

FOCUS ON THE READINGS

Third Sunday of Easter

In the first reading, Peter and the Apostles are questioned and ordered by the Sanhedrin to stop teaching in Jesus' name. In the second reading, John has a vision of countless angels, living creatures, and elders crying out in praise to the Lamb of God. In the Gospel, Jesus appears at the sea to Peter and other disciples. Jesus instructs them to cast their net over the right side and they have a great catch of fish. Then he serves them breakfast, asks Peter three times if he loves him, and instructs Peter to feed his sheep and follow him.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A message from Fr. Chris Dayton

In this Sunday's Gospel (John 21:1-19), we encounter the Risen Christ appearing to His disciples by the Sea of Tiberias. After sharing a simple meal of bread and fish, Jesus turns to Peter and asks him three times, "Do you love me?" Each time Peter responds with a sincere "Yes," Jesus entrusts him with a mission: "Feed my lambs... Tend my sheep... Feed my sheep."

This intimate and powerful exchange reminds us that love for Christ is not just professed with our lips, but lived out through service, care, and commitment to others. Jesus calls Peter—and us—not only to believe, but to shepherd, to serve, and to lead with love.

As we continue our Easter journey, we are also mindful of a significant moment in the life of the Church: the beginning of the conclave on May 7. As the cardinals gather to discern and elect the next pope, we pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, that those entrusted with this sacred responsibility may be faithful shepherds, attentive to the voice of Christ and the needs of His flock.

Here in our own parish, we're grateful for your patience and understanding as we begin our church lighting project. In the coming week, the two "sample" lamps at the front of the church will be completed, offering us an enlightening preview of what's to come before major construction begins this summer. This phase also gives us a helpful "dress rehearsal" for the logistical adjustments that will be needed during weekend worship in the months ahead. Thank you for your continued cooperation and grace during this time of renewal.

May we each respond to the Lord's question—"Do you love me?"—with lives that reflect a resounding "Yes," through kindness, compassion, and faithful witness.

Alleluia! He is Risen!

CHOOSING THE NEXT POPE

How a papal conclave works

The word conclave comes from the Latin cum clave, meaning "with a key," referring to the practice of locking the cardinals in a



secure place until they choose a new pope. While today's conclave is more comfortable than those in centuries past, the process remains deeply spiritual, steeped in tradition, and aimed at discerning God's will for the Church.

THE "WHEN?"

When does a conclave happen?


A papal conclave is called when the seat of Peter becomes vacant, either through the death or resignation of a pope. The most recent conclave occurred in 2013 after Pope Benedict XVI resigned—an event not seen for over 600 years.



THE "WHO?"

Who votes in the conclave?

Only cardinals under the age of 80 are eligible to vote. As of now, this group numbers around 120 men from around the world, representing the global nature of the Church. These cardinal-electors gather in Vatican City to begin the process, which takes place in the Sistine Chapel beneath Michelangelo's famous Last Judgment.



THE "HOW?"

What does the process look like?

The conclave begins with a special Mass called Pro Eligendo Romano Pontifice ("For the Election of the Roman Pontiff"). Then, the cardinal-electors process into the Sistine Chapel, where they take an oath of secrecy and fidelity. After all non-essential personnel leave, the doors are locked, and the work of discernment begins.

Balloting usually starts the first afternoon. Each cardinal writes the name of his chosen candidate on a paper ballot, folds it, and places it into a chalice on the altar. If no one receives a two-thirds majority, another vote is held. Up to four ballots can be cast each day—two in the morning and two in the afternoon.

After each round of voting, the ballots are burned. If no pope is elected, a chemical is added to produce black

smoke (fumata near) from the Sistine Chapel chimney, signaling the world to wait. When a new pope is chosen, the ballots are burned with a substance that creates white smoke (fumata bianca)—a sign of great joy and anticipation.

"HABEMUS PAPAM!"

We have a pope!

Once a pope is elected and accepts the role, he chooses his papal name. The senior cardinal deacon then appears on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica and announces: "Habemus Papam!" ("We have a pope!"). The new Holy Father then steps out to greet the world and offer his first Urbi et Orbi blessing—to the city and the world.

A papal conclave is more than a vote; it is a sacred act of listening to the Holy Spirit. As we look back at recent popes and await future ones, let us pray always for wise, faithful shepherds to guide the Church in every age.

Pope Francis, elected in 2013, was the first pope ever to choose the name "Francis," a gesture rich with meaning and symbolic of his vision for the Church—a vision rooted in humility, service, and solidarity with the poor, much like his namesake, St. Francis of Assisi. His unprecedented choice of name set the tone for a papacy marked by "firsts," both in identity and action, as he has guided the Church through an era of rapid and profound global change. From 2013 to 2025, during a time defined by technological acceleration, cultural shifts, climate crisis, and increasing polarization, Pope Francis has continually broken new ground: the first Jesuit pope, the first from the Americas and the Global South, and the first to live outside the papal apartments. He has also been the first to engage the world through TED Talks, visits to the Arabian Peninsula, and synodal processes that actively seek the voice of the whole Church. In both name and mission, Pope Francis embodies a papacy uniquely attuned to the signs of the times, constantly forging new paths to witness the Gospel in a changing world.

2013

First Jesuit Pope No previous pope had been a member of the Society of Jesus.

First Pope from the Americas Born in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

First Pope from the Southern Hemisphere Reflects the Church's demographic shift toward the Global South.

First Pope from outside Europe in over 1,200 years The last was Pope Gregory III (a Syrian) in the 8th century.

First Pope to take the name Francis Chose it in honor of St. Francis of Assisi.

First Pope to live in the Vatican guesthouse (Casa Santa Marta) Declined the Apostolic Palace in favor of a simpler lifestyle.

First Pope to wash the feet of women and non-Christians on Holy Thursday *Included Muslims and* women in the traditional foot-washing rite.

2014

First Pope to be on the cover of Rolling Stone Magazine *Providing a symbol of his broad cultural impact.*

2015

First Pope to address the U.S. Congress Spoke on immigration, human dignity, climate change, and social justice.

First Pope to establish a worldwide Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation *Instituted for September 1*, echoing *Eastern Orthodox practice*.

First Pope to issue an encyclical focused on ecology (Laudato Si') *Emphasized care for creation as a moral and spiritual issue.*

2017

First Pope to participate in a TED Talk Message focused on hope, solidarity, and humility in leadership.

2021

First Pope to launch a global synod on synodality *A multi-year Church-wide consultation on authority*, participation, and mission.
