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## Discipline with Purpose

A system of rules and regulations that governs the conduct of adults and children to allow for effective interaction so that productive activity can take place. The system of rules and regulations provides a framework for distinguishing between disciplinary and self-disciplinary actions. The framework is developmental so it will change and grow along with the developing child. When parents and teachers adopt the same framework there is clarity and direction in helping children to become self-directed.

When discipline is administered properly it can provide the necessary training that will correct, mold and/or perfect the mental faculties or moral character of a person. It can lead to the development of self-control or self-discipline. Punishment on the other hand is often administered arbitrarily. It can be harsh and detrimental to the growth of a child.

Listening is the first skill taught. Mary is the example of a perfect listener. She said "Let it be done according to your word."

### Playground regulations:

#### Listen

- Listen to the supervisor on duty

- Wait your turn on playground equipment

#### Follow instructions

- Bring in the equipment you brought out and put it away in the proper place

- Walk and line up when the bell rings

#### Ask questions

- If unsure about what to do, ask the supervisor

- Ask others to join in to play

#### Sharing

- Include others if they want to play

- Use kind words

#### Social skills

- Share with others

- Be safe

- Watch out for other people

- Keep the equipment (balls) off the playground equipment

- Balls should be used on the grass areas and four square area

- Make sure your friend is ready to catch a ball thrown to them

- Sit and swing on the swings

- Climb up the slide stairs and slide down one at a time, facing forward

- Jumping off the side of slide and climbing on the outside of the slide is not safe!

- Rocks, grass, snow etc stay on the ground

- Keep your shoes tied
