we will find something much deeper. Both love of spouse and love of nation requires a high level of honesty and hard work.

To truly love a spouse, we have to be open to share hard truths about ourselves and about our beloved. We have to be present and available for each other, even when it isn't convenient. In the next week, we will enter into the season of Lent, a time in which we work to perfect our relationship with God. In doing so, we have to be honest about our shortcomings and work to grow closer to Jesus. We spend the 40 days of Lent preparing for the joy of Easter.

This week, let's pray that we can love our families, serve our nation, and grow ever closer to God.



## REFLEXIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

El evangelio cuenta la sanación de un leproso que para san Marcos es señal del poder irresistible de Jesús. Sanar a un leproso equivalía a resucitar a un muerto. La lepra incluía enfermedades de la piel, como acné y soriasis, que a veces se podían curar; pero era una enfermedad que inspiraba terror, casi como el SIDA y el cáncer en nuestros días. Los leprosos vivían solos y aislados; inspiraban miedo y horror; nadie se les podía acercar. A veces los leprosos vivían en los cementerios, porque eran considerados como muertos en vida. La curación de un leproso era algo inaudito; algún profeta había sido instrumento indirecto del poder de Dios sobre la lepra (Eliseo en la sanación de Naamán el sirio). El leproso, hasta que se encontró con Jesús solamente había conocido el rechazo, injurias y desesperación. En Jesús encontró, compasión, acogida, amor y esperanza. Jesús inspiraba acogida y compasión, por eso el leproso "se le acerco," contra todas las reglas; a Jesús no le daba miedo la regla de que "quien a leproso toca, leproso queda." La sanación que hizo Jesús produjo un cambio radical en la vida personal, social y religiosa del sanado; fue un renacer a la vida, ya que desde entonces el hombre se veía a si mismo limpio, podía ser una vez más miembro activo de la comunidad, y podía asistir al templo en las fiestas y en las funciones religiosas. Los Santos Padres de la Iglesia nos dicen que todos somos de algún modo leprosos, y que la lepra es el pecado. Jesús nos sana de esa lepra para que cambiemos nuestra vida personal, para que convivamos en la comunidad cristiana en los sacramentos, y para que nos acerquemos con confianza a Dios nuestro Padre.



## "ONE" CHANGE AT MASS

### FROM THE USCCB COMMITTEE ON DIVINE WORSHIP

Beginning on on Ash Wednesday (Feb 17), if you tune your ear closely, you will hear a slight difference in the words the priest prays at Mass. During the Collect - the opening prayer of Mass before the Liturgy of the Word - the priest concludes with "who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, **one** God, for ever and ever" (emphasis added). The word "one" was included during an imperfect translation from Latin to English ("one" does not appear in the Latin text).

Beginning Wednesday, "one" will be omitted in order to maintain the truest possible translation and to best maintain Christological truth of the Holy Trinity.
