

THE THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Vincent de Paul,

When celebrating Mass, priests often preach and encourage parishioners to live out their baptismal priesthood. By doing so we participate actively in our faith in the mystery of our salvation with Christ's life, death, and resurrection. What does this mean in daily life? - Not being overly dependent on extraordinary fundraisers such as bingo and tickets to support its ordinary budget.
- Having parish facilities maintained and adequate for the needs of the parish.
- Having finance council members with interest and experience in budgeting facilities management and fundraising and development efforts.
- Having regular sharing of a portion of its income with the poor.

May the Holy Spirit guide us in his ways and fan the flame of our commitment and love for God and our parish community. I pray that we may continue to live out our baptismal calling in ways that transform our lives into a living image of Jesus Christ.





Saint Anthony Mary Claret | October 24

Saint Anthony Mary Claret is also known as the "spiritual father of Cuba." He was born in Salient in Catalonia, Spain, in 1807. He became a weaver, like his father, and was very talented. But he studied in his spare time to become a priest and was ordained in 1835. In 1849 the saint founded the Claretians, a reli-




gious institute of missionaries, and a companion order of women religious who served as teachers for girls.

From 1850 to 1857 he served as Archbishop of Santiago de Cuba, Cuba, where he worked diligently to reform both clergy and laity. He opposed concubinage and instructed black slaves, and championed family-owned farms instead of the mass farming of a sugar cash crop. These stances were vehemently opposed by many, and Saint Anthony was the target of assassins.

He was recalled to act as Queen Isabella II's confessor, a duty he reluctantly agreed to, with the exceptions that he would reside away from the court, attending the household only to hear confessions and instruct the children. While in Spain he founded the Religious Publishing House and wrote or published 200 Catholic books and pamphlets. He went into exile to France with the Queen's household during the Spanish Revolution of 1868. The saint returned to Rome to Participate in Vatican I where he defended the infallibility of the Pope. He died in France in 1870 and was canonized in 1950 by Pope Pius XII.

Sacramental Seal

Question: What is a sacramental seal and where did it come from?

Answer: Leaving more than just a memory, there are some events in our life that are truly transforming, making us different people. The same thing can be said of spiritual things, especially sacraments. A sacramental seal or character is a theological concept to describe the life-changing and permanent effect of three sacraments on the person: baptism, confirmation, and holy orders. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that these sacraments confer a seal "by which the Christian shares in Christ's priesthood and is made a member of the Church according to different states and functions. This configuration to Christ and the Church, brought about by the Spirit, is indelible" (#1121).

Once we receive these sacraments, we are forever changed. It's a spiritual "point of no return" whereby we take a step forward in our faith journey. We are marked as people of faith, as those who have received the Spirit and as those called to serve in ordained ministry. That is why these sacraments are received only once. The direction is set, the choice is made, and we are called by God to be his people. Nothing can change that, not even our own sinfulness.
