

FOCUS ON THE READINGS

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the first reading, Naaman cleanses himself in the Jordan, declaring the God of Israel as the only God. In the second reading, Saint Paul urges perseverance for Christ in the face of persecution. In the Gospel, Jesus heals ten lepers. Only one, a Samaritan, returns to give thanks to him. His faith has saved him.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

A message from Fr. Chris Dayton

This Sunday's Gospel presents us with a powerful reminder about gratitude. As Jesus travels toward Jerusalem, He encounters ten lepers who cry out for mercy. Moved with compassion, He sends them to the priests, and on the way, they are cleansed. But only one returns, praising God and giving thanks. And that one, Jesus notes, is a Samaritan—an outsider.

This moment reveals more than just a miraculous healing. It reveals the heart of discipleship. All ten were healed physically, but only one was transformed spiritually through gratitude. His thanksgiving opened him to a deeper relationship with Christ.

How easy it is to cry out to God in our need, and yet forget Him once our prayers are answered. This Gospel gently but clearly asks each of us: Do we live in gratitude? Do we remember to give thanks not only for the extraordinary graces but also for the everyday blessings: the breath in our lungs, the food on our tables, the love of family, and the gift of faith?

In that same spirit of gratitude, I want to take a moment to highlight some opportunities for connection and support in our parish and school community. Lion's Chase Weekend is rapidly approaching, and it's shaping up to be a joyful gathering and a significant fundraiser for our St. Paul

School PTA. On Friday evening, we'll kick things off with a Pasta Dinner catered by Leonardo's at 6:00pm in the school cafeteria. Saturday morning, we'll head to Rosedale Park for the 5K and 1K Fun Run. The 1K, open to children 10 and under, begins at 9:00am, and the 5K follows at 9:30am. Whether you're a seasoned runner, a casual walker, or simply want to come cheer others on, we'd love to see you there. Student-designed t-shirts will also be available for purchase. Even if you don't have children at the school, this is a beautiful way to support Catholic education and enjoy a fall morning with friends.

As we take part in these parish and school events—whether through our time, our generosity, or simply by showing up—we follow in the footsteps of the grateful Samaritan. We return to Jesus with lives that say “thank you.” May our involvement in the life of this community always be a reflection of the deep gratitude we carry for all God has done.

I hope everyone has a great week and always know of my prayers for each of you.

A Message from Laura Sarubbi

October is Respect Life Month, a time when the Catholic Church in the United States invites us to reflect more deeply on the sacredness of every human life. As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend, and protect those who are most vulnerable from the very beginning of life to its natural end, and at every moment in between.

It's easy to say, "Yes, I respect life," but the true challenge is to live that belief daily. This month, I encourage you to put those words into action:

- Pray for the unborn and for couples struggling with infertility. Donate to organizations that support parents courageously choosing life.
- Serve the poor, the homeless, and those living with mental illness.
- Support families affected by addiction, and reach out to those suffering silently from depression, grief, or loneliness.
- Accompany the elderly and those nearing the end of life, offering comfort, peace, and presence.

In a world flooded with "perfect" images on social media, it's easy to forget that behind every filter is a real person carrying unseen burdens. We are all struggling in different ways. But our faith calls us to love one another as Christ loves us: with compassion, even when we don't fully understand someone's story.

Respecting life goes beyond defending the unborn. It's about honoring every person as a reflection of God's image, no matter their stage in life or their struggles. So this October, let's renew our commitment to see Christ in every face. Let our kindness make it unmistakably clear: we are children of God.


