

FOCUS ON THE READINGS

Fourth Sunday of Easter

In the first reading, Paul and Barnabas speak to the people in the synagogue. At first the people are receptive, but later some Jews are filled with jealousy at seeing the crowds. Consequently, Paul and Barnabas evangelize the Gentiles, who are delighted and glorify the Lord. In the second reading, John writes of his vision where a multitude have washed their robes in the blood of the lamb who shepherds them. In the Gospel, Jesus says that his sheep hear his voice and that he and the Father are one.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A message from Fr. Chris Dayton

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, the Gospel offers us a powerful reminder of the tender and faithful care of Christ, our Shepherd. He knows each of us by name and leads us with love. As His flock, we are invited not only to listen for His voice and follow where He leads, but also to help build up our parish as a place of welcome, prayer, and beauty—a reflection of His loving presence among us.

In that spirit, I'm excited to share an important update on our Church Lighting Renewal Project. Over the past several weeks, we've been collaborating with the Rambusch Design Team to create a lighting plan that honors the sacredness of our worship space while enhancing its beauty, functionality, and warmth. As of this week, a mock-up installation is now in place near the sanctuary. I encourage you to take a moment after Mass to see it. This preview shows how thoughtfully designed lighting can brighten and transform our church—making it not only more beautiful, but also more welcoming and spiritually uplifting.

But this project goes far beyond aesthetics. Improved lighting will enhance our celebration of the liturgy,

draw greater attention to our stained glass windows and sacred art, and improve visibility and safety for parishioners of all ages. The mock-up gives us a glimpse of what's possible—and now we begin the exciting journey of bringing that vision to life throughout the entire church.

To do this, we need your support. There are a variety of donation options available, and we will also be installing a commemorative plaque at the back of the church to recognize those who contribute to this important effort.

As we continue to follow the voice of the Good Shepherd, may we walk together in faith, trusting that He is leading us into something both beautiful and new.

I hope everyone has a great week and always know of my prayers for each of you.



POPE FRANCIS a pilgrim's guide

The pilgrim pope

During his papacy from 2013 to 2025, Pope Francis became the first pontiff to visit several countries, marking significant milestones in the Church's outreach and diplomacy. These visits underscore Pope Francis's commitment to engaging with diverse cultures and promoting global peace and understanding:

Myanmar in November 2017

Pope Francis' visit to Myanmar was historic, as no previous pope had traveled to this predominantly Buddhist nation.

North Macedonia in May 2019

His visit marked the first papal journey to North Macedonia, emphasizing interfaith dialogue and peace.

United Arab Emirates in February 2019

This visit was groundbreaking, being the first time a pope visited the Arabian Peninsula, promoting religious tolerance and dialogue with Islam.

Iraq in March 2021

Pope Francis' trip to Iraq was the first papal visit to the country, aiming to support the Christian minority and encourage interreligious harmony.

Bahrain in November 2022

His visit to Bahrain was unprecedented, focusing on interfaith dialogue and the promotion of peace.

South Sudan in February 2023
