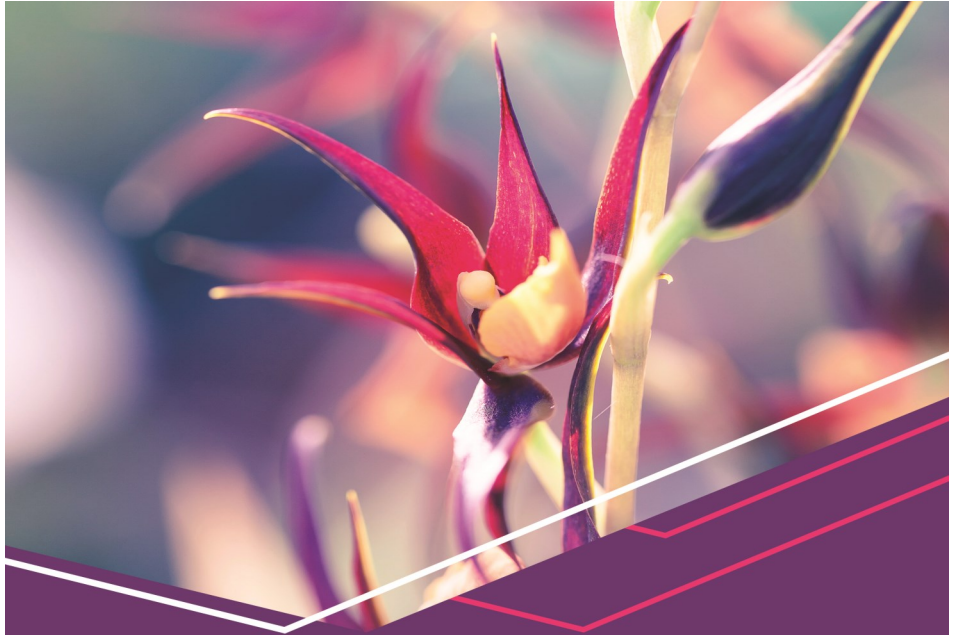

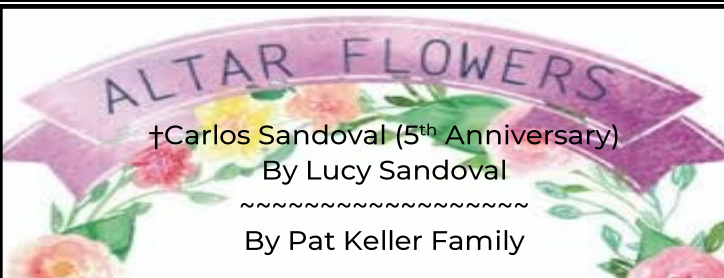

THE THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Vincent de Paul,

Last Saturday we celebrated the Annual Archdiocesan assembly. This year, the assembly was organized by deaneries (regions) and our parish participated at St. Clare Catholic Church with the theme “Blessed, Broken and Shared,” taken from the Eucharistic celebration to highlight the meaning of the Eucharist in our lives. Just as Jesus took the bread, blessed, and gave it to others at the last supper, so we too are called to bless God and be a source of blessing for others in a spirit of sodality. We all have been broken or are broken in need of God’s mercy and grace too. With experiences that “break” us we identify with our Lord when he broke the bread to be a source of life for all. Vulnerability, brokenness, and shortfalls are part of living as a priestly people of God. Once we have been blessed and broken, then we share with those around us the manifold presence of God and his spirit. We become a living presence and image of Christ for the world around us. In her prayer, Blessed Concepcion Cabrera asked God to “save people” out of her love for the church and the world. She experienced being blessed, broken and share her life for the salvation of mankind. In our own lives, we need to remind ourselves of the gift of being blessed, broken, and shared. This threefold cycle of our journey as believers can provide a way of living in deeper union with Jesus Christ. Consider how you have been blessed in your own life, what has been the causes of brokenness and how you can share your life with others in love and service.

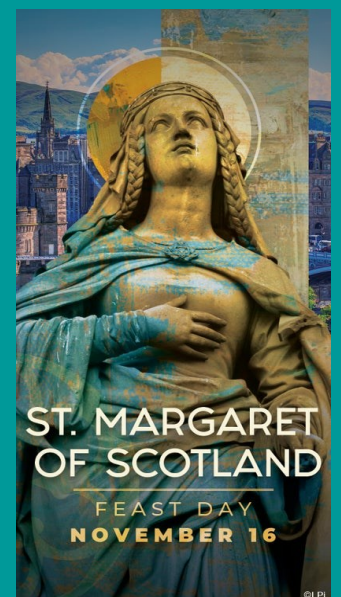
SAINT OF THE WEEK – EXAMPLES OF OUR FAITH

Saint Margaret of Scotland | November 16

Saint Margaret was born in exile around 1045, in what is now Hungary. She is the daughter of Princess Agatha of Hungary and Edward the Atheling the Anglo-Saxon heir to the throne of England. The family returned to England, but Edward died soon after their arrival, making Margaret’s brother Edgar the presumptive heir. However, the Norman Conquest would turn their world upside down. Agatha and her children fled the country. They likely intended to go back to Hungary, but they were shipwrecked off the coast of Scotland.

