

FOCUS ON THE READINGS

The 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isaiah says to rejoice with Jerusalem and be glad because of her, for there we will find comfort. Paul writes to the Galatians: May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. Circumcision and uncircumcision no longer mean anything, but only being a new creation. Paul bears the marks of Christ on his body. In the Gospel, Jesus sends out seventy-two disciples ahead of him to prepare for his ministry and to proclaim the kingdom of God.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A message from Fr. Chris Dayton

As we enter the heart of Ordinary Time, the 14th Sunday in Cycle C invites us to reflect more deeply on what it means to be missionary disciples. In today's Gospel (Luke 10:1–12, 17–20), Jesus sends out seventy-two disciples ahead of Him to every town and place He intends to visit. His words to them are both urgent and hopeful:

"The harvest is rich, but the laborers are few."

This passage reminds us that Jesus does not work alone. He calls and sends each of us—not only priests or religious, but all the baptized—to labor in His harvest. We are to go forth not in comfort or power, but with simplicity, peace, and trust in God's providence. Like those early disciples, we are sent to bring peace where there is division, hope where there is despair, and healing where there is pain.

The joy of mission is evident when the disciples return:

"Lord, even the demons are subject to us!"
But Jesus gently redirects their focus:
"Do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

Here, we are reminded that our true joy is not in success or recognition, but in our relationship with God—one that is eternal, rooted in love, and written in heaven.

As we reflect on being bearers of Christ's light, we also give thanks for the visible light now shining brighter in our own parish. This summer, we are making exciting progress on our Church Lighting Renewal Project. The work already underway is transforming our worship space—enhancing beauty, visibility, and energy efficiency for all who gather here.

Our Parish Council is thrilled to announce that this year's ParishFest weekend will be September 13–14, 2025!


Theme: Shining With the Light of Hope

Cyril and Methodius in Manhattan.

He played a meaningful role in my life. I received my First Holy Communion from him, and he and the Franciscan priests and sisters at our parish were dear family friends. During the war in the Balkans, Fr. Slavko led our community's relief efforts with compassion and strength. I'm grateful that Joe, the girls, and I were able to visit with him in Croatia last summer.

Formed by the prayerful village of Medjugorje, Fr. Slavko was a man of deep faith and kindness who touched the lives of many. Please take a moment to pray for vocations and for the priests and sisters who have shaped your faith. They are living signs of Christ's love among us.

May God welcome you, dear Father Slavko, with the words, "Well done, my good and faithful servant."
