

Dear Brothers and Sisters of St. Vincent de Paul,

Last Saturday we celebrated the Annual Archdiocesan assembly. This year, the assembly was organized by deaneries (regions) and our parish participated at St. Clare Catholic Church with the theme "Blessed, Broken and Shared," taken from the Eucharistic celebration to highlight the meaning of the Eucharist in our lives. Just as Jesus took the bread, blessed, and gave it to others at the last supper, so we too are called to bless God and be a source of blessing for others in a spirit of sodality. We all have been broken or are broken in need of God's mercy and grace too. With experiences that "break" us we identify with our Lord when he broke the bread to be a source of life for all. Vulnerability, brokenness, and shortfalls are part of living as a priestly people of God. Once we have been blessed



and broken, then we share with those around us the manifold presence of God and his spirit. We become a living presence and image of Christ for the world around us. In her prayer, Blessed Concepcion Cabrera asked God to "save people" out of her love for the church and the world. She experienced being blessed, broken and share her life for the salvation of mankind. In our own lives, we need to remind ourselves of the gift of being blessed, broken, and shared. This threefold cycle of our journey as believers can provide a way of living in deeper union with Jesus Christ. Consider how you have been blessed in your own life, what has been the causes of brokenness and how you can share your life with others in love and service.


SAINT OF THE WEEK - EXAMPLES OF OUR FAITH

Saint Margaret of Scotland | November 16

Saint Margaret was born in exile around 1045, in what is now Hungary. She is the daughter of Princess Agatha of Hungary and Edward the Atheling the Anglo-Saxon heir to the throne of England. The family returned to England, but Edward died soon after their arrival, making Margaret's brother Edgar the presumptive heir. However, the Norman Conquest would turn their world upside down. Agatha and her children fled the country. They likely intended to go back to Hungary, but they were shipwrecked off the coast of Scotland.

King Malcolm Canmore III took the exiles under his wing, and he fell in love with the beautiful and gracious Margaret. Although she initially rebuffed his proposals, the couple were married in 1070 at castle of Dunfermline. Margaret and Malcolm had eight children, six sons and two daughters. Margaret brought culture to the Scottish court and used her influence to soften her rough husband. The saint led a life of austerity, aiding Church reform, promoting Easter communion, and founding churches and monasteries. She instituted the Queen's Ferry to the shrine of St. Andrew and founded pilgrimage hostels.

Saint Margaret, Queen of Scotland, died on November 16,1093, four days after her husband and eldest son were killed in the battle of Alnwick. She was canonized by Pope Innocent IV in 1250 and named patron of Scotland in 1673.

En nuestras propias vidas, necesitamos recordarnos del don de ser bendecidos, partidos y compartidos. Este triple ciclo de nuestra peregrinación como creyentes puede ayudarnos a vivir en unión profunda con Jesucristo. Considera cómo has sido bendecida tu vida, cuáles han sido las causas de dolor y cómo puedes compartir tu vida con los demás en amor y servicio.