King Malcolm Canmore III took the exiles under his wing, and he fell in love with the beautiful and gracious Margaret. Although she initially rebuffed his proposals, the couple were married in 1070 at castle of Dunfermline. Margaret and Malcolm had eight children, six sons and two daughters. Margaret brought culture to the Scottish court and used her influence to soften her rough husband. The saint led a life of austerity, aiding Church reform, promoting Easter communion, and founding churches and monasteries. She instituted the Queen’s Ferry to the shrine of St. Andrew and founded pilgrimage hostels.

Saint Margaret, Queen of Scotland, died on November 16, 1093, four days after her husband and eldest son were killed in the battle of Alnwick. She was canonized by Pope Innocent IV in 1250 and named patron of Scotland in 1673.

Así como Jesús tomó el pan, lo bendijo y se lo dio a otros en la última cena, así también nosotros estamos llamados a bendecir a Dios y ser una fuente de bendición para los demás con espíritu de sinodalidad. Todos hemos sido "quebrantados" y en necesidad de la misericordia y la gracia de Dios. Con experiencias que nos causan dolor nos identificamos con nuestro Señor cuando partió el pan para ser fuente de vida para todos. La vulnerabilidad, el dolor y las deficiencias son parte de la vida como pueblo sacerdotal. Una vez que hemos sido bendecidos y partidos, entonces compartimos la presencia de Dios y su espíritu con los que nos rodean. Nos volvemos presencia viva e imagen de Cristo para el mundo que nos rodea. En su oración, la Beata Concepción Cabrera pidió a Dios que "salve a los hombres" por su amor a la iglesia y al mundo. Ella experimentó las bendiciones de Dios, el dolor y compartió su vida para la salvación de la humanidad. En nuestras propias vidas, necesitamos recordarnos del don de ser bendecidos, partidos y compartidos. Este triple ciclo de nuestra peregrinación como creyentes puede ayudarnos a vivir en unión profunda con Jesucristo. Considera cómo has sido bendecida tu vida, cuáles han sido las causas de dolor y cómo puedes compartir tu vida con los demás en amor y servicio.

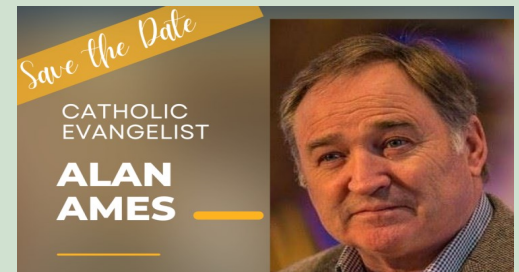

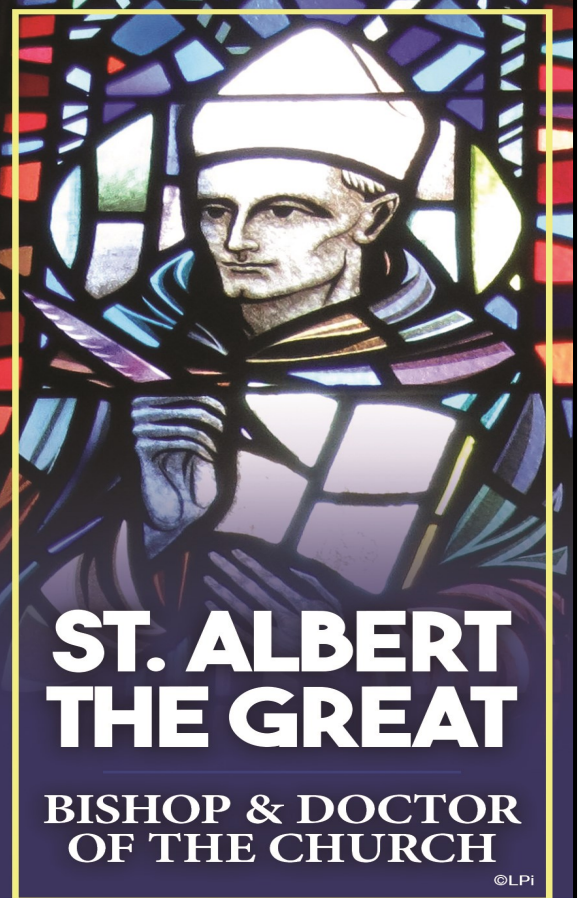
Thanks to the generosity of many women and men, through the Archbishop's Appeal, the cost for a course in the Parish Ministry program is \$20.00.

## Eyes On Your Own Paper

"Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place."

Looking at these words, I have to wonder. Am I reading the Bible or today's newspaper headline?

It's never easier to despair than when you glance up and take a good look at what's going on in the world: disasters, natural and contrived, wars, resentments, rivalries, and divisions. It is almost too much sometimes, isn't it? The twenty-four-hour news cycle doesn't help. Add social media and it's enough to push anyone into a nervous breakdown.

When you find yourself in this place of despair, remember Paul's admonishment in his letter to the Thessalonians. Work quietly and eat your own food.

It's not so different from the old "keep-your-eyes-on-your-own-paper" rule of the classroom. Poking our noses into other people's business, we may think we are getting a shortcut to the right answer, but we're really just getting distracted. When we become too preoccupied with events that we cannot control — whether they are happening in our neighborhood or half-a-world away — we are tempted to leave off the very specific work God has given us in our own lives. We are easily lured into anger, bitterness, and anxiety.

What is the work that God has called you to? Is it your career? Your family? Your community? What is your food — what nourishes you, sustains you, connects you to something real, powerful, and life-giving? This is what you should be concerned with. This is where your thoughts and your efforts should be.

Work quietly and eat your own food.

Somos fácilmente atraídos por la ira, la amargura y la ansiedad.
