

FOCUS ON THE READINGS

The 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The first reading recalls the Passover. On that night, God punished the Israelites' adversaries and glorified his chosen people who were offering sacrifice and putting into effect with one accord the divine institution. In the second reading, the author writes that by faith Abraham was obedient to God's call and saw the fulfillment of God's promises. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the vigilant and faithful servants who are celebrated for their readiness to receive their master the moment he arrives.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A message from Fr. Chris Dayton

As we gather on this 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Lord speaks to us with gentle urgency: "Gird your loins and light your lamps... be like servants who await their master's return." These words from the Gospel of Luke are not meant to frighten us but to awaken in us a spirit of hope-filled readiness.

Jesus reminds us that our lives are not random or meaningless. We are part of a much greater story, a story of faith that began with Abraham and continues with each of us. As the Letter to the Hebrews reflects, Abraham followed God's call, not knowing where it would lead. His faith was rooted not in certainty but in trust, in a promise he could not yet see. So too are we called to walk by faith, trusting in what God has prepared for those who love Him.

Today's Gospel teaches that we are stewards, entrusted with time, relationships, gifts, and resources, not to hoard but to serve. The Lord does not ask for perfection but for faithfulness. He calls us not just to believe in Him, but to be ready for Him, to live each day as if it matters for eternity. Because it does.

In a world that constantly pulls us toward distraction, accumulation, and self-interest, Jesus gently draws us back to vigilance, generosity, and love. "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." So we ask: where is our treasure? What are we truly living for?

This week, may we renew our desire to live attentively to the Lord's presence in our homes, our workplaces, and in the quiet of prayer. Let us be the servants with lamps lit, watching not with fear, but with joy for the Master who comes not to catch us off guard, but to invite us to His table.

Let's continue to walk together in hope and trust, eyes fixed on Christ, our reward that will never fade.

I hope everyone has a great week and always know of my prayers for each of you.


