The Wisconsin Department of Instruction Nutrition Program Consultant has given us some information to ensure we are following the meal service policies. Based on that information, we are going to change the breakfast program. The breakfast meals are to be served in the morning, not sent home with students for the following day. Updated COVID-19 Guidelines from the CDC

I am sharing this information from the Office of Catholic Schools at the Diocese. These are recommendations that we would like to see followed. Please contact school on an individual basis if you have questions concerning an individual situation.

COVID positive person is a non-household member	- No quarantine - PCR Test on day 5 following exposure - Monitor for symptoms - Wear a mask for 10 days	- PCR Test on day 5 following exposure - Monitor for Symptoms - Either Wear a mask for 10 days or stay home for 5 days and wear a mask at school for 5 days	-Mandatory PCR Test - Quarantine while awaiting results - If negative, return to school when symptoms improve - If positive, isolate for at least 5 days or until symptoms improve and wear a mask for 5 days upon return
