



#### FOCUS ON THE READINGS

#### The Solemnity of Sts. Peter & Paul, Apostles

In the first reading Peter is arrested, but prayer is made on his behalf and he is rescued by the angel of the Lord. In the second reading, Paul tells Timothy that he is being poured out like a libation and that he has finished the race. In the Gospel, Peter responds to Jesus' question about his identity by saying, You are the Christ, the Son of the living God. Jesus declares that he will give Peter the keys to the kingdom of heaven.

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### A message from Fr. Chris Dayton

This Sunday, the Church rejoices in the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, two towering figures whose lives were wholly given in service to Christ and His Church. Though vastly different in background – Peter, the humble fisherman turned shepherd of souls, and Paul, the brilliant scholar and tireless missionary – they are celebrated together because both were foundational to the spread of the Gospel and both gave their lives in witness to the faith as martyrs in Rome.

In today's second reading, we hear Paul's stirring words to Timothy:

"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith" (2 Timothy 4:7).

These words, written near the end of his life, echo a legacy of perseverance, trust, and unwavering dedication to Christ's mission. Once a fierce persecutor, Paul became a pillar of the early Church through the grace of conversion and the power of God working through his weakness.

Meanwhile, the Acts of the Apostles recount

Peter's miraculous release from prison, offering us a vivid reminder that the Gospel cannot be chained. God's providence continues to guard and guide His Church through every trial, just as He did for Peter, the "rock" upon whom Christ built His Church.

Saints Peter and Paul were not perfect men. But they were transformed men. Their lives testify that holiness does not mean never failing, but always returning to Christ with humility and courage.

As we honor their legacy today, let us ask for their intercession and renew our own discipleship, bold in love, firm in hope, and steadfast in faith.

Saints Peter and Paul, pray for us!

I hope everyone has a great week and always know of my prayers for each of you.

### A message from Mrs. Jaime Gostkowski

In today's first reading, we hear how Peter is thrown into prison, but the Church doesn't lose hope. Instead, they pray constantly for him, and God answers with an angel, sent to set Peter free.

In the second reading, Paul writes to his friend Timothy and shares that his journey is almost over. He compares his life to a cup being poured out-he's given everything to serve God. He's run the race well and stayed faithful to the end.

In the Gospel, Jesus asks his disciples a powerful question: "Who do you say that I am?" Peter responds with great faith: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus blesses Peter for this answer and tells him that he will be the foundation of the Church, handing him the keys to the kingdom of heaven.

These readings remind us that being a follower of Jesus takes courage, faith, and commitment. Just like Peter and Paul, we can stay strong in our faith even when things are hard. As a family, we can pray for one another, support each other in tough times, and speak boldly about what we believe. When we put God first and trust Him, amazing things can happen, even in everyday life.

# Supporting Families Impacted by Addiction

When parents and other caregivers recognize that their loved one is struggling with substance use or addiction, we need support and understanding from those who have "been in our shoes." 

This traveling exhibit has been created to assist those who will experience it in affirming belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. It is based on the website created by Blessed Carlo Acutis to catalogue all the eucharistic miracles that have taken place worldwide.

The exhibit is circular and is divided into seven sections or rooms. In the first six rooms, information about the Eucharistic miracles is displayed. Each panel names a miracle, recounts the story of its occurrence, and the country where it took place. The panels are arranged in chronological order from the early Third Century to 2013. Be sure to notice the date on the timeline and some of the world events that will help you to place it within the historical era.

All of the rooms point to the center of the exhibit. This is to intentionally remind us that the historical miracles we are learning about on the walls of the exhibit are all pointing to the miracle in front of us— Jesus, present in the Most Holy Eucharist! In the seventh room, the Eucharist is clearly visible in the monstrance and a place has been prepared for you to rest a while in His presence.
