

FOCUS ON THE READINGS

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

In the first reading, the author tells Theophilus that in his first book he dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, and then expounds on the moment when Jesus was taken up from [them] into heaven. In the second reading, Paul greets the Ephesians, blesses them and offers a prayer that they might have knowledge of Christ and the hope he offers. In the Gospel, Jesus ascends to heaven before the disciples. They return to Jerusalem with great joy, praising God.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A message from Fr. Chris Dayton

As we gather this Sunday to celebrate the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord, we enter a profound moment in the life of Jesus and the Church. Forty days after the Resurrection, Jesus ascends into heaven—not to leave us behind, but to draw us deeper into the mission He entrusts to us.

In today's Gospel (Luke 24:46–53), Jesus offers His final words to the disciples: a call to be His witnesses "to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem." As they watch Him ascend, they return to Jerusalem with great joy, worshiping and blessing God.

It may seem surprising that the disciples respond with joy as Jesus departs. Yet their joy springs from a deep understanding: Jesus is not absent. He is exalted—seated at the right hand of the Father—and remains present to us through the Holy Spirit. The Ascension is not an end but a new beginning: the commissioning of the Church to bring Christ to the world.

We, too, are called to be witnesses—to carry the Good News into our homes, neighborhoods, and communities. The Ascension reminds us that our faith is not static, but dynamic, outward-looking, and mission-driven. Jesus entrusts His message to ordinary people like us, relying on our faithfulness to continue His work until He comes again.

As we look ahead to Pentecost, let us pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon our parish. May we be strengthened to live with joy, serve with love, and witness with courage.

This weekend, we also bid farewell to the Princeton University seniors who have been part of our community over the past four years. It's hard to believe how quickly the time has gone! We've cherished your presence at St. Paul's and extend a heartfelt welcome to you and your families whenever you return.

I hope everyone has a great week and always know of my prayers for each of you.

A message from Mrs. Jaime Gostkowski

On this seventh Sunday of Easter, we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord—the moment when Jesus returned to heaven, 40 days after Easter. In this church year (Cycle C), the Gospel reading comes from the very end of the Gospel of Luke.

All three Gospels—Mark, Matthew, and Luke—talk about the Ascension in their own ways. In each version, Jesus gives his followers an important job: share the Good News with the whole world. But each Gospel highlights something a little different.

For example, Mark and Matthew talk about Jesus sending the disciples out to preach and baptize. But in Luke, Jesus tells his friends to first go back to Jerusalem and wait for a special gift—the Holy Spirit, which will give them the power and courage they need.

The big takeaway? Jesus may have gone to heaven, but he didn't leave us behind. From heaven, he continues to help us and guide us. When we believe in him, we receive the same Spirit that helped the disciples—and with that Spirit, we can live like Jesus and share his love with the world.

We keep this message in mind by choosing to be kind, honest, and caring in everything we do—at home, at school, with friends, and even with people we don't know well. When we choose love over fear and include others instead of leaving them out, we're living out the mission Jesus gave us.
