FOCUS ON THE READINGS

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The prophet Amos warns those who take advantage of others that the Lord will remember their actions. In his Letter to Timothy, Paul asks that people should pray for everyone, including rulers and those in authority, for God wishes all to be saved. Jesus teaches that just as one must be prudent and trustworthy managing worldly affairs, so one must be, and even more so, in service to God.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A message from Fr. Chris Dayton

This weekend's Gospel (Luke 16:10–13) offers us a challenging but beautiful reminder from Jesus: "The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones." Our Lord reminds us that faithfulness is not only about the grand gestures of life, but about the ordinary, everyday choices to serve Him with integrity, humility, and love. If we cannot be faithful in the little things—our daily prayers, the ways we treat one another, our responsibilities at work and at home—how can we be entrusted with the greater things of God's kingdom?

In a world that prizes success, wealth, and power, Jesus calls us instead to fidelity: to serve God rather than mammon, to let our hearts be rooted not in possessions or status, but in the Lord who gives us all good gifts. This Gospel challenges us to look at the "small things" in our lives—where we are being asked to grow in honesty, patience, generosity, and trust—and to see them as sacred opportunities to serve the Lord. In those little daily acts, God is forming us into disciples who can be entrusted with His mission.

Speaking of trust and faithfulness, I want to take a moment to thank all of you on behalf of our parish family for the tremendous success of ParishFest last weekend. What a joyful celebration it was! Walking

around the tent on Sunday, I received so many compliments from parishioners, guests, and visitors alike about how smoothly everything went, how welcoming the atmosphere was, and how alive our parish community felt. None of this would have been possible without the extraordinary generosity of so many who gave of their time, talents, and energy our committee chairs, volunteers, sponsors, donors, staff, and countless others who pitched in behind the scenes. I know how hard everyone worked to make the day such a blessing, and I am deeply grateful. I hope each of you has been able to find a little welldeserved rest and downtime after such a big effort. ParishFest is more than an event; it is a living sign of our parish family working together as one body in Christ.

Finally, I want to share a brief update on the lighting renewal project. As many of you noticed at Masses last weekend, the new sanctuary lighting has made a remarkable difference. The additional brightness not only enhances the beauty of our worship space, but also allows us to focus more clearly on the sacred action that takes place at the altar. The work is not yet fully complete, but already we are seeing the fruits of this effort—and it is thanks to your generosity and vision for St. Paul's that we are able to make these improvements. The light that now shines more fully in our sanctuary is a visible reminder of the Light of Christ, who is always at the heart of our parish life.

Let us continue to be faithful in the small things and the great, working together in gratitude, joy, and trust in the Lord.

I hope everyone has a great week and always know of my prayers for each of you.

Wednesday, October 15 (updated date)



Catechesis of the Good Shepherd for ages 3-6

Children ages 3 to 6 are invited to join Mrs. Mary Ellen O'Boyle in the Atrium (Spiritual Center) on Sundays from 9:45–10:45am. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-inspired model of faith formation that treats young children as spiritual beings, capable from early on of encountering God through Scripture, liturgy, and prayer. In a calm, beautiful, child-sized space called the Atrium, children work with hands-on materials that help them gradually understand liturgical symbols, parables, and the presence of Jesus the Good Shepherd.

In CGS, children are encouraged to quietly explore and reflect, to absorb the mysteries of our faith at their own pace, and to respond out of love rather than obligation. This method respects their freedom, invites wonder, and helps them grow in relationship with God. Space in the Atrium is limited, so please email Laura for more info or to reserve a spot.

Tuesday afternoons

All children and their parents are invited to pray the Rosary together every Tuesday at 2:45pm in the Mercy Chapel (when school is in session). We will lift up intentions for peace in the world, love in our families, our parish priests, school teachers, and any private intentions. In just fifteen minutes, we will hold Our Lady's hand as we contemplate the life of Christ with her, seeking greater unity with God's will so that our hearts may be more loving, joyful, and Christ-like.
