

**A Note from Your Parish Nurse:**

Overeating can often be traced back to something that has made us vulnerable to the moment or the decision.

Common types of overeating include:

- Stress or emotional: Eating in response to stress, frustration, boredom, loneliness, sadness, etc., rather than hunger.
- Habitual or unexamined: "I always have ice cream at 9pm."
- Excused (faulty reasoning): "I exercised/I'm on vacation/etc....so I can eat whatever I want."
- Mindless: You don't even know you're doing it-mindlessly munching on chips or sweets, or missing a meal and then grabbing a sugary item to boost energy.

Strategies for beating overeating:

- Plan, plan, plan
- Set a specific intention. This could be for a special event, timeframe, or a general daily or weekly intention. ("I'll eat one dessert at the buffet.")
- Reduce risk: Set your environment for success with healthy choices, keep temptations out.
- Keep your tank full: Sleep, rest, relax, play, stretch, breath
- Pause, breath, ask: "Is this the best choice?" Repeat as needed.

Have patience and practice kindness with yourself. Change takes time, but starts with awareness.
